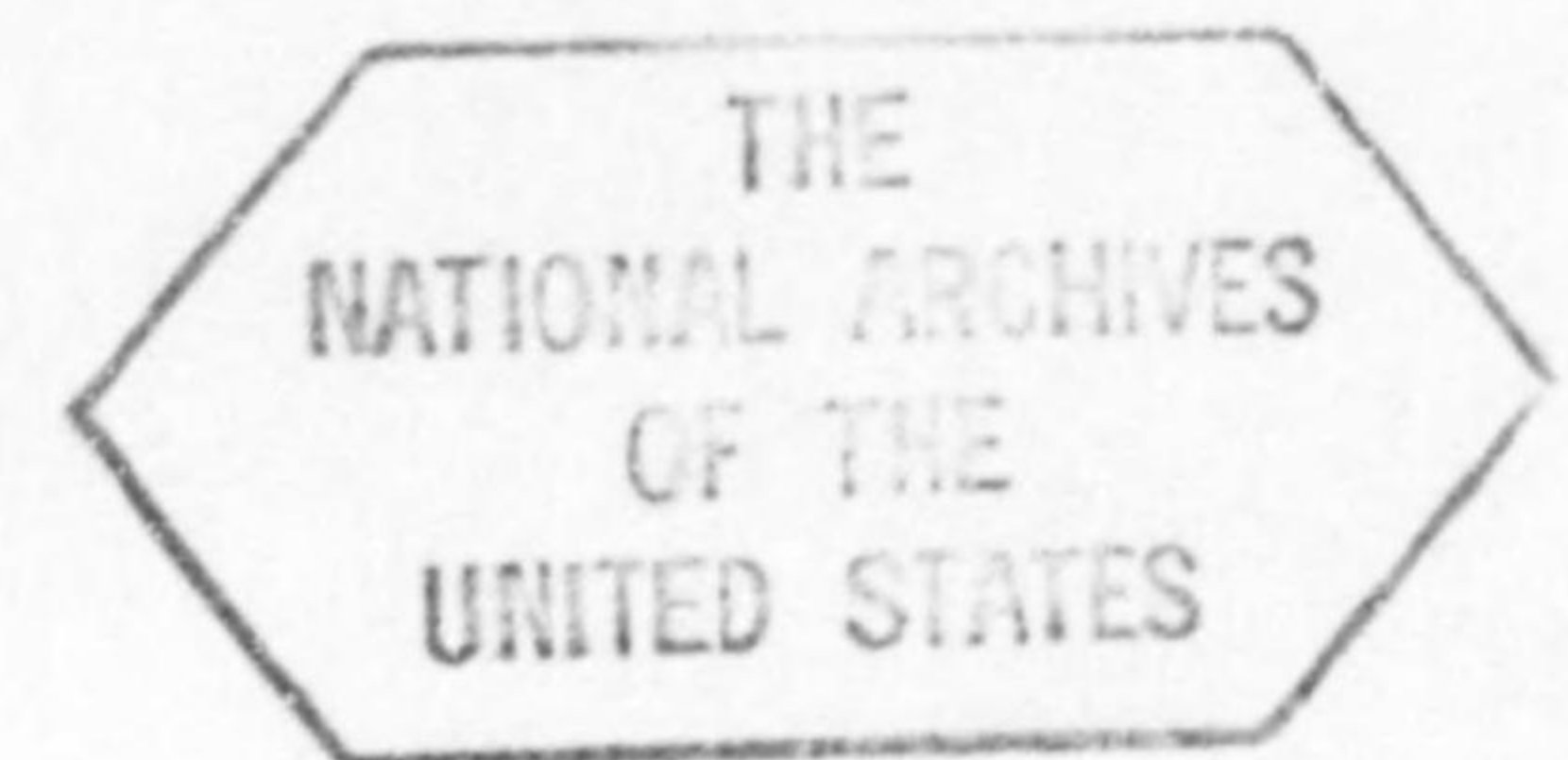

1. Reference is made to the request in the basic communication for comment on the proposed amendments to the Draft Radio Regulatory Commission Establishment Law.
2. The Civil Information and Education Section finds it difficult to acquiesce in the amendment adding to Article 5 of the draft law a paragraph requiring that a State Minister be chairman of the Commission.
3. The undesirability of this was made clear when the original draft was considered in the headquarters. The reasons are set forth comprehensively in the Government Section check note of 23 November 1949 on this subject and in the letter on the same subject which the Commander in Chief sent to Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida. CIE is unable to find in the Japanese arguments supporting the amendment the slightest basis for altering the attitude of the headquarters.
4. Were it to prove impossible to obtain the assent of the Japanese to elimination of this amendment and were the law establishing the Radio Regulatory Commission not to be enacted, there would be a disadvantageous delay in reorganization of the Japan Broadcasting Corporation and particularly in the licensing of private broadcasters. It is not inconceivable that some of the Japanese officials concerned are hopeful of postponing legislation until it no longer requires SCAP approval.



Minister

MEMORANDUM FOR: Record

1. It was orally reported to the undersigned this morning by a high official of one of the Japanese ministries that State Minister Yamaguchi stated in the presence of a Mainichi newspaper reporter that the Diet would not pass the three radio bills this session but would hold them for consideration by a special session at which time a new broadcast bill would be presented which would be written by the Liberal Party.

2. The informant also stated that he believes the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan subtly suggested to the Liberal Party that its top billing on the weekly Sunday radio program "The Diet in Action" would be curtailed unless more favorable consideration is given to the views of the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan.

Dear Sir:

Since 22 and 23 Dec. 1949, the Standing Committee for Telecommunications of the House of Representatives, to which the Bills for the Radio Law, the Broadcast Law and the Radio Regulatory Commission Establishment Law were referred on presentation from the Government, has, up to this day, held twelve meetings, including the joint examination meetings, and has precisely reviewed the contents of these three drafts.

