The Secretary of State presents his compliments to His Excellency the Ambassador of Iran and has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the Embassy's note number 500 of May 2, 1949 under cover of which there was enclosed the application of Mr. Reza Shoraka, an Iranian national, for permission to enter Japan.

The application of Mr. Shoraka was referred to the appropriate military authorities and in reply the Department has received a communication stating that Mr. Shoraka may enter Japan between July 1 and August 1, 1949 for a stay of sixty days after his date of entry. He should carry two standard passport photographs.

The Department assumes that the Ministry of Foreign Affairs will be requested to place in the passport of Mr. Shoraka a statement to the effect that he has been cleared by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo for entry into Japan. The statement which should be placed in Mr. Shoraka's passport is required by paragraph III, 4.e. (1) of the Supreme Commander's Circular 3 of February 25, 1948,

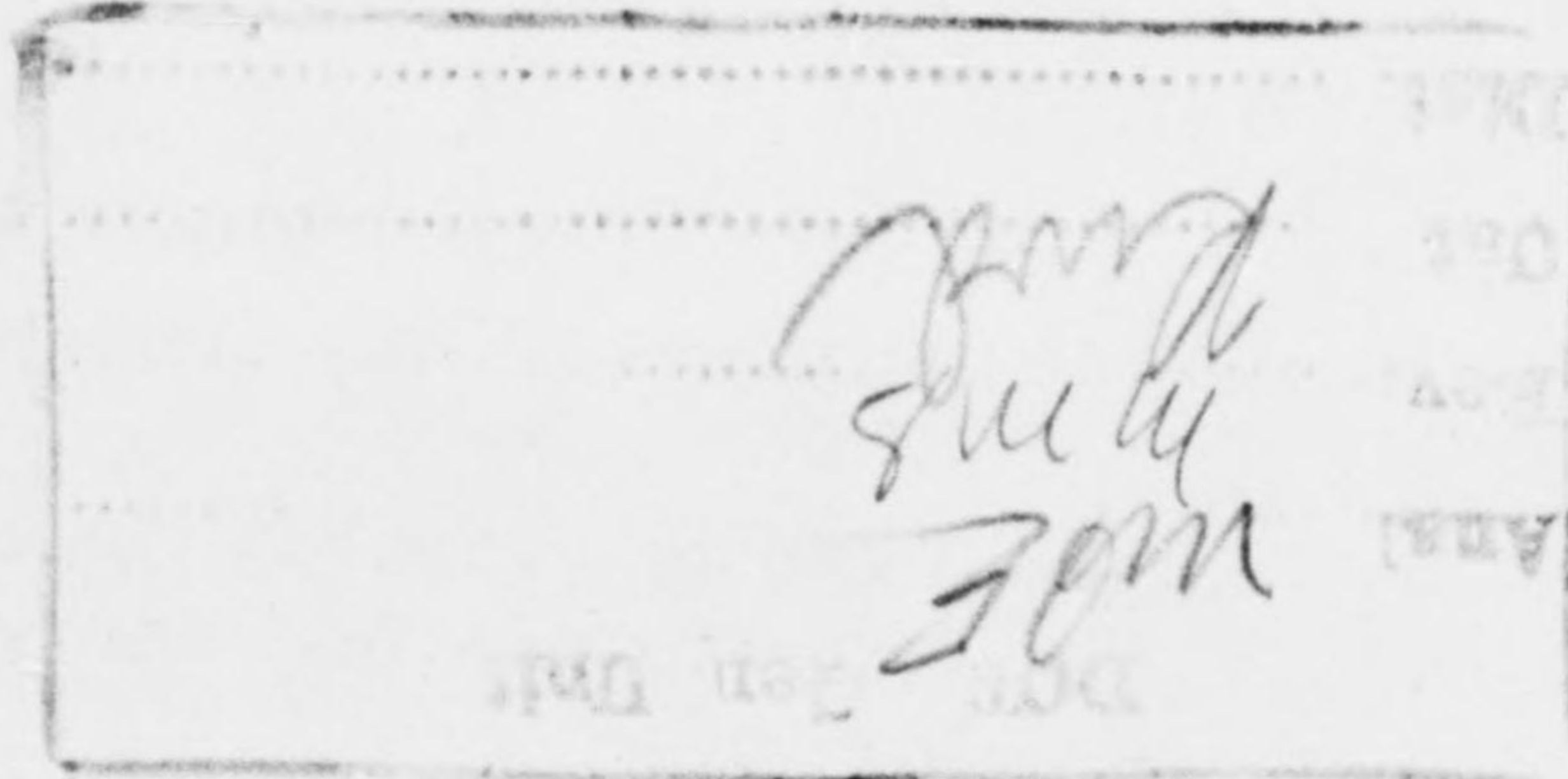

Chinese family, seven persons, propose proceed Japan by Butterfield Swire SS PAKHOI departing Tientsin about May 29; possess communication from Chinese mission in Japan dated January 11 and copy memo dated January 3, presumably originating SCAP, clearing them enter Japan. For travel documents however, they possess only permits leave area as issued by Peiping Military Affairs Control Commission "Chinese People's Liberation Army" dated May 17. Under existing circumstances usual passports of course, unobtainable without reference Canton with which point North China now lacks communication.

