

Here he recovered so far as to be able to speak, and gave some account of what he supposed led to the deplorable accident. His sufferings were dreadful, and he lingered till the following evening, when he expired, and was intered at Kirklington on Sunday last. Mr. Sanderson was about 70 years of age.
