

Dutch Bulb Crop Report

M. van Toulon van der Koog, secretary of the Dutch Bulb Exporters' Association, Haarlem, Holland has sent the following report of the Holland bulb crop:

"Originally a very satisfactory crop was expected; however, on account of the heat, which set in suddenly during the last two weeks, the crop will not come up to the expectation entertained.

"The hyacinth bulbs are good, but the crop of the large sizes will be moderate.

"The crop of the Darwin and late tulips is good; that of the single and double early tulips, fairly good, though below the expectation.

"The crop of narcissus bulbs is not so good as last year and, on the whole, moderate; that of the crocus also moderate.

"The weather for the ripening of the bulbs has been favorable, so that we may expect to get bulbs which, though they will be smaller, will have a good forcing capacity."

The Embargo on Bulbs

All users of imported bulbs should take notice that after January 1, 1926, by order of the Federal Horticultural Board, the following bulbs, now admitted without restriction, may be imported only on special permit, for propagation, scientific, or similar purposes; but not for resale, or to produce flowers for sale: Narcissi of all classes and varieties, Fritillaria Meleagris, Fritillaria Imperialis (Crown Imperial), Muscari (Grape Hyacinth), Snowdrops (Gallanthus), Scillas, Chionodoxa (Glory of the Snow), Eranthis Hyemalis (Winter Aconite).

Formosum

Cold Storage 10 Days

Growers must not force Formosum in great heat. A cool house, 60 to 65 degrees, with plenty of moisture is better, but they will certainly do best when grown in pots. The so-called Formosum seems to be a class rather than a single type, and start into growth irregularly, so if in pots they can be shifted into sections representing varying heights to give proper light and watering.

ANNUALS FOR FALL SOWING

Few know many of our prettiest and best known annuals may be sown in the fall, in fact some varieties, like the annual Larkspur, are much better, treated in this way. The principle is the one nature uses. Seed dropped from parent plants will lay dormant in the soil until early in the spring when it germinates and begins a root system long before one can get in the ground to sow seed. Consequently the flowering season is prolonged by the earlier blooming. Ground should be prepared and seed sown just previous to the late heavy frost-early in November.
