1. Refer to the inclosed application from the Terauchi Seisakusho K.K. regarding maintenance of 173 items of equipment at their Omatsu plant, reparations code No. 35-13.
2. Inspection of the plant on 19 August 1950 revealed that, in addition to the 173 items cited in inclosure, other equipment throughout the plant requires maintenance attention.
3. It is desired that reparations equipment at the plant receive maintenance as necessary to meet current standards.
4. Expenditure of reparations funds for the maintenance work should not exceed 300 yen per item for the 173 items cited in inclosure, and 150 yen per item for all other equipment requiring cleaning and/or re-application of preservatives.

Maintenance of equipment at Terachi Seisakusho, Omatsu Factory (35-13), Shiga Prefecture.

1. Survey of maintenance requirements of equipment in subject plant was conducted on 19 August.
  2. Equipment in 3 buildings which are leaking badly has developed rust. Most of the items showed signs of early stage of deterioration. In few cases (10-15%) moisture has penetrated into bearing housings and gear boxes. These will require overhauling and complete refilling with new grease and oil.
- Plant made their survey in July at which time there were 173 items were found to require immediate attention. On the day of our inspection it was noted that considerable larger numbers of items were either under leaky roof or in proximity of leaky roof area. It is our estimate that approximately 225 items will require immediate attention.

3. It is recommended the plant's request to maintain 173 items be approved. Furthermore it is suggested that the plant be instructed to make ~~a~~ a thorough check on the remainder of the items and take whatever measures necessary for the proper safe-keeping of the equipment.

Note:- Estimated cost for 173 items is approximately \$300 per item. Other items (approximately 50) will required \$150 - \$200 per unit.