Travellers approached this Consulate which informed them it was without function respecting such travel. Local agent Butterfield Swire, however, has asked whether their travel documents would warrant his giving passage. Prima facie evidence is that their Japanese documents are in order but request instruction Department regarding their proceeding Japan without usual Chinese passports, bearing only aforementioned exit permits.

Travellers scheduled depart Peiping May 24. Shipping company would appreciate our early reply.

As of casual interest note their report some 25 Japanese repatriates are returning same vessel.

Reference is made to the letter of the Department of State dated February 4, 1949 and to your letter of March 2, 1949 regarding the granting of permission to your mother, Mrs. Anna N. Slenkina, to transit Japan en route from Dairen to the United States.

In this connection you are informed that the Department has received a communication dated May 18, 1949 from the Pacific Military Permit Branch, Department of the Army, conveying the information that Theater Headquarters, Tokyo, has granted transit clearance of Japan to Mrs. Slenkina. A cablegram to this effect is being despatched at your expense to the American Consul at Dairen.

In as much as the Consulate at Dairen has been authorized by the Department to issue a visa to your mother, it would appear that everything is in order for her departure from Dairen, in so far as the American authorities are concerned, as soon as transportation is available to Tokyo.

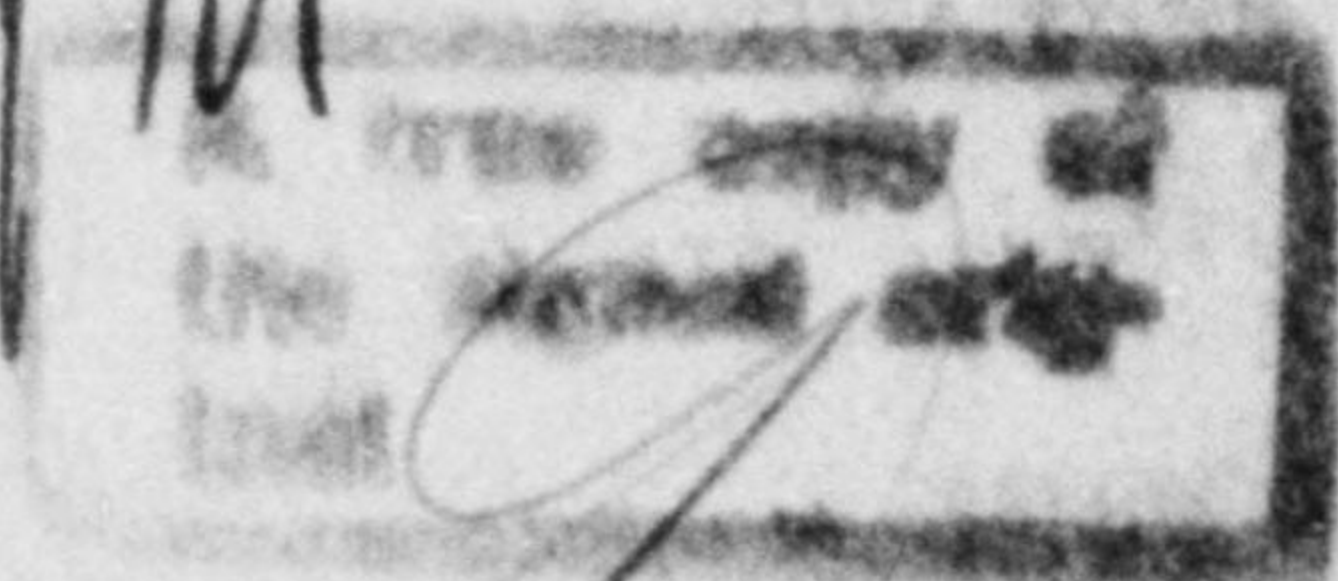

My dear Mr. May:

Reference is made to your letter of May 16, 1949 regarding the desire of Mr. Charles Okada to return to Japan for a short visit. The Department notes it is your understanding that Mr. Okada will be permitted to visit Japan because of his Japanese citizenship.

