

SUBJECT : ESS Materials Loaned to Mrs. Philip.

This morning Mr. Herbster, ESS, Finance Division, Liquidation Branch, 26-6473 telephoned regarding some files which were borrowed by Mrs. Philip for use in connection with her monograph. Mrs. Philip had agreed to return these materials within a week. Mr. Herbster sent an enlisted man over this morning to pick up files dealing with the subjects listed below:

Japan Raw Silk Exporters
Japan Coal Company
Japan Potatoes and Sweet Potatoes
Liquidation SOP

Miss Bachofer looked through Mrs. Philip's desk and file drawer but was not able to locate these materials.

This negligence on the part of Mrs. Philip is very embarrassing to SRS and is seriously damaging to relations with ESS by causing them this inconvenience.

It will be very much appreciated if the Executive Officer will take appropriate action to contact the above mentioned writer, determine the location of the ESS materials in question and have her return them to the undersigned immediately.

THE CHAIRMAN: MR. GENERALOV, do you have any comments you would like to make?

MR. GENERALOV: The subject placed by the SUPREME COMMANDER on the agenda of the Council is of extreme importance for the whole of Japan's economy. However, as MR. CHAIRMAN indicated, in order to correctly institute the new commercial rate of exchange it is important to make a further study of all attending circumstances.

The institution of the commercial exchange rate is closely connected with the necessity of the organization of the foreign trade of Japan, and with the work of Japanese industry the problems which were under discussion at previous meetings of this Council.

I concur in the opinion expressed by other Members of the Council that the institution of a Japanese exchange rate should take place as soon as possible and is a desirable step, but before it is done the whole problem should be very thoroughly investigated

I agree with the opinion expressed by the BRITISH COMMONWEALTH MEMBER, that as the subject is of extreme importance it is expedient to hold it over to the next meeting of the Council for further discussion.

Subject : Possible Means for Greater Utilization of Associated Sections.

The following list is offered, pursuant to your request of this morning, as means for greater utilization of the associated Sections in the preparation of the History.

Each associated Section to provide SRS with:

- (1) List of all instructions, with the exception of SCAPINe and SCAPIN-As, issued to the Japanese Government. List to be chronological and indicate type of instruction, i. e. verbal, etc.
- (2) List of actions including legislation, notifications, etc. of the Japanese Government in compliance with instructions issued.
- (3) List of periodic explanatory reports received from the Japanese Government.
- (4) List of command letters to EICHTH Army by date and subject and subsequent reports of action accomplished by Occupation Forces.
- (5) Conference log of instructions and informal guidance to Japanese as additional check.
- (8) List of action delegated to Staff Section other than that having primary responsibility (as a double check to assure complete coverage and coordination).

Very slowly and carefully, lest we imperil our own function. Requests of this nature to other staff sections might lead our critics to the conclusion that we were merely coordinating materials after having them handed to us. Such charges could prove serious.

Subject : Liaison with G-2, CIS.

1. Considering G-3's reluctance to grant carte-blanche access
to their files, the practical policy for SRS is to make each request for access to G-2 source material as specific as possible,
naming documents and outlining the material the historians want
to extract from each document, e.g.:

Document desired: January 1946 Ministry of Justice Report on Prisons.

Specific information therein pertaining to:

- (a) Number of prisons under national administration
- (b) Statistics concerning age, type of offense and length of sentence of prisoners confined in national prisons
- (c) Information concerning prison administration and personnel
- 2. If this procedure is used it will be possible for G-2 to supply a resume of the required data if they decide not to make the original documents available to us.
- 3. It should be made clear to G-2 that no single monograph is planned to encompass all of CIS's activities, but that phase of CIS's responsibilities will be integral parts of several monographs including Treatment of Class B and C Var Criminals, Judicial Reform and Police and Prison Reform.
