Dear Tewk:

It was possibly Emerson who once remarked, incautiously, that if you made the world's best mouse trap, humanity would be a pathway to your door; to which I add - a pathway to your door, but to ask about carburetors.

Anyway, the General Agent of the Delta Line in these parts has just asked me how a Japanese girl now in Japan can get an exit permit to leave there for the purpose of joining her family in Buenos Aires. According to my petitioner the whole family, including mother and father and brothers and sisters, are now resident legally in Buenos Aires, and have obtained from the Argentine authorities a permit for the daughter to enter Argentina. I assume also that they are underwriting the trip, but are reportedly stuck in re exit permit.

The name of this gentle Oriental maiden is Toshiko Yoshihara, and she reportedly lives in the town of Tomari, which is further reported to be near the city of Kagoshima.

All of which will probably be as obscure to you as it is to me, but possibly some of our eminent colleagues in the Far Eastern reaches of the Department may have the answer at their finger tips.

The Secretary of State refers to a letter of April 7, 1948 addressed by Mr. Ellis O. Briggs at the Embassy to Mr. Howard Tewksbury, Chief of the Department's Division of River Plate Affairs, with regard to the procedure to be followed by one desiring to depart from Japan en route to Argentina. Mr. Briggs states that, according to the General Agent of the Delta Line in the Montevideo area, one Toshiko Yoshihara, a Japanese national residing at Tomari near Kagoshima, desires to obtain a permit enabling her to depart from Japan in order to join her family residing at Buenos Aires. It is the understanding of the General Agent that the Argentine authorities have granted permission to this young lady to enter Argentina.

The Officer in Charge is requested to inform the Delta Line that those interested in Miss Yoshihara's entry into Argentina should be advised to present the matter to the Argentine Foreign Office at Buenos Aires with a request that it be further presented to the appropriate authorities in Japan through the Swedish Mission at Tokyo which presently represents Argentine interests in Japan. The Yokohama Branch, Office of United States Political Adviser, has stated that such matters as relate to evidence of identity, documentation for entry into Argentina and payment of transportation costs from Japan to Argentina, should be arranged by the Argentine Government through its representative in Japan. When these preliminaries have been completed, there would doubtless be little difficulty encountered by the person concerned in obtaining an exit permit.

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MEMORANDUM

The Department of State refers to a note from the Legation of Lebanon dated December 4, 1947 under cover of which there was transmitted to the Department an application for permission to enter Japan for Mr. Husni Halabi, who, it is stated, has been appointed by the Lebanese Ministry of National Economy to travel to Japan for the purpose of studying the possibilities for trade between Lebanon and Japan.

Mr. Halabi's application was transmitted to the appropriate military authorities. In reply the Department has received a communication dated April 8, 1948 from the Military Permit Section, Civil Affairs Division, Department of the Army, reporting that a cablegram has been received from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Tokyo, stating that the Lebanese Government already has an official trade representative in Japan in the person of Mr. Sherif Seabra. Since only one trade representative

Halabi

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is permitted in Japan for each country, Theater clearance for Mr. Halabi's entrance into Japan cannot be given. The Supreme Commander adds, however, that if Mr. Halabi wishes to enter Japan as a private trader, he may be granted Theater clearance.

My dear Colonel Scott:

Reference is made to the Department's letter to you of March 17, 1948 communicating the request contained in a cablegram from the American Consulate General at Shanghai dated March 16, 1948 for permission for Mr. Giacomo Mensace to enter Okinawa for business purposes. Reference is also made to a memorandum in reply from your office dated March 31, 1948 informing this Division that the Supreme Commander had requested additional information regarding the purpose of Mr. Mensace's trip to Okinawa. Upon receipt of your memorandum of March 31 under reference, the Department sent a cablegram to the American Consulate General at Shanghai requesting clarification of its cablegram of March 16, 1948.

In this connection a reply has now been received from the Consulate General stating that Mr. Mensace represents a group of Chinese firms known as the Tung An Development Company and that he wishes to negotiate with Myron Buttram of the Oklahoma (probably Okinawa) Philippine Trading Company for the purchase of scrap.