In this connection you are informed that in Japan's present occupied status Japanese citizenship does not automatically give a Japanese national the right to enter Japan except for the purpose of repatriation. Permanent residence in Japan thereafter is involved in such cases. However, there is now in effect a program authorizing individuals to enter Japan for a maximum stay of sixty days for the purpose of visiting relatives. This program is not administered by the Department of State. The application form for this category of travel may be obtained by applying to one of the commercial carriers authorized to operate in Japan. The Department understands that the following commercial carriers are processing such travel:

- American President Lines, Incorporated
- Pacific Far East Lines
- Northwest Air Lines
- Pan-American Airways

For your information there is enclosed a copy of an Army Department press release of February 10, 1949 on the subject of sixty-day visits with relatives in Japan, setting forth the conditions under which such travel is permitted.

When Mr. Okada was in Japan in 1939 the Japanese government issued him a passport to return to the United States.

I have written the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization concerning a reentry permit for Mr. Okada to enable him to return to the United States. This is written for the purpose of learning whether there is anything further to be done to enable Mr. Okada to enter Japan upon his visit.

It is my understanding that as he is a Japanese citizen he will be permitted to return to Japan and by virtue of his reentry will then return to the United States on the completion of his visit. However, I would appreciate having this understanding confirmed so as to prevent any difficulties arising in the future.

