It is used to facilitate the creation of Wikipedia articles without access to the internet. Once completed and connected to the internet, these articles can be uploaded to Wikipedia.

It can also be used to create and publish articles on other websites based on wikis like Vikidia.



• Educational tool : - offline education space that facilitates learning through content contribution.

## Uses of WikiFundi

It is currently operational in 13 countries via 3 programs:

Wikipack Africa for outreach work of Wikipedians in Algeria, Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, Ghana, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania and Uganda (soon Togo)

WikiChallenge African Schools : getting 9-11 kids in primary school write articles for Vikidia. Part of the Orange Foundation's Digital Schools Project in Guinea, Tunisia, Madagascar, and Mali.

WikiAfrica Schools – introduces, trains, and supports South African students (14-16) as they incorporate a Wikipedia article-writing program into their curriculums. It is supported by lettera27.