Following the receipt of the letter of April 12, 1948 from the Cosa Corporation regarding the military permit for the travel to Japan of Mr. Julius Mueller, Mr. Corkran telephoned Captain Rawls in the Military Permit Section to ask whether Mr. Mueller's permit could be extended to the month of May or June. Captain Rawls said that he could make it good for May but not for June. If Mr. Mueller wants to go to Japan in June he will have to submit another application to the Commerce Department.

Mr. Corkran then telephoned to the Cosa Corporation office in New York. Miss Delaney was not in the office, but Mr. Corkran talked with Mrs. Gibel and told her that Mr. Mueller's permit could be made good for May but not for June. Mr. Corkran suggested that if Mr. Mueller wants to have his permit revalidated for May, the permit document should be returned as soon as possible to the Department.

Reference is made to your memorandum of March 24, 1948 regarding the March, 1948 application of Mr. Victor Kelly Bashi, a British subject, for permission to enter Japan as a representative of the Occident and Orient Products, Incorporated and the refusal by the Supreme Commander to grant such permission for the reason that there is no record of his clearance for exit on a previous visit to Japan.

In this connection you are informed that upon receipt of the memorandum under reference this Division inquired of the Department of Commerce if it could be of any assistance in ascertaining how Mr. Bashi was able to effect his departure from Japan. A reply has now been received from the Department of Commerce communicating the information which it has received through its New York Regional Office to the effect that inquiry at the Occident and Orient Products, Incorporated, elicited the following response: Mr. Victor Kelly Bashi was born in Burma and has a British passport; he worked in Japan prior to the war for Yehooda I.E. Assia, Kaigan Building, Kobe, Japan and was permitted to stay in Japan during the war by reason of his having been born in Burma; and that he left Japan in 1946 and is now in Bangkok, Siam.

It is assumed by the Department of Commerce that the Occident and Orient Products, Incorporated is not aware how Mr. Bashi obtained exit Theater clearance and that they are no longer interested in sending Mr. Bashi to Japan, in view of the fact that the firm has since sent to Japan another representative.





On 18 July 1947 the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, was advised that Army policy called for the exclusion of all Soviet nationals and Soviet satellite nationals from Pacific islands controlled by U. S. military. On 25 November 1947 CINCFE concurred in a proposal that all documentation be abandoned for "in transit" travel of civil airline passengers through Japan, Korea and Okinawa.

CINCFE now states that in order to exercise proper surveillance of Soviet nationals and Soviet satellite nationals, it is essential that advance notification of such travel be sent to his headquarters. To this end he desires that the Department of State instruct its representatives to report any visas issued to Soviet nationals or Soviet satellite nationals which will involve performance of travel in areas under the jurisdiction of CINCFE. Such reports should be authorized to be sent direct by radio to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, giving the name, nationality, occupation, mission, destination, place and estimated date of departure and means of transportation of such persons.

Information is requested whether the Department of State is agreeable to the course of action requested by CINCFE.

Dear General Eberle:

I have received your letter of April 15 concerning travel of certain aliens in areas controlled by the Far East Command. In that letter you asked whether the Department was agreeable to a certain course of action requested by CINCFE which would enable him to exercise proper surveillance of Soviet nationals and Soviet satellite nationals who travel through the area under his command.

In accordance with the desires of CINCFE, the Department is instructing its representatives in the Soviet Union and the satellite countries, and also those in China (including Formosa and Manchuria), the Philippines, India, Pakistan, the Netherlands East Indies, French Indochina, Burma, Ceylon, and Siam to report to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, by radio all visas issued for travel to the United States through areas under the jurisdiction of CINCFE, giving the information which CINCFE requests.

I trust that this action will take care of the problem in adequate fashion.