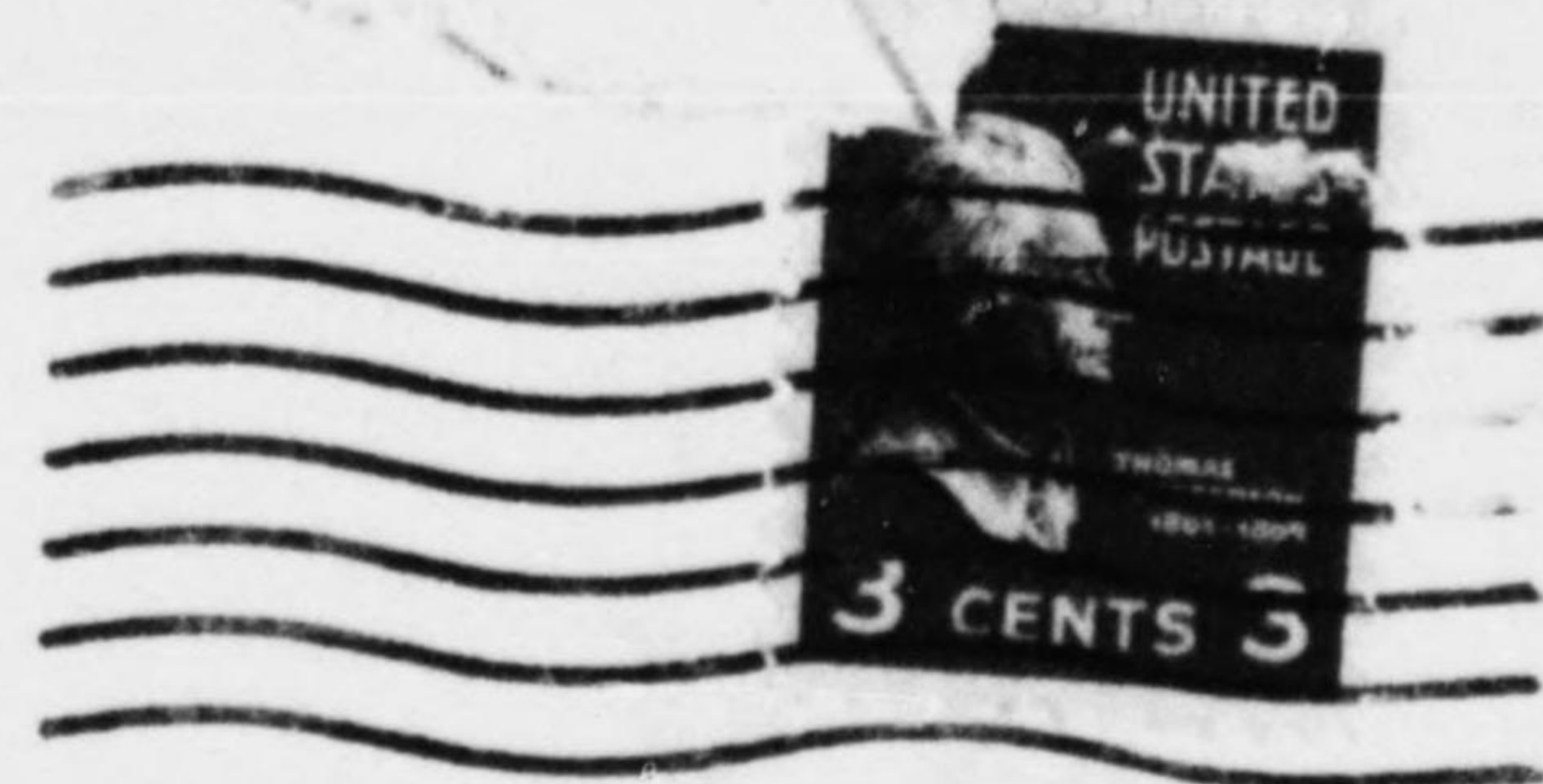

Please consider my application for a Military Permit to enter Japan. My background and the reasons for such an application is as follows.

For some ten years I was engaged in the import and export business in China, operating in Shanghai as the Textile Novelties, Inc. Due to the unrest and general business conditions we shifted most of our operations to the Hong Kong area, where I now have considerable merchandise and financial interests. Since I have been granted a visa for Hong Kong it is my purpose to go there and liquidate my interests and then proceed to Japan to make new connections and to set up substantial contracts to be used by me, when I return to the United States. I have decided to establish an import and export business in California with headquarters in San Francisco or in Los Angeles, hence it is very necessary that I make the best possible arrangements in Japan where I know we can obtain the type of merchandise we anticipate handling. For the present the Chinese trade will have to be forgotten.

I am an Austrian national and hold a passport valid until April 12th 1953. 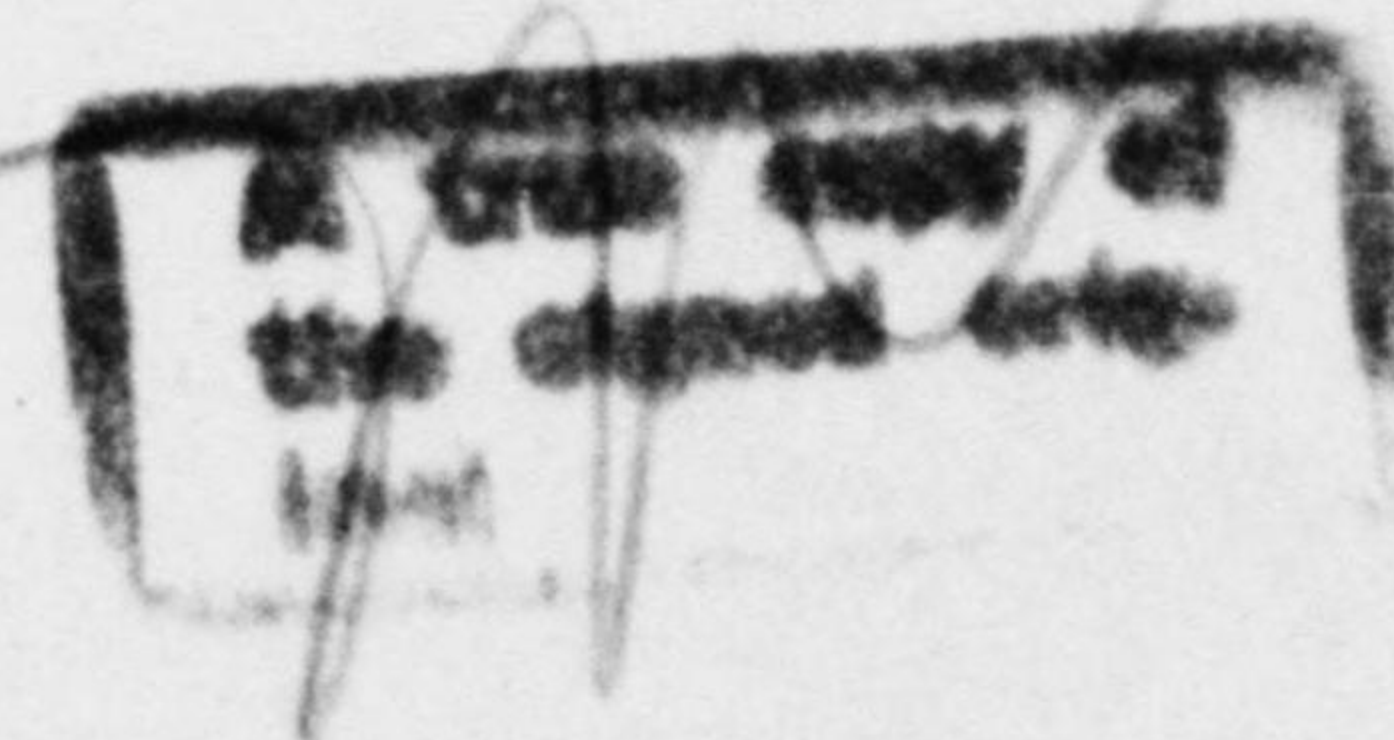

