SPANISH GRANO ONION SHIPMENTS TO THE UNITED STATES

Spanish grano onion shipments this season have been running far behind those for the corresponding period last season, total shipments from early in August to January 26, 1930 having amounted to the equivalent of only 582,000 bushels as compared with 962,000 bushels during the corresponding period in 1928-29, according to information caoled to the Poreign Service of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics by Consul Clement S. Edwards at Valencia. Valencia quotations c.i.f. New York on January 20 averaged 62 cents per crate. On January 10 prices averaged 72 cents per crate.

SPANISH GRANO ONION SHIPMENTS TO THE UNITED STATES

Arrivals of grano onions on the American market during the first week of February will amount to 11,227 half cases and 42,288 crates, according to a cable received in the Foreign Service of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics from Consul Clement S. Edwards at Valencia. These arrivals will bring the total for the season to date up to 627,000 bushels as compared with 995,000 bushels up to February 1 last season.

Estim to of the 1930 Egyptian onion crop

The 1930 commercial onion crop of Egypt will be about average. according to information received by cable from Mr. F. A. Motz, fruit specialist of the Department of Agriculture in Europe. The cultivation period is over and the state of growth is good. It is estimated that the exportable surplus will amount to about 3,E00.000 hags of 112 pounds each. The 1929 exportable surplus was retween 3.500,000 and 3,750,000 bags. The export movement usually begins about March 1.

Edwards at Valencia. These arrivals will bring the total for the season to date up to 682,000 bushels as compared with 1,021,000 bushels up to the end of February last season.

Total shipments of Egyptian chions to the /merican market from the beginning of March up to April 9 amounted to 16,813 bags of 112 pounds each, according to a cable received in the Foreign Service of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics from Consul H. Earle Russell at Alexandria. Shipments during the corresponding period last season amounted to 77,716 bags.
