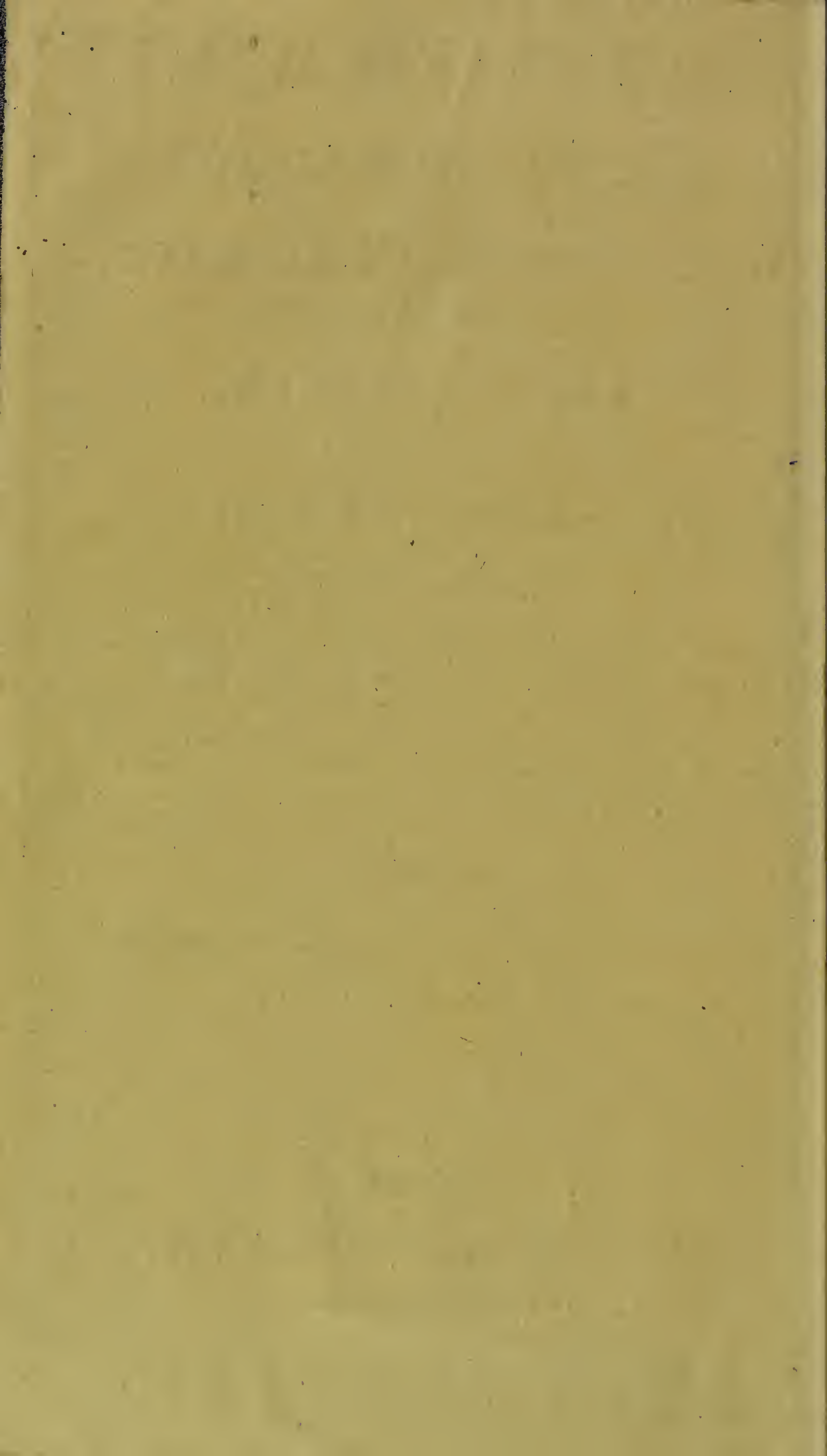

### PASSING COUNTERFEIT MONEY.

Several cases have lately passed under our notice, in which respectable citizens have been prosecuted for passing counterfeit money, by those to whom the money was passed. In all these cases, the defendants have been acquitted, and in one or two the plaintiffs have been made to pay the costs. This will ever be the result, as it should be, for the most respectable citizens of the community are liable to be mistaken, and to receive bank notes, or coin as genuine, that may turn out otherwise.—It would be hard indeed, if all such were liable to criminal prosecutions and criminal punishment. The proper mode is, for a person who receives a counterfeit note, to sue the individual from whom he receives it, for the amount of the note. It can readily be recovered, if it is clearly proven that the plaintiff absolutely did receive the false note from the defendant. We allude to this matter, in order to place persons on their guard, for it is hard enough for them to receive counterfeit money, without adding to their loss, by being compelled to pay court charges. Of course we refer to persons of respectable character, in the transactions we have alluded to, as a noted counterfeiter, suspected disreputable character, would, even if the case were doubtful, be very likely to be convicted.

### NEW BANK NOTE PLATES.

We have been favoured by Messrs. Draper, Underwood, Bald & Spencer, Bank Note Engravers of this city, with some specimens of new bank note plates, which have just been engraved at their establishment. Among them we may note the following:  
**THE COMMERCIAL BANK OF MILLINGTON.**

This is a new institution which recently went into operation in Millington, Md. The notes on this bank for five dollars, have for a vignette, a very beautiful country scene, in which several reapers are engaged, while a country seat and a mill are to be descried in the distance. Each end of the note is ornamented with a female figure, with her right hand upon a horn of plenty.

The tens have for a vignette, a female figure seated and engaged in writing upon a tablet, with a distant view of the ocean, upon which a ship is visible; also the figure of Neptune and his sea chariot. Each end of the notes are ornamented with a medallion bust.

The vignette of the twenties presents a view of two female figures in the front ground—and the ocean with vessels upon it to the right; and a country town with a steamboat before it to the left of the figures. The ends of these are also embellished with medallion busts.

### LANCASTER OHIO BANK.

This is an old and very flourishing institution.—The directors have obtained new plates for their notes of five, twenty, fifty and one hundred dollars.