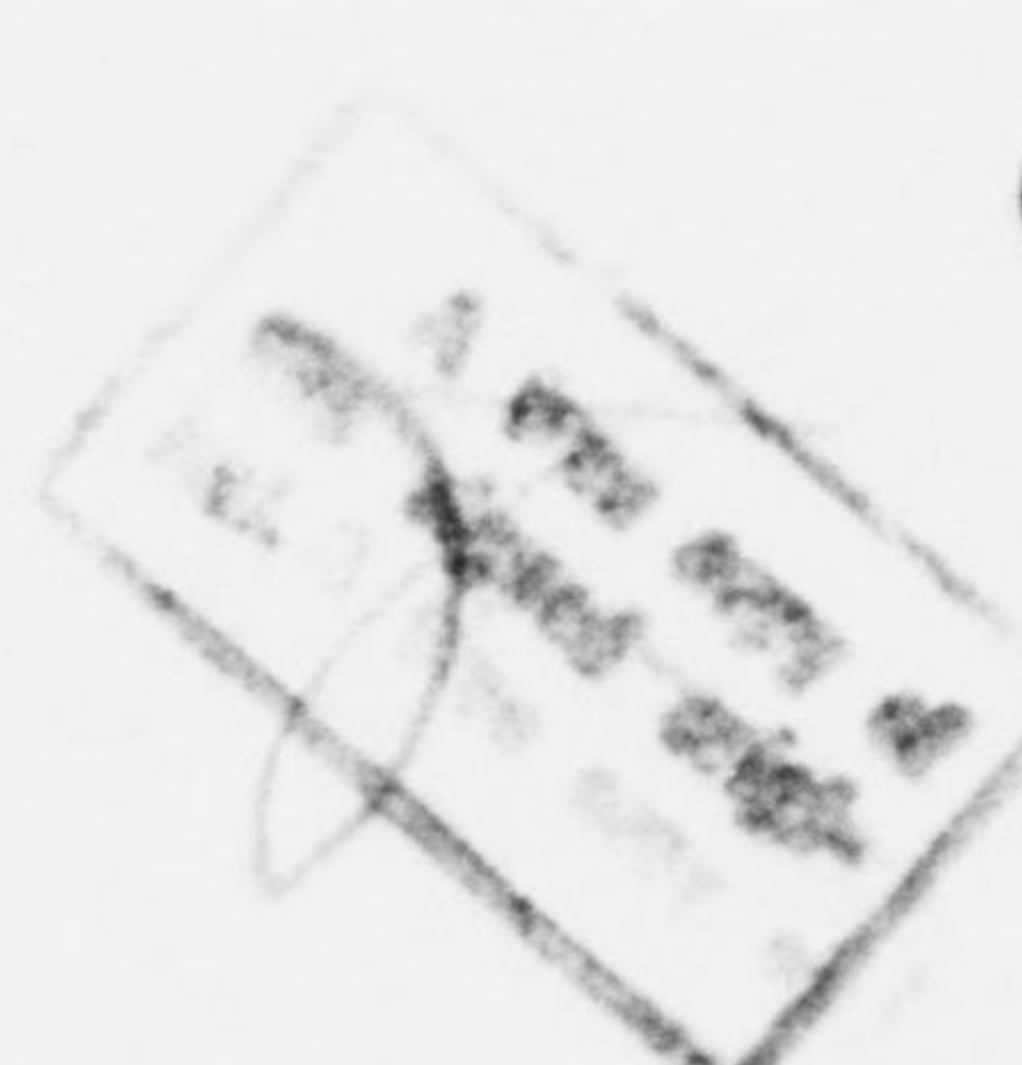

Mr. Holland called to inquire concerning the status of the application of his brother-in-law, Mr. Michael Schalfeieff, for permission to return to his home in Japan. He was particularly concerned with two problems: (1) Mr. Schalfeieff's exit permit from the United States, and (2) his entry permit for Japan.

Concerning his exit from the United States, Mr. Corkran informed Mr. Holland that Mr. Schalfeieff's case file had been studied and that the Department was prepared to grant a waiver of the exit permit requirements in his case. Mr. Corkran explained that the Immigration authorities at San Francisco would be notified of Mr. Schalfeieff's departure, and Mr. Schalfeieff would therefore need no exit permit document.

