## SHADE AND ORNAMENTAL TREES

To avoid any misunderstanding regarding sizes and grades of trees we make the following explanation. The 6-8 ft. grade takes in trees which are 6 ft. and over and up to 8 ft., but does not include the 8 ft. trees. For illustration: In case the planter desires an 8 ft. tree it will be necessary to purchase the 8-10 ft. Size. This also applies to trees sold by caliper. The size of trees sold by diameter is measured six inches above the roots.

### ELM TREES

Elms are the best trees for general planting. For street and park purposes, they have no equal. We are propagating Elms by grafting, which are far superior to the Common American Elm. You will find a description of the Vase and Moline Pyramidal Elms in our catalog.
