

coverage Guild Book Service has no competition.



On the lighter side there are numerous quotations from notable Greeks: Pindar's "Boys in the flower of their youth are loved; the smoothness of their thighs and soft lips is adored." This book is a rare combination of the entertaining and the instructive.

It is not a matter of how, or with which boy or girl, but are all the parties concerned having a good time? Dr. Ellis has much good practical advice for homosexuals on how to lead a more guilt-free, rewarding life. This is a book which will give a sharper, clearer view of that sexual part of a person's nature which is so important for him to understand, in order that he will lead a richer, more satisfying life.

THE HOMOSEXUAL REVOLUTION



This is an important book. It contains much information that is important to every intelligent homosexual. It deals with many aspects of the gay life that have hithertobeen untouched: the homosexual and politics, and society, and the law. What are the social aims of the homosexual? What would be his Bill of Rights?

The book has faults. The main one being its title. The word "revolution" suggests a government takeover, a time when Walter Jenkins would become President with Ray Bourbon as



his Secretary of State. After you read some of the book, however, you realize the author doesn't mean this at all. There is no gay "revolution" in progress, only a slow change in the status and awareness of the American gay person.

Masters includes several portraits of different types of homosexuals. One of them is Harvey, outwardly impeccable with a lily-white social background. One night, however, Harvey went mad, he went so far as to "commit an act of (passive) sodomy on the floor of the men's room at the railroad station at three o'clock in the morning..."






It's Cleaner on the Inside

This book is a great conversation piece for any of your friends and you will at least have the prestige of having read the last word on the art of love if you read this book.







The next night, with the aid of alcohol, Mr. Lowell seduces his young but willing companion. In brief, vivid chapters the author artfully charts Ken's tragic progress through the kaleidescopic world of kept boys and drag queens, drinking and wild sex, a world where Ken is forced to dance at gunpoint before a group of gangsters who then proceed to ravish him one by one, a world where he wins a prize of jewels in a male beauty contest and then has the prize stolen from him by one of the judges after a strenuous sexual workout. Butterfly Man is certainly no great piece of literature. It is, however, a fast, wellpaced, sensational novel that you are sure to enjoy.

The excitement of sex between two adolescent boys has never been more graphically presented. The extremely good-looking, sensitive, Gaylord LeClaire is lewdly threatened by three big toughs in the shower room of the high school gym, when who but Bob Blake, the handsome hero of the football team, arrives just in time to save him from a fate worth than death. Imagine Gaylord's delight when this scene of possible violence, turns into one of ripening love. In the shower the two boys only kiss, but later on: "It was accomplished there in the darkness between them. Hands found flesh and lips found lips again and again and through them tasted deep of the pagan world of beauty and desire, blackening out all doubts of vulgarity and lewdness." The affair between Gaylord and Bob grows until both are involved in a deep and emotional and physical attachment. But since neither boy is fully aware of the meaning of homosexuality, the affair is a most natural and virile one. Bob, an experienced lover of both sexes, finds great emotional satisfaction in the complete adulation directed toward him by Gaylord. "Maybe Tomorrow" is an excellent account of a sensitive boy's love for his handsome, athletic idol. It is also manual on the actual sexual techniques for at making love.

Terry Wallace, a strikingly handsome young man, craves a theatrical career. His many friends are Victor, his high school pal, with whom he has a torrid sexual session before he leaves for Hollywood; Kent Stewart with whom he shares seven of the most erotic pages in homosexual literature; Philip Carlton, who introduces Terry into the world of female impersonation; and Nick Lazza, the real man in Terry's life. In Hollywood, a girl advises him: "Don't lay down on their casting couches until you've got a contract or signed part. With your good looks you won't have any trouble honey, but don't give unless they do first".





On the other hand, there was the homosexuality based simply upon lust, which Symonds summed up thusly, "Very early, however, in Greek history, boy-love, as a form of sensual passion, became a national institution."