In addition, we held three public hearings in which opinions and views of as many as thirty one learned people, critics and persons concerned were manifested; many petitions submitted to the Diet, news comments and other public opinions we have been able to obtain, were taken into consideration too.

At last, we reached the conclusion that these original drafts submitted by the government should be amended in some parts.

We herein prepared the amended drafts for these three originals and formally present them to you for your approval.


Among the twenty members of the Telecommunication Committee, eighteen members from the Liberal Party, the Japan Social Democratic Party, the Democratic Party, the Peoples Co-operatives Party and the Farmers Co-operative Party became the introducers of the amendments concerning two of the Bills, namely, the Bill of the Radio Law and that of the Broadcast Law.

To facilitate your reviewing, in addition to the formal amendments, a comparison of the original and amended provisions, and statements of reasons for the amendments are hereby attached. We would like to have a chance to visit the appropriate section in GHQ personally and explain in detail the reason for the amendments.

We are quite confident that the amendments we proposed will coincide with the occupation policies as well as expedite the democratization of our country.

Earnestly wishing a prompt approval to these amended drafts, we are confident of your section having the correct judgement and profound sympathy for the present situation we are confronted with in Japan.

1. Reference is made to the request in the basic communication for comment on the proposed amendments to the Draft Broadcast Law.

2. The comments of the Civil Information and Education Section follow:

a. Article 37 -- It is questioned whether it is wise to entrust to the Radio Regulatory Commission the power to approve the budget of the Japan Broadcasting Corporation. Not only is this likely to increase the dependence of the Corporation on the pleasure of the Commission, but also it might permit collusion between the two on financial matters. Presumably the Diet has the right to review the budget, but such review is apt to be perfunctory unless express Diet approval is required.

b. Article 41 -- The principle of having audits made by independent and disinterested agencies would seem to be violated by the plan to have the Corporation's accounts audited by the Commission. Were there collusion between them, it would be relatively easy to conceal any irregularities.

