ENTRANCE INTO KOREA OF CHINESE COMMUNIST FORCES

Chinese Communist Forces in Peoples Army uniforms entered Korea from ANTUNG (750-1950) on 5 and 6 August 1949 in three trips as follows:

1st Trip

Unknown strength left SINUIJU (750-1950) at 0300 hours 5 August 1949 going in the direction of PYONGYANG (880-1820) on 21 box cars and 2 passenger cars of a special train. Cars were loaded to maximum capacity.

2nd Trip

3rd Trip

Unknown number of unarmed troops with unidentified goods in kamani bags left SINUIJU at 0830 hours 6 August 1949 aboard 23 box cars, 3 of which were sealed, and proceeded through the YANGSI Line.

All three trains carried armed Peoples Army guards. When the trains neared stations, no civilian personnel was permitted near them.

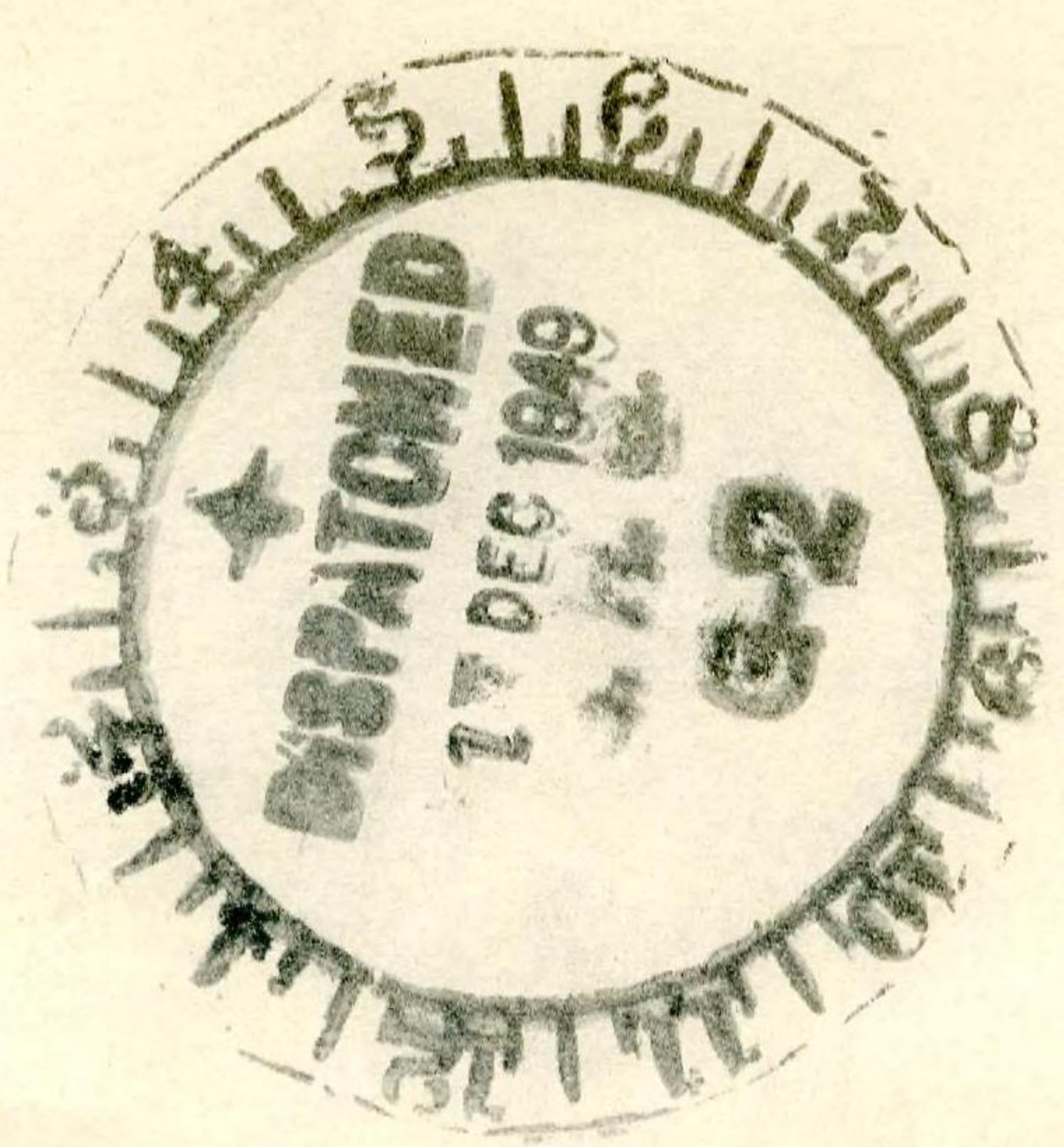


RETREATING INTO KOREA OF CHINESE COMMUNIST FORCES

Chinese Communist Forces in Peoples Army uniforms entered Korea from AMTUNG (750-1820) on 5 and 6 August 1949 in three trips as follows:

- 1st Trip
Unknown strength left SINUIJU (750-1820) at 0300 hours 5 August 1949 going in the direction of PYONGYANG (880-1820) on 21 box cars and 2 passenger cars of a special train. Cars were loaded to maximum capacity.
- 2nd Trip
Unknown strength left SINUIJU at 0400 hours 5 August on 19 box cars and 2 passenger cars of a special train and proceeded southward through the YANGSI (780-1940) line. (Line between SINUIJU and KANSIDONG.)
- 3rd Trip
Unknown number of unarmed troops with unidentified goods in kamati bags left SINUIJU at 0830 hours 6 August 1949 aboard 28 box cars, 3 of which were sealed, and proceeded through the YANGSI line. All three trains carried armed Peoples Army guards. When the trains neared stations, no civilian personnel was permitted near them.