Symonds quotes all the right people to show the nobility of the "higher" form of homosexuality, but balances out the book by lengthy descriptions of hustling in Athens, the male brothels, the famous people who spent time as male prostitutes and other of the more interesting aspects of Greek sexual activity.







Unmatched anywhere is the description of the scene where he is looking over the top of a stall in a men's room and observes a straight man who, when suddenly seeing an erect phallus pushing through a glory hole, pulls out a knife and performs an amputation on the spot.

"The Flaming Heart" is certainly one of the most shocking, daring books on homosexuality ever written. Recommended for only the reader with an open mind and a strong stomache.




JASON

Take the character of Hercules as presented in this lively recreation of the Argonaut saga. One day he is so maddened with desire for a young boy that only the intervention of his friends prevents him from ravishing the boy to death; the next day, however, Hercules demands of Jason that they exchange their female bedpartners for the sake of variety;



"Don't you think I would make a nice girl?" asks the monstrously muscular man before trying on his first drag; then later on, he is genuinely grieved at the loss of his friend, the effeminate Hylas, who was sacrificed to Dionysius. 




A Significant Experience

As for Elagabulus: "He was strikingly handsome, a cluster of golden curls, huge, brimming violet eyes, an exquisite doll, a youth of fan-



tastic beauty." This beautiful boy was the high priest of a cult which revolved about a god symbolized by a large, gleaming phallus in full erection. The young Emperor gladly allowed his grandmother to rule the empire while he would spend his time selecting handsome, young charioteers for the royal bedchamber. "Family Favorites" is an extremely well-written account of the life and reign of Rome's youngest, cutest and most deprayed ruler.

THE PRISON LIFE OF HARRIS FILLMORE





Here are four interwoven stories by one of the great masters of modern English prose. He is also one of the few, courageous writers who has been unafraid to admit that he is a homosexual. In story No. 1, the narrator, Isherwood himself, visits Mr. Lancaster, a repressed homosexual. His visit unfortunately triggers the man's subsequent suicide. The next story is of Ambrose, a gay Englishman who starts a colony on a Greek isle. He and Isherwood are soon joined by: Hans, an ex-army instructor, who begins recruiting some of the local boys for "extra instruction"; Aleko, Ambrose's Greek lover, who wears a flower over his ear and likes to rape chicken (the real ones); and Maria, who begs Ambrose "Please forget I am a woman! Will you accept me as an honorary pederast? How does one become an initiate? By liking pretty boys? I do that already!" The third story is about Waldemar, a German boy, now trying to forget about his past as a hustler in Berlin, while he courts a prim English girl. The Fourth story is about Paul, "the most expensive male prostitute in the world". When Isherwood first meets him, he and a nude, alcoholic heiress are entertaining a group of brutish Marines by the side of a Hollywood swimming pool. When one of the Marines says to Paul "Stand up and fight like a man", heretorts "Mary, your aunt is not a man and would not stoop to act like one, and you are just a little male impersonator who's starting to be a great big bore." No other writer has bared his life so completely and with such great artistry as Christopher Isherwood. This is one of his gayest and finest books.


THE BEGINNER'S GUIDE TO CRUISING

This novel is in the same class as City of Night, Naked to the Night, and the Flaming Heart, books dominated by the theme of homosexuality; but in this book one thing is different. The main character is quite unusual for a homosexual novel. The first pages of Stations tell us of the present situation of Dominick Wright. The remainder is about his past. In brief chapters the author deeply explores the highly symbolic sexual fantasies of his "hero's" mind.

Dominick, a middle-aged father with a grown-up daughter, departs from the apartment where preparations are in progress for his child's wedding, as it is time for him to go to work. What is his work? He is on the vice squad and it is his job to trap hapless homosexuals in subway T-rooms. Those who can pay are not booked, but blackmailed. The others are taken to jail. Dominick's little black book, filled with information about his victims is bulging. He has amassed a fortune through blackmail.

