Subj is Agenda TRIPAC MTG Dec 7 TRIPAC 22.

In accordance previous suggestions, Dept prefers solution (B). Although wld not object solution (C). If (B) or (C) adopted, shld be understood no part of released assets shld inure to Germans living in Germany.

Hence release shld not be made to Gumucio Y Compania but to those shareholders residing in Bolivia or their duly authorized agents.

TRIPAC 24. Dept agrees in principle appropriate request UK custodian subj Jap Sterling Bonds to SCAP, but US is not in position press matter should be object, since related issue of disposition certain Jap Dollar Bonds claimed by OAF on behalf US Govt still under discussion between Dept and OAF.

(See Para 7 W 9515 Nov 21). If object, suggest matter be postponed. Assume CFC reference to "SITUS of Payment: Shld read "SITUS of issue which is test used in Brussels Agreement.

TRIPAC 25. While Dept appreciates acquisition Concordia Club assets by Kobe Club may be best course, it is necessary bear in mind that US share assets distributed by IARA ultimately accrues to US Treasury. Dept consequently not willing authorize transfer of Ger assets in Japan private parties unless appropriate compensation paid. In view SCAP's authority (B) (5) of principles to issue regulations for sale real property belonging to Category A Germans when such sale is considered by SCAP to be in interest of occupation, or purchaser is acceptable to SCAP, suggest TRIPAC consider possibility negotiated sale at agreed price rather than outright gift. In this connection wld appear unjustified give Kobe Club treatment more favorable than that given TRIPAC Govts re inquisition Ger real property.