The fives have for a vignette, the picture of a farmer's boy asleep under a wheat stack, and at each end is the representation of a beautiful female, with a sickle in her hand.

The vignette of the twenties, is a frame encasing two medallion heads, and at each end of the frame, is a female figure, and each end of the notes is embellished with the vignette of the fives, that of a farmer's boy asleep.

The fifties have a cluster of three females, all seated, as a vignette—at each side of this view, is a

medallion head—and each end of the note contains a beautiful picture of a farmer's boy, carrying a spade, basket, &c. and a view of a farmer at work.

The vignette of the hundred dollar notes contain a large and beautiful female figure, in a recumbent posture, and is further ornamented with four medallion heads.

### THE FARMER'S BANK OF CANTON, OHIO.

This is also a well established institution. It is located in Canton, Stark county, Ohio. The five dollar notes are printed in the German language. They have a beautiful vignette, representing three female figures—commerce, agriculture, &c. Each end of the notes is further ornamented with a female, with a sickle in one hand and a bunch of straw in the other.

The fifties have a large female figure for a vignette, and a boy sleeping under a wheat stack, as an ornament for each end of the notes,

The vignette of the one hundred dollar notes is similar to those for five dollars on the Lancaster Bank.

### COMMERCIAL BANK, SCIOTA, OHIO.

The new plates of this bank, which has lately resumed business in Portsmouth, Ohio, of the denomination of five dollars, have for a vignette, a female seated and pouring a liquid into an urn, from which an eagle is sipping.

The tens have for a vignette, a large and beautiful female figure, with a steamboat on a river in the distance.

The twenties have a picture of commerce, vessels sailing, &c. for a vignette—and each end is ornamented with a superbly engraved likeness of a female.

### BANK OF NORWALK, OHIO.

The vignette of the ones, represents an Indian Chief, seated in the midst of a wild spot of country. One end has a likeness of Penn, and the other that of Jefferson.

Another plate of the notes of one dollar has for a vignette, a likeness of Washington, mounted on a spirited war horse.

The threes have for a vignette, a beautiful female figure. Each end is also ornamented with a female figure.

### ALEXANDRIA, D. C.

The Corporation of Alexandria have issued notes for the sum of one dollar, payable at the Bank of Alexandria. The plate is a new one, and has two female figures for a vignette, with a view of commerce, &c. Each end is also embellished with a female figure.

### MECHANICS BANK AT NEW YORK.

This Bank has just obtained new plates for their notes of three, five and ten dollars. They are of the same description as those which have heretofore been used by this institution.