Dominick's first stop is to collect \$100 from a victim who says "here, I hope that's the last I see of you," Dominick answers "You freaks, all you think of is money! I'm just letting you off easy because that's the way I am. It's you freaks who're ruining this here country. Freaks that squeal get thrown into the bughouse."

We are now ready for the fantasy revelations of the real Dominick Wright as he talks to himself: "You became a beach boy. For a buck you'd go just so far. Another buck, a little further. For another, all the way." He has visions of masses of naked adolescent males wandering about the streets; peeking into places where adolescents are having sex; his fantasy turns to masochistic daydreams of lustful youths beating him up.

This is a difficult book, but a very good one. Readers will have to follow the dialogue carefully and keep the characters firmly before them. "Stations" is a profound book which asks the question "What is truth but those special lies one believes?"





This is an unusual book. The writer has a keen sense of humor, knows his psychology and psychiatry, loves the human race and assumes that no matter what people do sexually it is, for them, fun. The idea that sex can be fun is still relatively new in America and the idea that deviant sexual activities can be pleasant is still too new to have been given serious popular consideration.

We can only briefly indicate some of the fascinating material in this book by listing a few chapter headings and the material they include:

The Loving Hand: Advances the view that masturbation is a solace and blessing to mankind — also discusses some modern refinements.

A Taste of Honey: Points out why men enjoy fellatio and also why others enjoy doing this to someone. Relates the case of the husky fireman who was so desperate for someone he attempted to rape the psychiatrist!

Through the Rear Door: The most thorough discussion of the psychology of the active and passive sodomist in print. The case of "Norman" is amusing as it relates that "I turn over easy, even if I am asleep. I think it's a wife's duty." There is the case of Lennie, who found his first pleasure in a hobo camp and then became addicted to sodomizing truck drivers.

In A Family Way: A thorough discussion of incest and related activity that is highlighted by the story of the Reed family which established a sexual record when the father provided the sons with whores and male lovers, encouraged sex between the children and indulged himself with them as well!



Jean Genet: Orphan, male whore, homoexual, pimp, convicted thief in ¾ of the nations of Europe, tramp, genius and one of the most influential writers of this century. Not only are these things all true of Genet, but he was convicted 10 times of theft in France and sentenced, as an habitual criminal, to life imprisonment. However, his writings were so powerful and influential that the leading literary figures in France were able to secure a pardon for him from President Auriol.

This book, his second most important, is a record of his life as he sees it and he views life very differently than most of us ... "I have roots in that French soil which is fed by the powdered bones of the children and youths buggered, massacred and burned by Gilles de Rais ... For a time I lived by theft, but prostitution is better suited to my indolence ... I knew at last the sweetness of being welcomed by men ..."

The men Genet loves are not those usually pursued by homosexuals. He is so hungry for the criminal types, for reasons to be described later, that he deliberately wanted to go to jail in order to be surrounded by the types of men he craved . . . "Though they may not always be handsome, men doomed to evil posses the manly virtues . . . Their smells of sweat, sperm and blood . . . The murderer's rich muscularity, of the violence of his sexual organ . . . For a long time I imagined a solid member, like a blackjack . . . This is a book without pity. It is a book of pain, misery and horror. It is a book in which God is long since dead and human beings have long ago lost their humanity. Each of the central characters has full control of his destiny and the horror of the individual existances is self-inflicted. Every false ideal; every rotten set of values; every phoney profession of faith in anything; every cliche we have ever heard about love, marriage, homosexuality, labor and management, motherly love, the dignified poor-all are shown to be spurious and shoddy with death, pain, squalor and unabating misery the only real things.

Me can only suppose that there is somewhere someone so sick that they will call this an obscene book. Nothing is further from the truth. This book is, by any religious and philosophical standard, a highly moral book. It is an absolutely fascinating, gripping, horrifying book that will make you want to turn your back on the entire human race—all because the book is a testament to life as it is lived in 1964.