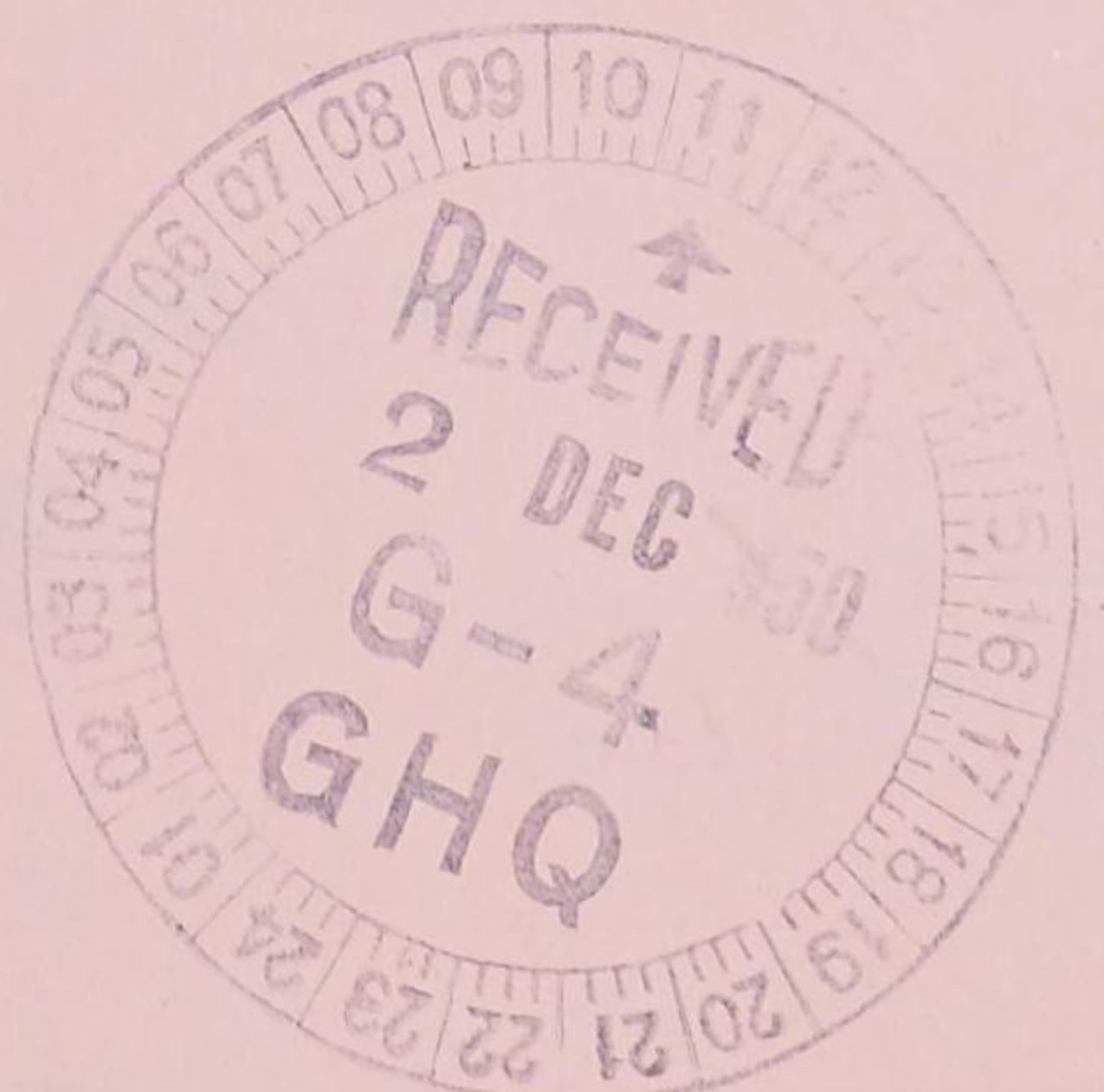

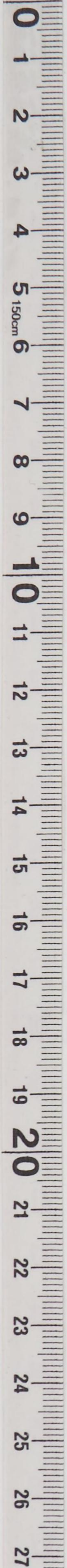

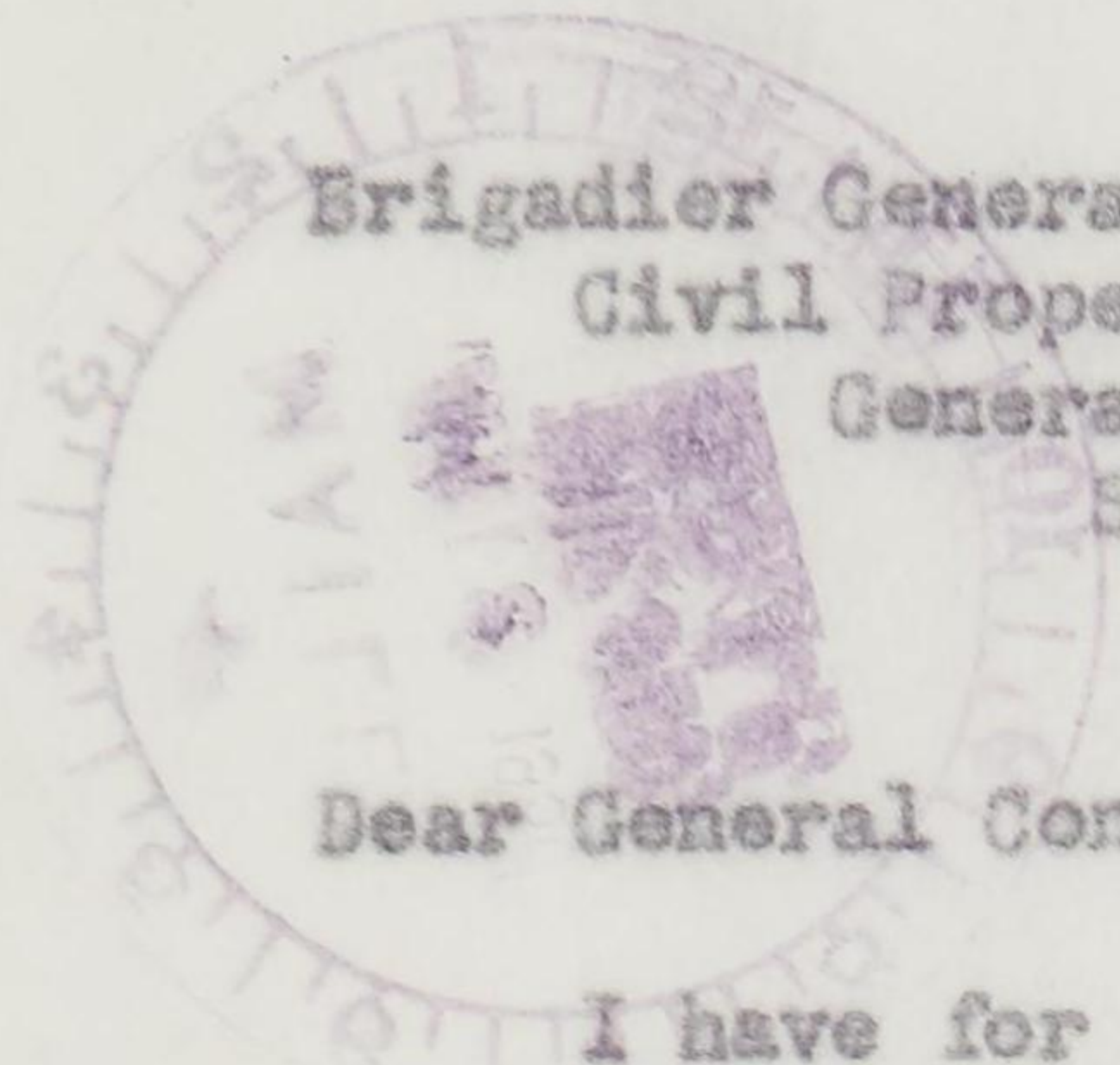

Dear General Conklin:

