VEN the most moderate politician in India who is pining for peace with Britain at any cost will admit that Wavell's offer is far from amounting to even Dominion Status. All they say in favour of it is that it is a tep towards self-government. Wavell's offer puts a high

premium on the aggressive communalism of Mr. Jinnah. The more obstinate he is, the more concessions he gets. Despite the glaring fact that his Moslem League represents only a section of the Indian Moslems, as was abundantly proved in the last general elections for the Central and the Provincial Legislatures, the British are endeavouring to make out that Jinnah is more or less the uncrowned king of the 90 million Mos-lems of India. The British invest him with such undue importance only because his irreconcilable communalism is a very convenient pretext for the continuance of British rule for ever. Is the Congress going to yield to this. and thus write its own death-warrant as a national political body embracing all communities and classes in India regardless of caste or creed?

Another grave objection to the acceptance of Wavell's offer is that it binds the Indian leaders to fully cooperate with Britain in her war against Nippon. Such co-operation would merit the severest condemnation on prudential and moral grounds. It would involve the already impoverished and famine-stricken India in more intense drain on her human and material resources.

If brudence dictates that India should not bother herself in the least with Britain's war against Nippon, morality also points the same course. What injury did Nippon ever do to India, to justify our fighting against, the Nipponese in this war? On the contrary, the Nipponese, as our fellow Asiatics. have always sympathised with the cause of Indian independence. And during the last three years they have rendered invaluable help to Netail and his three million followers in East Asia in our trusele for our country's

In face of this fact, it would nart of Indians if they harness themselves to Britain's war arainst Nippon. Britain is not claiming that the East Asia War is being fought for any great. or noble nurpose Britain's sole aim in this war is to make her imperialism safe in East Asja. That is the reason why we Indians in East Asja earnestly hav that Wavell's offer may after all be turned down by Congress and other nationalist leeders. But even should the would not shake our determination, to keep up our crusade arainst the British Imperialism until we attain Purna Swaraj.

NEW SOVIET MOVE SEEN IN BALKANS

Anglo-Russian Relations Getting Strained Over Greek Border Clashes

Zurich, July 12 (Domei)-A special 'New York Times' wire from Athens today reported that Soviet troops have now appeared on Bulgaria's frontier with Greece and at some points Russian non-commissioned offi-cers appear to be in charge of border posts. Although the sources of this information cannot be revealed, it may be considered to be entirely accurate, the dispatch said.

This fact has added to the

general uneasiness now prevailing in Greece, where there is an acute awareness that frontier incidents with small Albanian, Jugoslav and Bulgarjan bands are growing in number. The dispatch said that British units stationed in Macedonia and Thrace are doing their utmost to maintain order and keep the scale of these incidents in check.

While most of the minor forays are extremely trivial, the fact that they are occurring on the average of every other day is disturbing, the dispatch said.

A few weeks ago an Indjan Army captain escorting some Greek boy scouts on a "picnic" near the Bulgarian frontier was arrested when he went to the border to inform the Bulgarians what his group comprised. He was later released by a Russian officer, but his jeep was impounded.

Shortly afterwards, a mixed British and Greek patrol in three Bren-gun carriers "misread" its maps and penetrated some hundred yards into Bulgaria, the dispatch said. These men were arrested at rifle point and held for three days during which they were thoroughly interrogated by a Soviet Colonel

who came from Sofia. Furthermore, there is con-siderable evidence that an organized irregular band led by the Bulgarian secret police is operating in Thrace and Mace-

donia. In order to tighten up the heer ingratitude on the situation, the British were said to have now placed strict restrictions on the border. No Russian is now able to enter Greece without first obtaining permission from the "Allied Control Commission" in Sofia.

Within Greece, the British complain that the Communist Party is conducting a campaign against the morale of the British troops, especially Indian units

Reports from Simla reveal that Wavell has already made a further concession to the Muslim League. These reports state that Wavell had originally drawn up a tentative list of the new Council and that this list contained the name of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, but later, to placate Mr. Jinnah, the Viceroy struck off Maulana Azad's name.