This is a major work by an important writer. No GBS reader should miss this book. It is already a classic and will be the topic of discussion for many year into the future.

The so-called psychological evaluation is even more erotic and funnier than the text. Dr. Leonard A. Lowag is not a member of the American Psychological Association, but as a creative writer, he leaves nothing to be desired.

This is a very entertaining and quite candid and amusing picture of the world of the male whore.







This is the best book on adolescent male psychology available and it is extremely well written and readable.




THE SIXTH MAN


HOMO HILL

This is one of the classics in our field of special interest and this is one of the titles that GBS was determined to make available.

Kurt Gray is the usual sensitive, handsome, talented only son of a wealthy family in a small town. He goes off to college and is drawn into a homosexual relationship with Derry Grayling.



Derry is rather unmoved by it all and maneuvers Kurt into bed with David Perrier, the artistic young man who has coveted Kurt for so long. Kurt feels a little guilty that David made him feel even better than Derry had been able to do.

There is much melodrama as Kurt wends his way to success as a musician, comes to terms with life and himselfandbecomes the darling of the avant garde set. Chloe, Derry's sister and Kurt make a futile try at romance and, finally Kurt and David come to the beginning of a life together. This is a sentimental, overly "sweet" book but it is really one of the important "first novels" in this field. This edition is an oversize paperback and GBS offers it not only because of the worth of the book as a novel, but because it has been off the market for so long and so many of our readers will not have had an opportunity to read it.

This is the story of how Carl Rollins Hammonds became Hedy Jo Star. It is not the story of a sensational Christine Jorgensen, who was simply a male homosexual who wanted to be placed in a more advantageous position competetively, but the story of a genuine sex change based upon painstaking surgery and adequate psychiatric evaluation.

The early life of Carl R. Hammonds was such as to indicate that he was "different" from other boys and puberty only made this painfully clear. The boys in



gym class were the first to stress the feminine qualities of their fellow student. Romance came to Carl with another boy at the age of 14 and by the time the affair had lasted two years, neither of them even thought of Carl as a boy.



Today Hedy Jo Star is happy to be the wife of a loving husband and spends her days as do millions of other housewives – some of whom know Hedy Jo, under her married name and would never believe this story if they read it. The book is lavishly illustrated.

THE HOMOSEXUAL IN AMERICA

No one needs to be told that this was the first important book written in this field. When first published in 1951, it was the object of much interest and dispute. Here was a book that dealt with a taboo subject in a completely frank and, therefore, shocking manner. Cory was the first to explore, with anything other than superficial generalizations, the widespread covert homosexual activity in the military and the: commercial aspects of homosexuality in larger cities. The one chapter which generated the

most abuse was Chapter 18 "Some Plain Words on Sublimation." Cory points out that sublimation, however we may call it, is doomed to failure and cites all the reasons in a compelling manner. This chapter angered many of the more pious and prissy homosexuals and took away one of the main lines of argument of those reformers who had been telling homosexuals "Be strong, suppress your tendencies."

This book is the classic in the field and is as relevant and to the point today as it was in 1951. Any Guild Book Service reader who has not read it should do so.

This monumental novel covers the period from shortly before the end of World War II until shortly after General MacArthur's recall by President Truman. The individuals are vivid, the scenes are powerful and the entire tempo of the novel is so swift that the reader is swept along and becomes emotionally involved before he knows what is happening.

One of the central characters is Warren Taggert, whom we meet in El Paso, where he had gone to get away from the Army base. Warren meets Tiger Rizzuto, also U.S. Army, and they conclude their evening with two whores. Our first key to Warren's character comes with the revelation that he is glad when they have left the women behind and he is " . . . sleepily pleased to be alone with the corporal." Warren realizes that as far back as he can remember he has yearned for the " . . . strong and gentle arm" of a man.