The above plates are among the most beautiful specimens of workmanship, that have ever passed under our notice. We confess we feel gratified at the rapid progress of the fine arts in this country.—In a few years longer, and our engravers may fairly challenge competition with the best in Europe. Indeed Messrs. Draper, Underwood, Bald & Spencer may already do so.



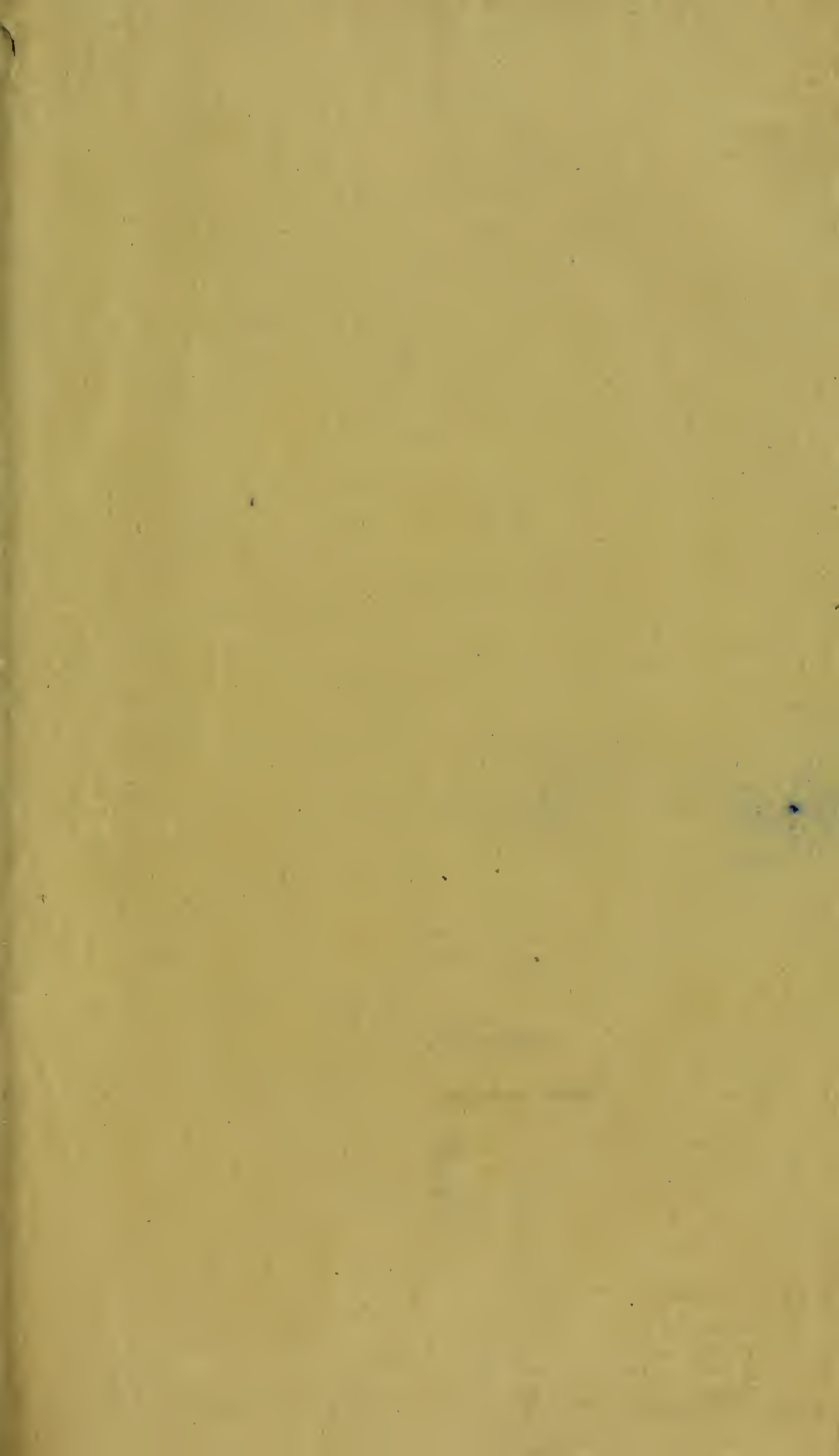