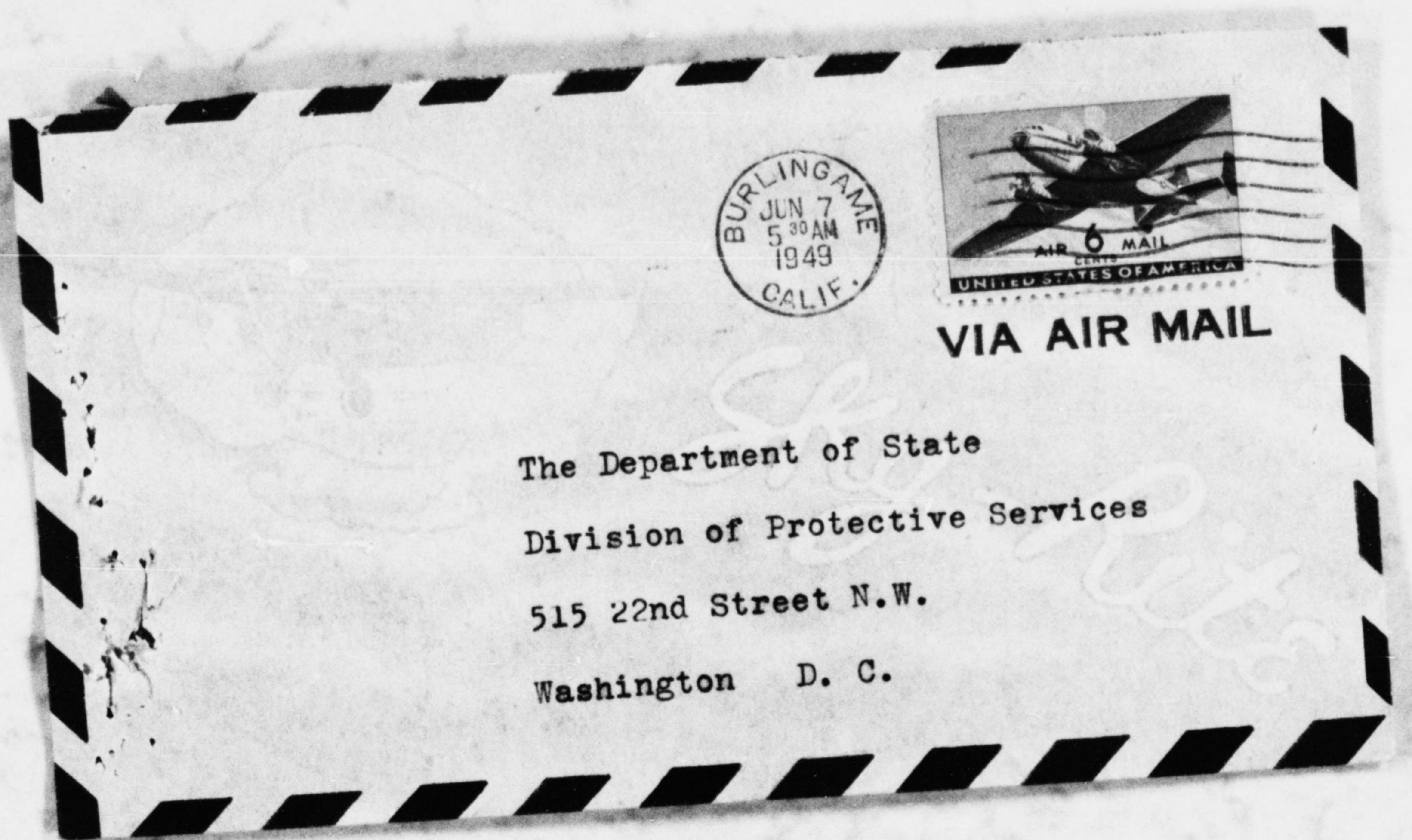

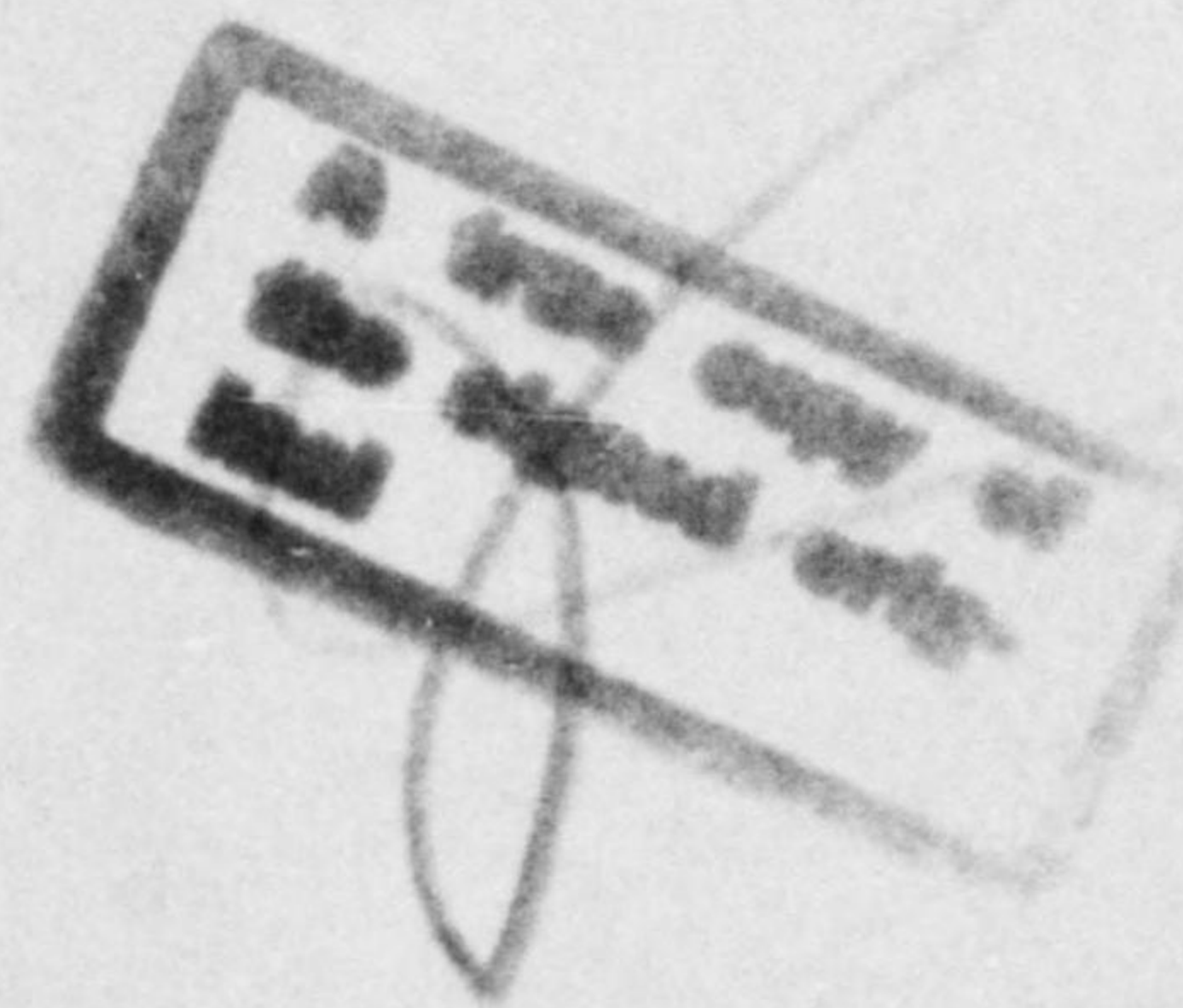

Mrs. Mellor (DS) called Mr. Illanes of the Chilean Embassy upon receipt of the Embassy's memorandum of June 7, 1949 requesting permission to enter Japan for Mr. James T. Fyfe, who is stated to be a high official of the Chilean Nitrate and Iodine Sales Corporation, and inquired if the Embassy could supply certain information in connection with Mr. Fyfe's application.

Mr. Illanes was somewhat indignant that the "Department" made it so difficult for a man of Mr. Fyfe's standing to enter Japan. Mrs. Mellor explained to Mr. Illanes that the Department of State did not grant permission to enter Japan; that such permission was granted only by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo; and that the Department was merely the agency which transmitted SCAP's decision. Mr. Illanes then further elaborated upon Mr. Fyfe's connection with the Government and stated a Japanese mission had been in Chile two months ago in connection with the matter upon which Mr. Fyfe desires to go to Japan.