With regard to Mr. Schalfeieff's entry into Japan, Mr. Corkran expressed his belief that since Mr. Schalfeieff is a permanent resident of Japan he will need no military permit to enter the country. Mr. Holland said that Mr. Schalfeieff is certainly a permanent resident of Japan; he has his home

and all of his family there; moreover, he has been offered a job with the Military Government. Mr. Corkran said that in view of these facts there would seem to be almost no doubt about Mr. Schalfeieff's being able to enter the country without difficulty. However, Mr. Corkran said that he would discuss the case informally with the appropriate military authorities and write a letter to Mr. Holland informing him of the results. Mr. Corkran warned Mr. Holland, however, that no letter from the Department could be taken as a written guarantee that Mr. Schalfeieff would be allowed to enter Japan without a military permit.

I have examined the file which you sent me, and which is returned herewith, concerning the case of Mr. Michael Shalfeieff. It is noted that Mr. Shalfeieff is a stateless person (White Russian) who is a permanent resident of Japan. He has been in the United States on a visitor's visa since last October, and he now wishes to return to Japan on the SS General Meigs, sailing from San Francisco on April 24, 1948. I gather that since he is a permanent resident of Japan he will need no military permit to enter Japan; it was on that basis that he was admitted to the United States as a visitor.

The only question which still remains in his case is that of the exit permit requirements. In referring the case to DS, was it with the thought that DS might request a waiver of the exit permit requirements in his case? If so, you may consider this memorandum as such a request. It seems a needless bother, however, both to your section and to the INS to request a waiver in his case, since he has already gone to the trouble of filing forms AD-1. Would it not be easier for all concerned if you simply made out the little exit permit card and sent it to him?

