
08 September 2014: Asia - Floods and severe weather





PAKISTAN

 As of 7 September (NDMA), due to recent floods there were: 193 dead in north-eastern Pakistan (119 in Punjab, 63 in AJK, 11 in Gilgit Baltistan), 364 people injured, 676 villages affected, 4 260 houses partially damaged and 1 838 totally damaged.

INDIA

- As of 8 September (media), at least 160 people were killed in Jammu and Kashmir (northern India) due to floods of the last few days. Thousands of people are still stranded. More than 3 908 people evacuated to safer places. Relief and rescue operations are ongoing. Srinagar has been particularly hit by floods. National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) teams are deployed at various places. 14 800 people have been evacuated to date.
- In the next 24-48 h heavy to very heavy rains may also affect parts of central- western India.

BANGLADESH

- Since 13 August heavy rains have affected parts of Bangladesh, causing floods in 20 districts.
- According to the DMIC (as of 4 of September), there were approx. 3 million people affected. More than 230 000 people displaced in nine districts (JNA/HCTT).

THAILAND

- Heavy rains caused floods in at least 28 provinces affecting 14 562 houses and killed at least 10 people since 26 August.
- As of 7 September (Media), the situation was improved in 23 provinces (out of 28), while five provinces of northern Thailand were still partially affected by floods.

<u>CHINA</u>

- On 8 September Tropical Depression FOURTEEN, reached the coast of Guangdong. It may cause heavy rains in this province, as well as Guangxi and Hainan.
- In the last two weeks, heavy rains affected also the provinces of Sichuan and Guinzhou, as well as the municipality of Chongqing, causing floods, landslides and killing more than 40 people.