I have for reference my letter dated March 14, 1950 regarding the establishment of the Tri-Power Advisory Committee (TRIPAC) to assist the Supreme Commander, in an advisory capacity, in matters relating to the treatment of German assets in Japan vested by Allied Control Authority, Control Council Law no. 5, October 30, 1945, as amended by Regulation no. 1, May 10, 1948.

In that letter I informed you that I have designated Mr. Carl H. Boehringer, Economic Counselor, to serve on TRIPAC as the representative of the Office of the United States Political Adviser. As it appears advisable for Mr. Boehringer to have an alternate, especially in view of the fact that he will be absent from Tokyo during the coming summer, I have designated Mr. Robert W. Adams, Second Secretary of Mission, to serve as Mr. Boehringer's alternate.

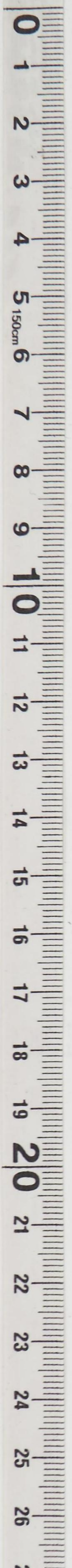

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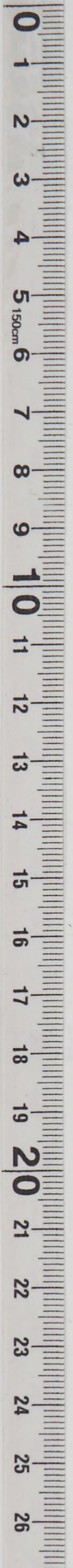

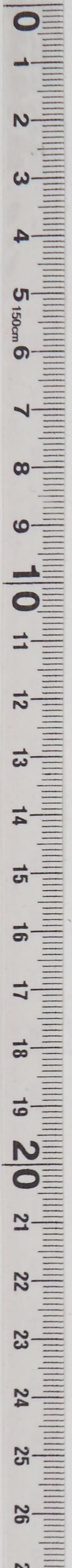

Dear General Conklin:

I have for reference General Orders no. 7 dated March 9, 1950, issued by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, regarding the establishment of the Tri-Power Advisory Committee (TRIPAC) to assist the Supreme Commander, in an advisory capacity, in matters relating to the treatment of German assets in Japan which have been vested by Allied Control Authority, Control Council Law no. 5, October 30, 1945, as amended by Regulation no. 1, May 10, 1946.

For purposes of record, this Office refers to the notes dated February 27, 1950, sent by it to the United Kingdom Liaison Mission in Japan, and to the French Mission in Japan, requesting those Missions to designate representatives to participate in the work of TRIPAC. Copies of these notes are on file in the Office of the Civil Property Custodian, together with copies of the replies sent by those Missions to this Office. The United Kingdom Liaison Mission, in its note dated March 2, 1950, designated Mr. Cooper Blyth, at present head of the United Kingdom Reparations and Restitution Delegation, as the United Kingdom member of TRIPAC. The French Mission, in its note dated March 1, 1950, designated Mr. M. Mornand, Economic Adviser and Chief of the French Reparations and Restitution Delegation, as representative of the French Mission on TRIPAC, with Mr. F. Auckenthaler as deputy representative.

Please note that I have designated Mr. Carl H. Boehringer, Economic Counselor, as representative of the Office of the United States Political Adviser to serve on TRIPAC.

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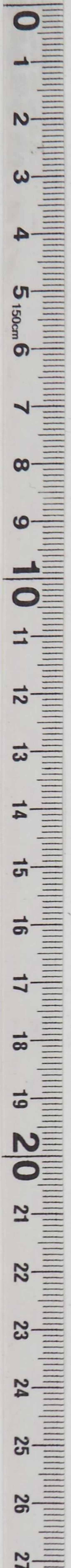
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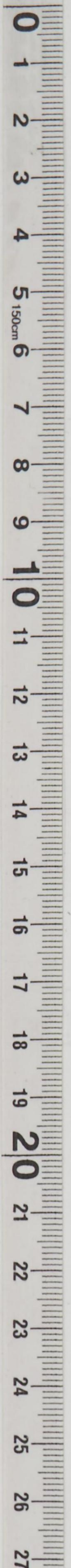