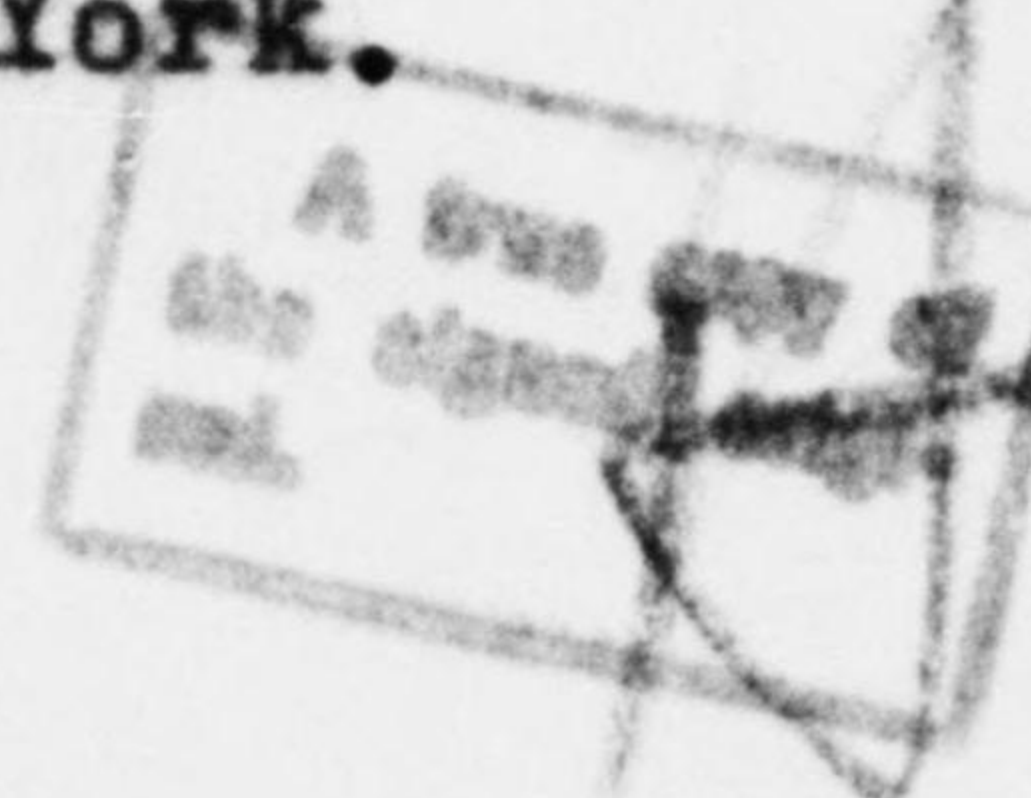

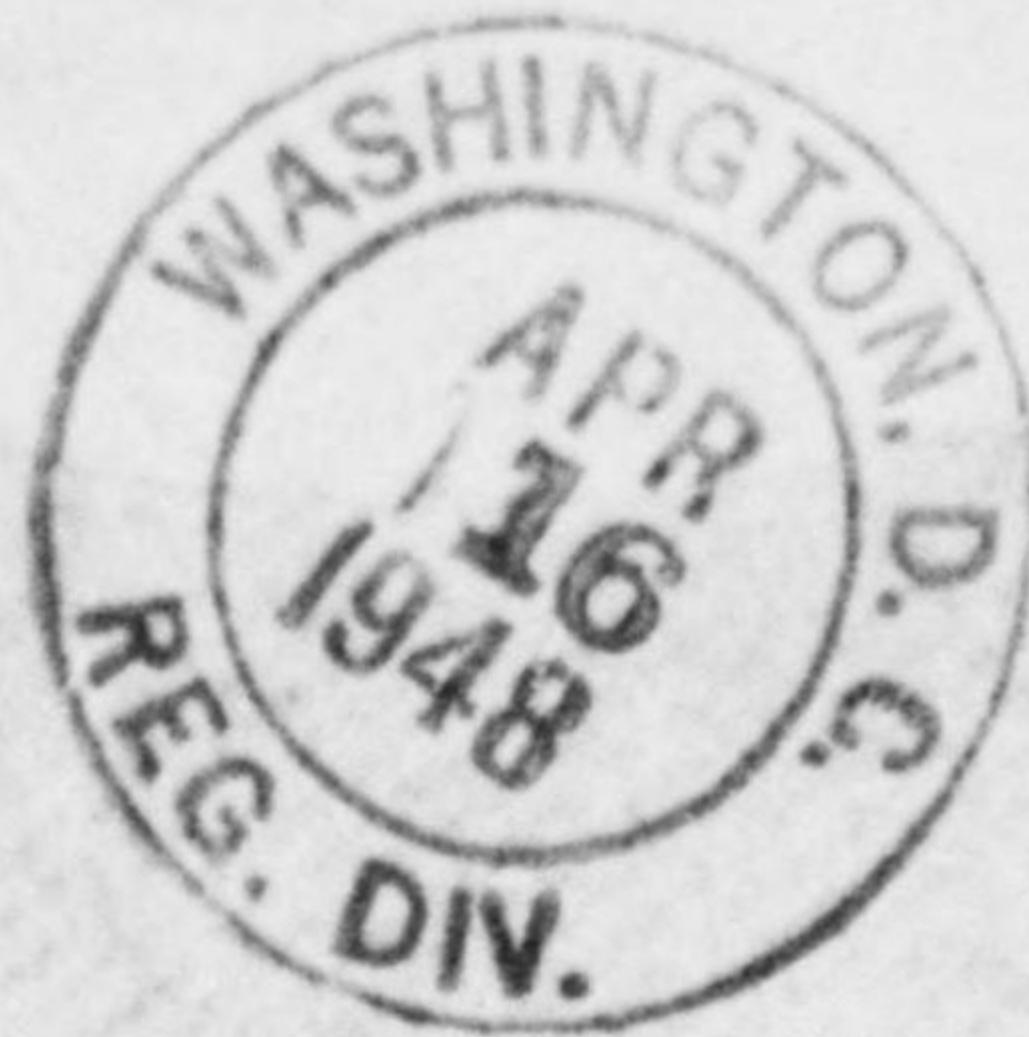

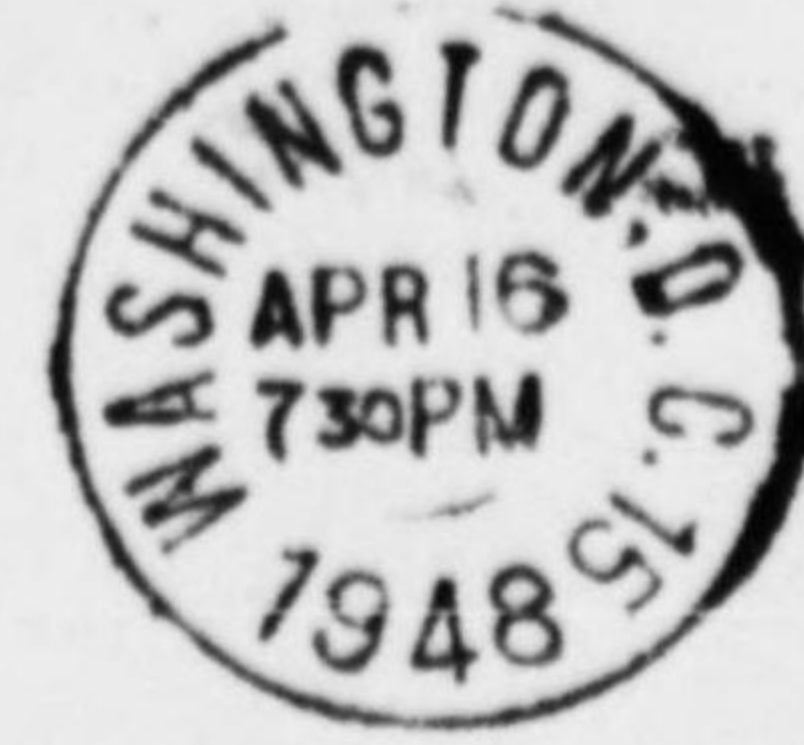

It occurs to this Division that if the messages are encoded certain difficulties might arise in sending a message to the Assistant Chief of Staff G-2, Far East Command in State Department code. It is therefore suggested that the outgoing airgram be amended to read as follows:

"At present areas named. Such reports should be sent by radio to USPOLAD, Tokyo, for transmission to Assistant Chief of Staff G-2, Far East Command"... etc.

As General Eberle is possibly not too much concerned by the means through which these messages shall be transmitted by State Department personnel, the letter to the General signed by Mr. Saltzman has been forwarded.

Art.1 The undermentioned members will take over and continue THE ORIENT BRAZIL TRADING CO. under the organization of a limited partnership of the purpose of Empor & Export business.

Art.2 Authorized capital is fixed to the amount of Yen 50.000. which should be paid by the following parterns with the proportion of:

TO CERTAIN AMERICAN DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR OFFICERS

At present no documentation is required for persons performing "in transit" travel through Japan, Korea and Okinawa. MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