c. Article 44 -- By adopting the terms of the SCAP Radio Code, the amendment abandons several important details in the original draft. No longer is the Corporation obliged to "inform listeners of all public issues", and the injunction against distortion of facts is narrowed to apply only to "news", implying license to distort facts in other programs.

d. Article 50, paragraph 2 -- On the assumption that the "rights", all of which are to be transferred to the new Corporation by the old Corporation under Article 13 of the Supplementary Provisions, include property rights, it is wondered what properties of the old Corporation are likely to remain for reversion to the State. If the assumption of transfer of property rights is incorrect, there would seem to be room for suspicion that the absence of specific provision for property transfer may mean that all buildings, equipment and other property of the old Corporation are to go to the Government, requiring purchase of them by the new Corporation.

e. Article 53, paragraph 3 -- Extension to private broadcasting firms of the privilege of acquiring land through the process of eminent domain would seem to be both unnecessary and harmful to property owners. It is wondered whether private schools, newspaper companies and theatrical enterprises have the same privilege.

f. Supplementary Provisions, paragraph 16 -- The meaning of "the former clause of paragraph 1 of Article 37" is not quite clear. Possibly the translation is at fault, and by "former clause" is meant the first or introductory clause.

g. Proposed amendments other than those cited above seem to be unobjectionable.

3. Though the above comments indicate what are considered to be imperfections or dubious points in the proposed amendments, CIE concedes that they are matters not likely to jeopardize seriously the accomplishment of SCAP's objectives in the field of radio broadcasting. It is recommended that they be brought to the attention of the Japanese quarters concerned but that approval of the draft legislation not be withheld if they are not modified.

Proposed amendments to Draft of Broadcast Law

Article 32 paragraph 2 shall be deleted; paragraph 3 of the same Article shall be made paragraph 2 and amended as follows:

- 2 The Corporation shall, unless in accordance with the standard approved by the Radio Regulatory Commission in advance, not exempt the collection of receiver's fee from a person who concluded the contract in accordance with the provision of the main clause of the preceding paragraph.

Paragraph 4 of the same Article shall be made paragraph 3 and amended as follows:

- 3 The Corporation shall obtain the prior approval of the Radio Regulatory Commission for the terms of the contract (Those related to the amount of receiver's fee excepted) mentioned in paragraph 1. The same shall apply to the intended change thereof.

To Article 37 shall, as paragraph 4, be added the following one paragraph:

- 4 The monthly amount of receiver's fee to be collected from a person who concluded the receiver's contract in accordance with the main clause of Article 32 paragraph 1 shall be determined by the Diet by approving the budget of revenues and expenditures mentioned in paragraph 1.

In supplementary provisions, paragraph (17) shall be made paragraph (18); The numbering of paragraph 18 and its succeeding paragraphs shall be moved down by one; and next to paragraph (16) shall be added the following one paragraph:

17. The receiver's fee to be collected by the Corporation shall be thirty five yen per month until determined by the Diet in accordance with the provision of Article 37 paragraph 4.

1. Reference is made to the request in the basic communication for comment on the proposed amendments by the House of Councillors to the draft Broadcast Law.

2. Civil Information and Education Section holds the same objections to these amendments as to those proposed by the House of Representatives. Particular question is raised as to the advisability of amending Articles 37, 38, 40 and 41, which would have the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan send its budget and audit to the Radio Regulatory Commission rather than to the Diet and Government Board of Audit.

3. CIE's objections to these amendments, however, concern matters not likely to affect the accomplishment of SCAP's objectives in the field of radio broadcasting and the Law would be preferable with the inclusion of said amendments, rather than such objections preventing passage of the bill by the Diet.

4. It must be considered further that any amendments made by the House of Councillors to the Broadcast Law would require that the bill be referred back to the House of Representatives, possibly preventing its passage during this session. Thus CIE hopes that the House of Councillors can be induced to drop the amendments and approve the bill as passed by the House of Representatives.
