THIS AGREEMENT, made this 25th day of September, 1911, Between THE PATRONS' TELEPHONE COMPANY OF WARREN COUNTY, party of the first part, and THE DELAWARE, LACKAWANNA AND WESTERN RAILROAD COMPANY, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Telephone Company desires to have a telephone installed in the passenger station of the Railroad Company at Bridgeville, New Jersey, for the benefit of the patrons of the Telephone Company, and the Railroad Company is willing to have such a telephone installed under the conditions and agreements hereinafter contained.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) by each party to the other paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

FIRST:- The Railroad Company agrees to furnish a telephone instrument to be installed in its passenger station at Bridgeville, New Jersey; and to permit the Telephone Company to install and connect the same with its lines.

SECOND:- The Telephone Company agrees, at its own cost and expense, to install the said telephone instrument in said station in the location directed by the Railroad Company; to connect the same with the line of the Telephone Company; to furnish, erect and install all poles, wires, apparatus and instruments required to properly and safely make such connection and operate said telephone; and to keep and maintain the said telephone and connection in good working order and condition.

The Telephone Company agrees to furnish to the Railroad Company unlimited service and privileges, over all lines and with all other telephones of the Telephone Company, with

THIRD:- The Telephone Company agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Railroad Company from and against any and all loss, damage or injury to the property of the Railroad Company or to the person or property of any persons whomsoever, by reason of any work done or precaution omitted by the Telephone Company in connection with the installation or maintenance of said telephone or connection.

FOURTH:- The Railroad Company agrees to pay the Telephone Company at the rate of ten cents (\$.10), toll charges, for each and every call made over the lines of the Telephone Company from the Bridgeville station by persons other than those in the employ of the Railroad Company; but the Railroad Company does not thereby agree to permit the said telephone to be used for outgoing calls by persons other than its own employes. On the contrary it is expressly understood and agreed that the said telephone shall not be used for outgoing calls by the public, except in so far as the Railroad Company may choose to permit such use.

FIFTH:- Upon the termination of this contract the Telephone Company agrees to disconnect said telephone, to remove all its said poles, wires, apparatus and instruments from the property of the Railroad Company, and to repair and make good to the satisfaction of the Railroad Company any damage caused by or resulting from the erection, maintenance or removal of the same.

SIXTH:- This contract shall continue in force and effect for a period of one year from the date hereof and thereafter until terminated by either party by giving thirty days notice in writing to the other.
