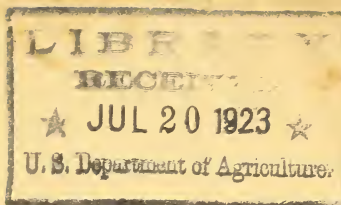

WHOLESALE CATALOGUE.

FOR AUTUMN OF 1886.

We herewith present our Semi-annual WHOLESALE CATALOGUE OF TRADE LIST for the Autumn of 1886. We have an unusually large and fine stock, and invite those interested to call and examine for themselves. All orders will receive prompt and careful attention.

The Autumn season for digging and packing usually commences about the first of October and continues until the ground freezes, say 10th to 15th of November.

Persons ordering trees of us should be particular to write their orders in full, stating distinctly what forms they desire the trees, whether standard or dwarf, and also give directions by what route they wished them consigned, *and to send their orders early*. If the whole or part of it is left to us, we will use our best judgment how to forward them, but in *no case* will be responsible for any loss or detention that may occur after shipment, unless we are at fault.

If any mistake should be found to have occurred, when plants reach their destination, our customers will please notify us of it immediately, and we will at once make such amends as is in our power, so that full satisfaction may be given.

DIGGING AND PACKING.—All our trees and plants are taken up with the utmost care (so that the roots may be injured as little as possible in digging) and packed in firm and secure boxes, with moistened moss, by competent men who have had many years experience in packing, so that all plants may reach their destination in perfect order. In packing, the cost of boxes and materials used will be charged, except to agents and dealers, to which will be added the cost of labor in assorting and filling the orders; but we deliver packages at the railroad stations and express offices free of charge.

The articles in the following list will be furnished at the prices annexed with the following exceptions: Five hundred will be furnished at the thousand rate, and fifty at the hundred rate. On smaller quantities a discount of one-third from Retail Catalogue price will be made to the trade. The same discount will be made on any articles we may have for sale not published in this list. Dealers furnished at the lowest rates.

TERMS, Etc.—*Terms of payment must invariably be cash, or satisfactory note, payable at some bank for amount of invoice.* A remittance is expected to accompany orders from unknown correspondents, by draft or check on bank, payable to our order (or satisfactory references given), and may be made, where banks are not convenient, by Express or Post Office Order, and in either case at our risk. Make all remittances payable to the order of Monroe County Nurseries, Rochester.

It is with pleasure that we inform our patrons that all trains on the Auburn branch of the N. Y. Central Railroad, and part of the trains on the N. Y. Central Direct road, stop at Brighton, within forty rods of our office.