Mrs. Erny Trümpy today visited DS in connection with the pending application of Mr. Americo Guerra, an Argentine business man, for permission to travel to Japan. Mrs. Trümpy is a personal friend of Mr. Guerra and is also acquainted with Dr. Drago, the Charge at the Argentine Embassy, and with other officers of the Embassy. For several months Mrs. Trümpy has been in almost daily communication with Mr. Guerra in an effort to obtain action upon his application. On March 24, 1948 the Department addressed a memorandum to the Embassy asking for additional information concerning the purpose of Mr. Guerra's trip. Since that time Mr. Guerra has been pressing the Ministry of Foreign Relations in Buenos Aires to forward the additional information to the Embassy in Washington. Mrs. Trümpy reported today that Mr. Guerra has informed her by cable that the Ministry of Foreign Affairs allegedly sent the information to the Embassy several days ago. The Embassy states, however, that it has received no message from Buenos Aires in this connection.

Mrs. Trümpy gave informally to Mr. Corkran the necessary additional information, which is as follows: Mr. Guerra wishes to travel to Japan for the purpose of organizing and reestablishing commercial intercourse between the Japanese firm Iida y Compania Limitada Takashimaya and Mr. Guerra's Argentine firm American Commercial Interchange Company Guerra Jara y Compania. These two firms dealt with each other over a period of twenty-four years until commercial relations were interrupted by the war.

