

Wikis

- A website where anyone can edit any page at any time
- Meant to be "quick"
- Remembers all versions (nothing ever destroyed)
- Hyperlinks between pages

Wikipedia policies

- Neutral Point of View written so all sides can agree
- Notability significant independent sources -> importance
- Verifiability Using reliable sources to reference information
- No original research point to existing scholarship
- Assume good faith start with congenial spirit
- Conflicts of interest disclose and abide by terms of service



The **Jamestown**^[1] settlement in the Colony of Virginia was the first permanent English settlement in the Americas. It was located on the east bank of the Powhatan (James) River about 2.5 mi (4 km) southwest of the center of modern Williamsburg. William Kelso writes that Jamestown "is where the British Empire began".^[2] It was established by the Virginia Company of London as "James Fort" on May 4, 1607 O.S.;(May 14, 1607 N.S.),^[3] and was considered permanent after brief shandenment in 1610. It followed several failed attempts including the Lost Colony of Pospeke, established in 1585 on

Discrimination

Allegations have been made that throughout the agency's history its personnel have discriminated against farmers of val to other programs well into the 1990s.^[14] The effect of this discrimination has been the reduction in the number of Africa similar case, Garcia v. — Many black farmers across the nation experienced discrimination in their dealings with farmers alleged, and the USDA later agreed, they were denied access to loans and subsidies provided by the governme afforded to white farmers were not afforded to black farmers.^[17] Since they were denied government loans, emergency of farmers lost their farms and homes.^[18]


- Search linked articles for relevant information

1. Identify the target article (Ex. United States National Agricultural Library)


2. Create a new article. Name it the alias. USNAL

3. To Redirect, select icon w/ three lines.4. Select Page settings.