We next meet Warren in New Orleans during Mardi Gras.

Mike, a perfect example of the wealthy, gay young man, and Warren meet, go to a gay bar, play footsies and flee to Warren's

apartment for a sex session that turns into a sex marathon.

The two are so attracted to each other that they decide to team up. Soon they are drunk and are ambling through the crowds with Mike making remarks like, " ... You know what I love? Guys with crew cuts from Shaker Heights," and Warren responding, "And I love young drunks in white knee breeches. Especially on Mardi Gras Day." They wind up in a gay bar where the owner's kissing the bartender; but the highlight of the scene is a beautiful young muscleman, clad in a seashell jockstrap, leaning against the wall with arms outstretched and smiling while one faggot fellates him and two others serve as a screen.

This is one of the more important novels published in this country, and time will only increase its stature.

Isabel, the beautiful French princess, first sees Edward when she is sixteen and is about to become his bride in Paris. In fact and physique, he lives up to all her expectations. Their first night in bed together is disappointing, but she is confident he will soon learn to do better.

She has a rude shock coming. During her first day in England, she meets Edward's good friend Piers Gaveston from Gascony. She is perturbed when she sees this man wearing precious jewelry that was part of her wedding dowry. Surely this is carrying friendship too far! Later on she discovers exactly where (or who) is the lay of the land when she overhears one of the palace gardeners saying:

"... but we all know that he'll have little desire to spare for her

Edward's death is the high point of the novel, though certainly

a low point in British history.

After the king was put on his back on the table, with his trousers removed and his legs pulled back to his chest, while several sturdy men held him down, a hollowed-out horn pipe was inserted up his anus, after which a red-hot poker was inserted through the pipe.

Isabel the Fair concerns not the wisest, strongest, or greatest of English kings, but certainly one of the most scandalously interesting

ones of all history.





The third and fourth stories are just as campy!



This story is melodrama from the first to the last page. Vincent McCaffery is the product of an Irish Catholic in Yorkville. His mother is dead and, of course, his father is a brutish alcoholic. His early heterosexual experiences are drab and distasteful, to put it mildly, and in the natural course of events he winds up in Central Park.

In a series of events which happen only in novels, McCaffery meets "Tiger Johnson," male pimp and owner of a stud house in the Village. The logic of Tiger:

"You've got something to sell, sell it. That way it's a business transaction. Nobody gets hurt. Nobody gets arrested. And you get paid. But good, "leads to "blue" movies, catering to wealthy faggots with unusual interests, living in the palatial stud house in the Village and taking care of "office calls" and any other odd jobs which might arise.

Of course, there is the wealthy faggot who falls for our hero, and the two set up housekeeping in the grand manner. All would have been well except that McCaffery had fallen for a female whore, Doreen, and longed for her. 


THE GALLERY

Everything centers around the vast Galleria Umberto Primon in which is Momma's bar. Here is where the gay soldiers and sailors from all of the allied armies come to dish, to cruise, to complain, to fight. There is the "Desert Rat", who wore "the tightest and shortest pair of shorts he could get into". When he smiled, Momma "sud-



denly saw him in someone's arms by moonlight in the Egyptian desert, in the midst of that love which had sliced the boy's heart in two." There are also the two British sergeants, Esther and Magda, twittering like angry magpies, the delicate Italian boys who scream with joy when a group of tough sailors invades the bar. ("Gracious," the Negro second lieutenant said, "men!" "I hateya and I loveya, ya beast," said a sailor.)

"Her crowd had something that other groups hadn't. Momma's boys had an awareness of having been born alone and sequestered by some deep difference from other men. For this she loved them."

The gay scene in Momma's is certainly the high point of the book, but the other straight stories are written with such sympathy and understanding you are sure to enjoy them just as well. The Gallery is one of the really fine books to come out of World War II. Highly recommended.

The Cool World