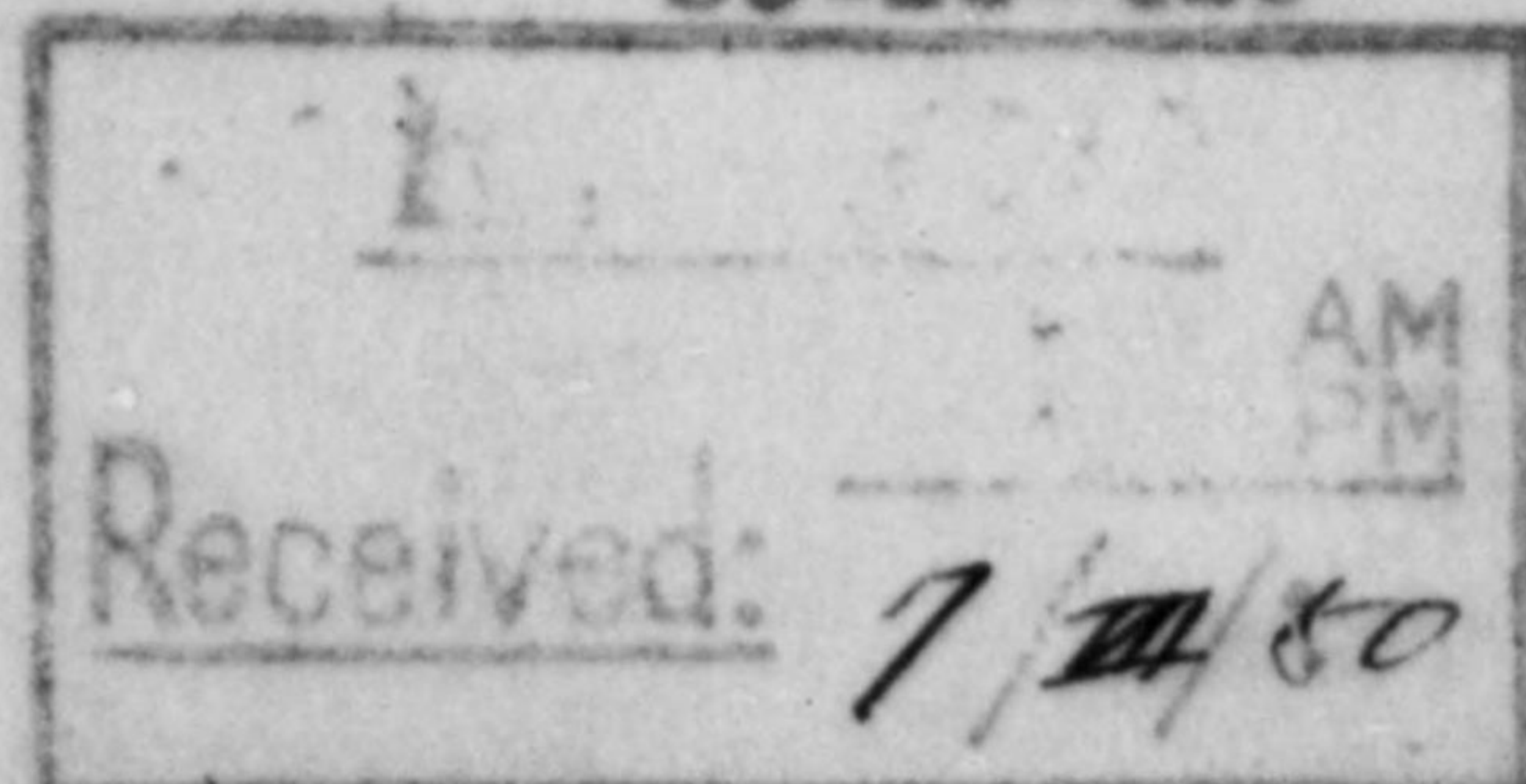

1. Investigation for need of maintenance at reparations installation 35-13 as outlined in attached application.

2. This installation has on storage 500 machines as follows class 1, 24 class 2-420, class 3-56. These machines are storage in good buildings which have a few roof leak, but these leaks have not seriously effected the machinery in storage due to good ventilations. These machines are in excellent condition and out of approximately 100 machines inspected there only one with any sign of rust. This equipment is now covered with a fibrous petrolatum grease which is of superior quality and it is doubtful that if any grease now available would offer a fraction of the protection of the present perservative now in use. This machinery can remain in storage for at least one year without any serious damage.

3. It is recommended that the request for funds be disapproved. Expenditure of fund on this equipment would be a waste and it is doubtful if the end results of offer the protection of the present grease.

1. A study of the application of the Terauchi Seisakusho, Kyoto Main Plant, for removal from the group of plants designated for reparations, reveals the following information:

a. The Terauchi Seisakusho has been in operation since 1913, and the production of this company consisted entirely of nuts, screws and bolts. It has continued manufacture of these items from the start of its operation, and holds an important position in the Japanese economy in production of this type of goods.

b. After the China Incident of 1937, the output of this plant was taken largely by the aircraft industry (Kawanishi Aircraft Co) and by the various naval arsenals. No change in the nature of the product was made, and virtually no conversion to war production was necessary. However, in the same year, the manufacture of parts of shells, bullets and primers was also undertaken, and production of these articles continued, with increased importance until the end of the war. However, the manufacture of nuts, bolts and screws continued to occupy the vast majority of the war efforts of this company.

c. The Terauchi Seisakusho established two branch plants in Shiga prefecture after the start of the war, and it was from these branch plants that the majority of the output, which went to the aircraft industry, was supplied. Admittedly however, some of the production of the main plant was also directly taken for military purposes. The machinery of the Omateu and Takashima branches of the company has been subject to some movement, but it is capable of being identified.

2. It is the opinion of this headquarters, that, inasmuch as operation of the main plant and its two subsidiaries is somewhat involved, the decision as to whether the main plant should remain on GD-No. 5 depends on the definition of an aircraft producer. The Terauchi Seisakusho would normally,

1. Subject plant is listed on Incl. 1, OD #5/2 Hq Eighth Army, dated 6 June 46. It has come to this Hq knowledge that only the main plant's name appears on aforementioned directive and not their branch plants located in Shiga prefecture. It is this Hq belief that the main plant should be deleted from Incl 1, OD #5/2. Reason for latter statement is that subject plant was in operation before the beginning of the war, engaged in civilian production. Most of the war production, connected with subject plant, was supplied by the two branch plants. These branch plants were activated during the war mainly for the production of war potentials.

1. A study of the application of the Terauchi Seisakusho, Kyoto Main Plant, for removal from the group of plants designated for reparations, reveals the following information:

a. The Terauchi Seisakusho has been in operation since 1913, and the production of this company consisted entirely of nuts, screws and bolts. It has continued manufacture of these items from the start of its operation, and holds an important position in the Japanese economy in production of this type of goods.

b. After the China Incident of 1937, the output of this plant was taken largely by the aircraft industry (Kawanishi Aircraft Co) and by the various naval arsenals. No change in the nature of the product was made, and virtually no conversion to war production was necessary. However, in the same year, the manufacture of parts of shells, bullets and primers was also undertaken, and production of these articles continued, with increased importance until the end of the war. However, the manufacture of nuts, bolts and screws continued to occupy the vast majority of the war efforts of this company.

c. The Terauchi Seisakusho established two branch plants in Shiga prefecture after the start of the war, and it was from these branch plants that the majority of the output, which went to the aircraft industry, was supplied. Admittedly however, some of the production of the main plant was also directly taken for military purposes. The machinery of the Omatsu and Takashima branches of the company has been subject to some movement, but it is capable of being identified.

2. It is the opinion of this headquarters, that, inasmuch as operation of the main plant and its two subsidiaries is somewhat involved, the decision as to whether the main plant should remain on OD-No. 5 depends on the definition of an aircraft producer. The Terauchi Seisakusho would normally,

hardly seem to so qualify, and it is the recommendation of this headquarters that it be removed from Inclosure 1 of Operational Directive No. 5/2, Headquarters Eighth Army, 7 June 1946. In the event the decision of higher headquarters is to retain this plant for possible reparations, this headquarters will then instruct the Shiga Military Government Team to place the Omatsu and Takashima branches of the company under custody and control.