Congress and Nationalist circles including Nationalist Muslims are indignant at this deliberate insult to the Congress and to a great Muslim who is also a great nationalist. Nationalist observers interpret Wavell's action as one more proof of the hollowness and hypocrisy of his ridiculous claim to be a sincere friend of India. No sincere friend of India will uphold and encourage such sectarian agitation as represented by Mr. Jinnah and the Muslim League, but because it suits Wavell as the highest agent of British imperialistic tyranny and exploita-tion to create and pamper division and communalism, naturally Wavell is ready to encourage and consent to the Muslim League's extreme demands.

Wavell's latest concession to the Muslim League also proves the correctness of Netaji's repeated declaration that the British proposals are only a cunning plan to undermine the strength and position of the Congress and to force the Congress and Nationalist Yeaders into a helpless position of being mere "yes" men, and for this treacherous purpose, Wavell will not only make any concession to the Muslim League regardless of India's national interests. He will make or perhaps he has already made secret agreements with the Muslim League whose support is the bedrock of the Wavell plan to exploit India with the nominal sanction of Indian leaders.

As International Banker

Lisbon, July 12 (Domei)-Soviet Russia is pictured in the role of international banker, offering dollar credits to neighbouring states in reports widely circulated from London, Reuter reported. The Soviet Embassy officials said they had "no comment" to make upon the reports that Russia has approached such bordering nations as Poland. Czechoslovakia. Rumania. Hungary, Bulgaria and Yugoslavia with offers of dollar loans to enable neighbouring nations to purchase raw materials from United States, South America and Britain for manufacture into finished products for sale to the Russian Govern-

According to reports which British and American officials have been checking since late fast week. Russia is implementing trade agreements she has with bordering nations by offering them credits necessary to purchase raw materials or machinery with which to produce goods she needs, Reuter further reported. Russian credits are to be made before the end of the year with delivery of anv manufactured goods produced from raw materials acquired with money deferred until late Spring of next year.

In the cases of both Poland and Czechoslovakia according to Reuter, Russia will not call for delivery of finished goods until supplies for the two nations' own pressing domestic needs are moving into consumption. Neither the Czechs nor Poland are anxious to accept proferred credits, Reuter continued, until they know whether or not the international fund agreement will be put into operation by subscribing nations. In both instances officials feel that it would be ill-advised to accept credits in quoted hard money and sell finished goods for controlled currency such as the power. Russian ruble.

One version of the Russian loan was that the country may loan gold to her neighbouring nations, permitting them to convert the metal into dollars. Another was that credits of six milliard dollars which the Soviet is reported seeking in the United States would be reloaned to border nations, Reuters said.

Postponement Of Tangier Conference Requested

July 1) (Domei)-The British Foreign Office last night French Foreign Minister Georges Bidault the suggestion that the Tangier conference be postponed until the Brilish Government had further time to consider the question of the Soviet Union's participation in the talks, according to a Reuter dis-patch from Paris.

Nippon Frontline Base in the Southern Regions, July 12 (Domei)-A British carrier task force attacked Sabang, northern tip of Sumaira Island, yesterday morning. Approximately ten carrier aircraft participated in the attack.

Enemy planes operated from two aircraft-carriers which comprised the mainstay of the British task force. The enemy carrier task force made is appearance in waters adjacent to Sabang around 10 o'clock yesterday.

Wartime Education In Nippon Streamlined

Tokyo, July 12 (Domei)-The Education Ministry today an-nounced the simplification of its organization designed to streamline Nippon's wartime education system. The present revamping reduces the organization of the Ministry from six bureaux and 30 departments to five bureaux and 22 departments with the resultant 30 per cent personnel cut.

Other outstanding features of the present reorganization include, firstly, establishment of a student mobilization bureau tasked with the more effective employment of students to be mobilized for factory and farm work; secondly, appointment of two councillors to the Ministry who, by special orders from the Education Minister, undertake survey and planning on specific matters.

Parallel with its reorganization, the Education Ministry will transfer part of its authorities and personnel to the headquarters of regional Superinten-dents-General and prefectural governments in accordance with the Government's policy of decentralizing administrative

Of these 532,233 were killed, died of wounds or injuries, or are missing and believed killed.

Lisbon, July 11 (Domei)-Foreign ships bringing goods to Britain are having difficulty in getting cargoes of coal to take back to home ports, because of the current coal shortage in Britain, according to a Newcastle report.