Mr. Corkran suggested to Mrs. Trümpy in the interest of speed that the State Department could forward this information to the military authorities if the Argentine Embassy would simply send the Department a note referring to her visit and officially endorsing the information which she gave.

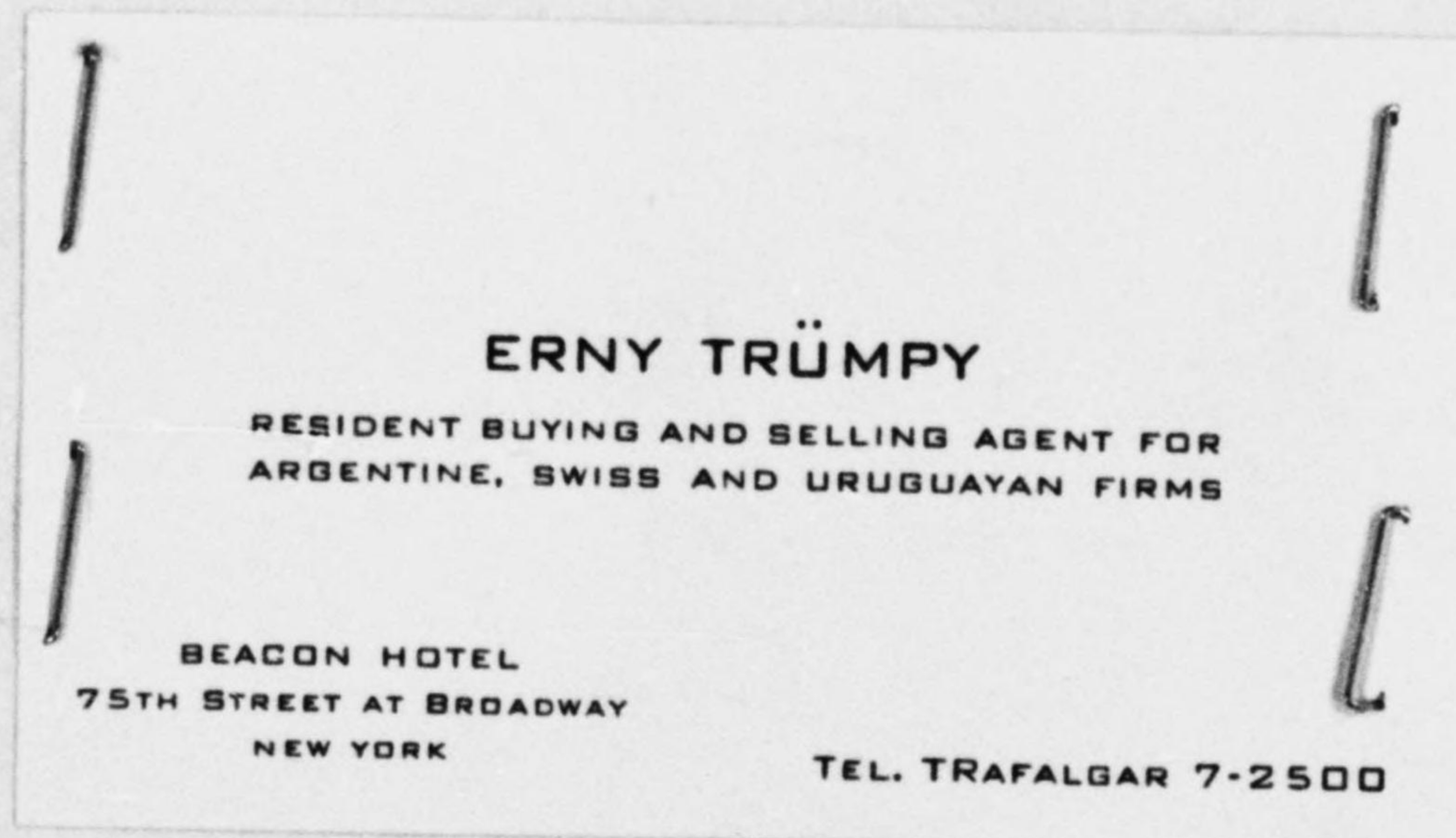
