1137 Major LOWELL led nine PBJs in a medium altitude daylight attack on Maiki target number fifty-seven, Bougainville. The formation was composed of nine PBJs in three, three plane sections.

The strike was airborne by 0904 and after joining up as described above proceeded to Cema Island on a heading of 1350 magnetic where rendezvous was made with Corsairs from Piva at 1010 at 10,000 feet. From Cema Island the formation flew to Kleine Island on a course of 2430 magnetic and turned into the bomb run.

The bombing run of the formation was made on a heading of 2560 magnetic. The first section bombing from 9,500 feet, the second section from 9,300 feet and the thered section from 9,100 feet. The air speed for all the

The Piva Corsairs after the rendezvous preceded the formation to the target and marked it with smoke

After passing the bomb release line the planes broke to the left and proceeded back to Kieta. From Kieta the third section proceeded back to Green, the first and second sections turning inland at this point and proceeded to Ruri Bay where they strafed the Tank Park in that area. All planes were safely on the deck at Green by 1211.

No anti-aircraft fire encountered.

All bombs hit the target for unobserved results. Photographs were not clear due to cloud cover.