Mrs. Mellor stated that she would submit the application to the Pacific Military Permit Branch, Department of the Army, for transmission to SCAP and she asked Mr. Illanes that if the information proved to be insufficient if the Embassy would send a note to the Department incorporating the supplemental information which he had given to her over the telephone. He said he would be glad to do so.

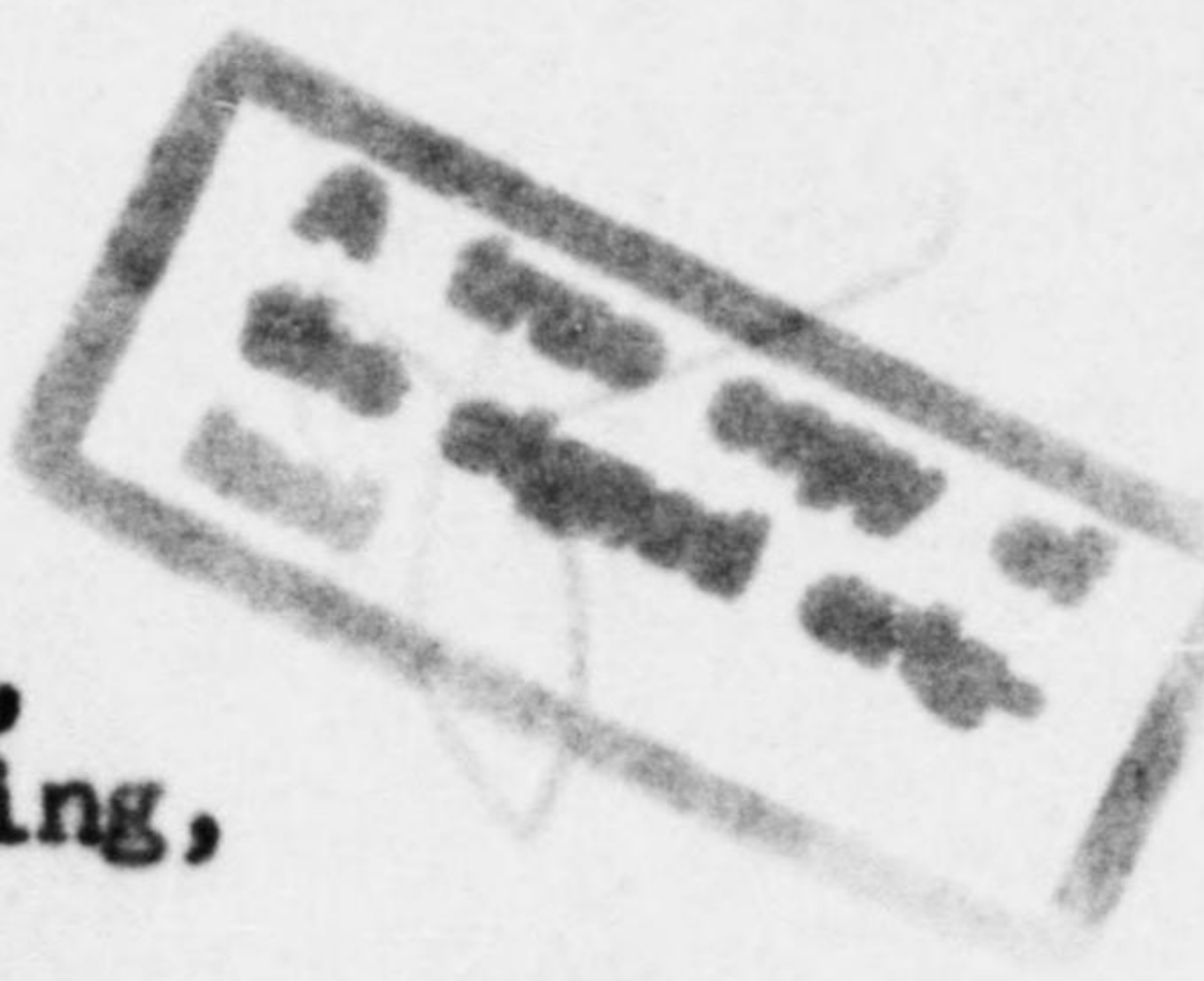

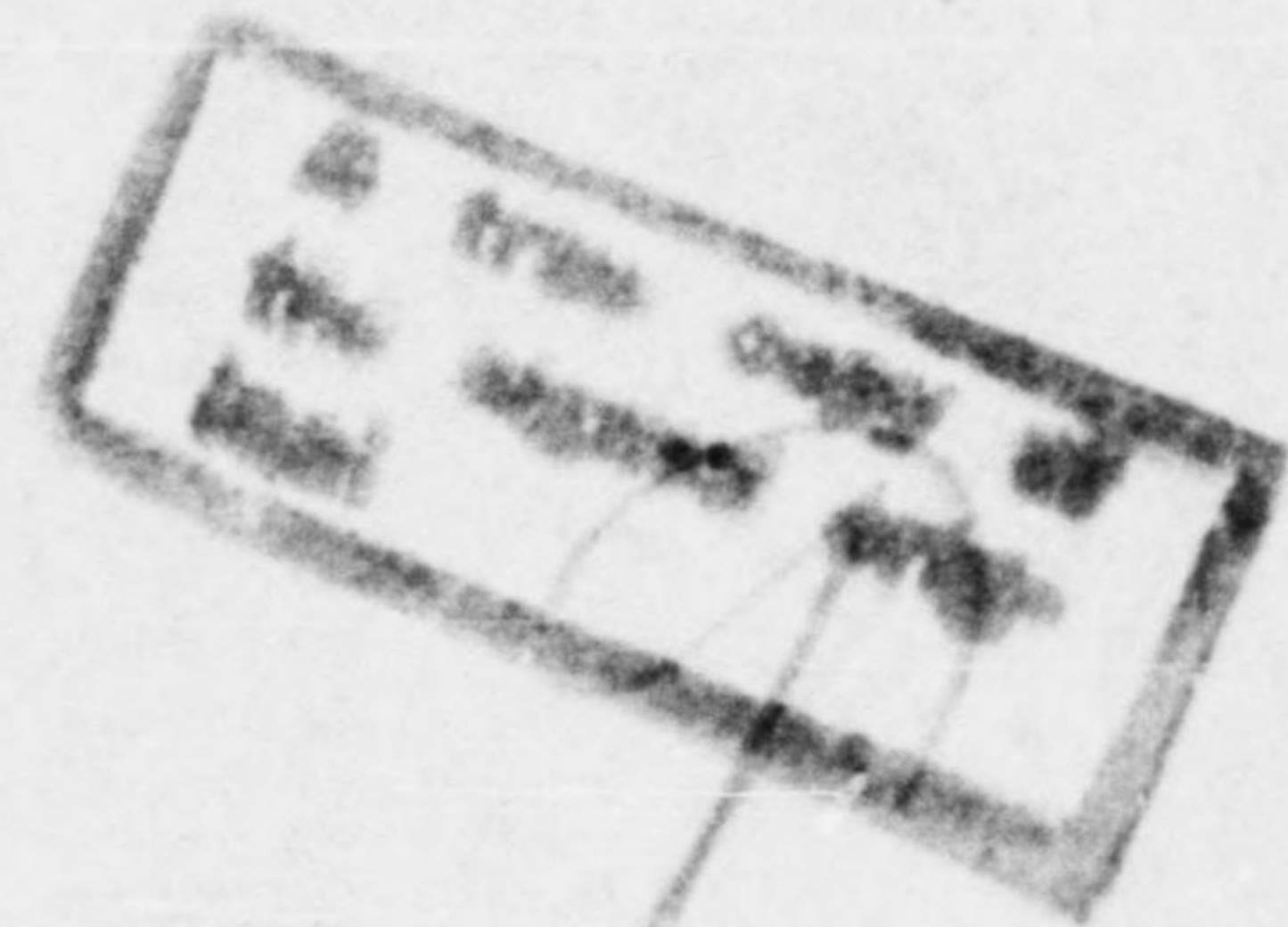

Pursuant to recent telephone conversation with Mrs. Mellor of your office, the following information is presented to you in the hope that you may take appropriate action:

My wife, Edith Ilse Cheney, German-born immigrant requires a visa from a United States consulate in order to enter the United States and become naturalized. She has been granted pre-examination by the United States Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization, and the petition of myself, her sponsor, for a visa for her has been approved.

Telephone conversation with Mr. John Murff, official of the Immigration and Naturalization Bureau, indicates that the Immigration and Naturalization Bureau would have no objection to her obtaining this visa from the American Consulate in Japan. However, in order to journey to Japan permission of the military government authorities is required for stateless persons, in which category my wife is regarded by them.