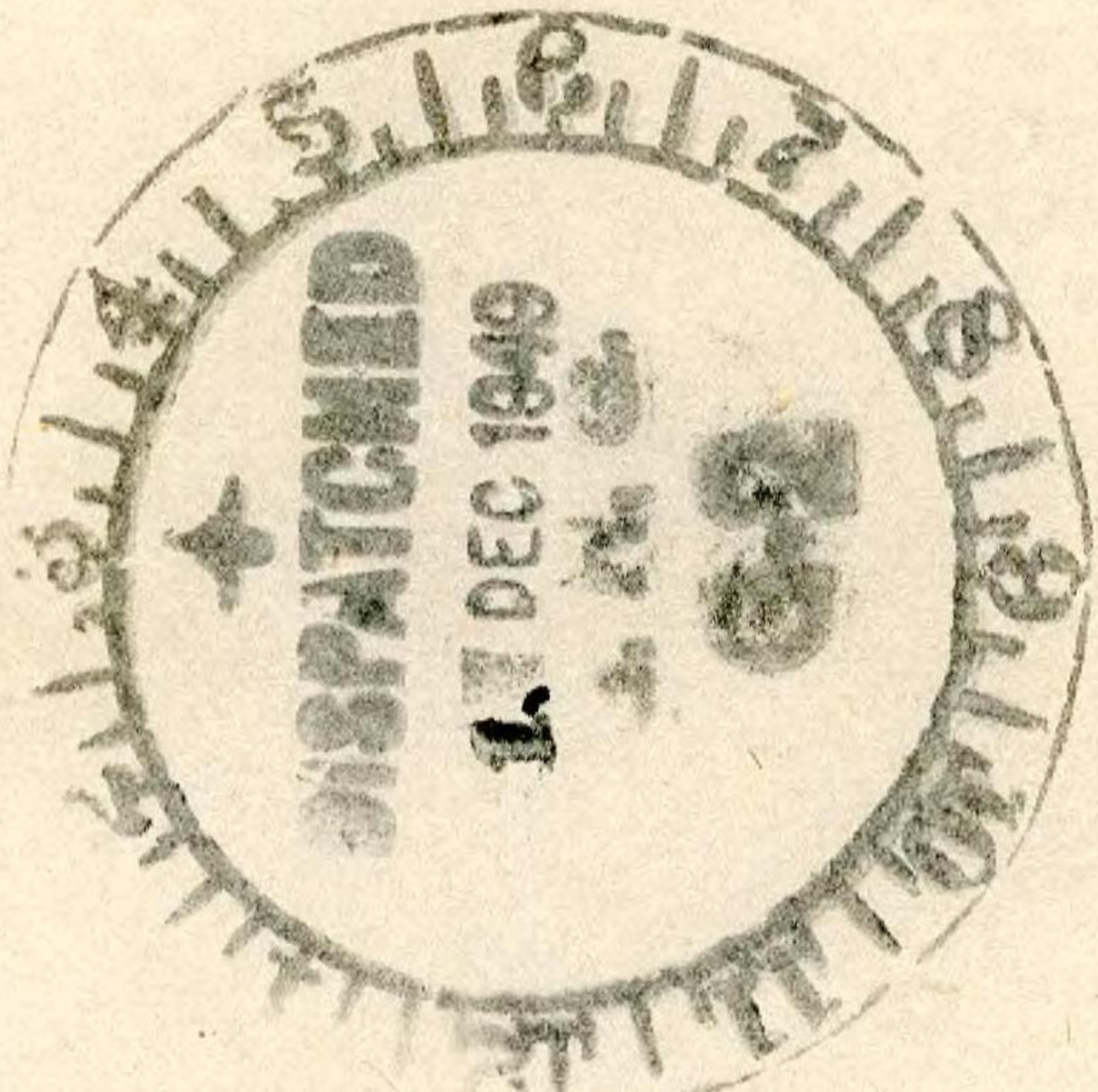



Training Institute for HWANGHAE DO HEADQUARTERS, Constabulary Guards, Department of Security, Ministry of Internal Affairs, North Korea. (Usually referred to as HWANGHAE DO MODEL TRAINING INSTITUTE).

Location

HWANGJU, 200 meters south of the HWANGJU RR Station in former Office and Warehouse buildings of the Industrial Union, Former Apples Inspection Office building, Former MARIAXI SHOTEN (store) building and the former warehouse and office of the TAKI Industries Co Ltd.

Chief - Major YOM (fnu) age 32, native of SARIWON (880-1750).
Chief of Staff - Sr Lt, name unknown
Chief Culture Section - Sr Lt, name unknown
Chief, Organization Section - Sr Lt, name unknown

In addition to the above mentioned personnel there are 4 Jr Lts, 9 M/Sgts and 47 S/Sgts and Sgts bringing the staff to 68.

Number of Trainees

1st Term (40 days from July 20 to August 30 1949 - approximately 1100, mostly from CHAKANG DO Province. Graduates moved in the direction of PYONGYANG (880-1820).
2nd Term (from September to present) approximately 700 trainees (400 from SONGHON GUN (920-1840) and 300 from TANCHON (1170-1990).

According to a statement made by an associate of informant on 20 September 1949, about 300 new trainees were scheduled to enter the institute in two or three days (from 20 September) but details were unobtainable.

Training

1st Term trainees were reported to have been trained with wooden guns for two hours morning and afternoon every day, undergoing basic military training, combat training, etc. Graduates of the 1st term were given Peoples Army uniforms and entered the Army in units at PYONGYANG. 2nd term trainees are training and studying at present and it is reported that the students train themselves for 2 hours in the morning and afternoon with M/N rifles and have for subjects in classrooms "History of the Party", Reading and Reporting Meetings, etc. It is further reported that the 2nd term will be 2 months. Disposition of the graduates is unknown at present.

Qualifications for Entry

Most of the trainees have been placed in the institute by compulsory means. The Democratic Youth authorities persuaded them to join the institute by false propaganda, stating that: "Democratic Youths should receive special lectures" but after enrollment the trainees are taught military subjects and training. Most are dissatisfied with the fabrication, many attempting to escape, and during the period 4 September 1949 to 19 September 1949 there were actually 13 escapes.

Clothing

Both 1st and 2nd term trainees furnished and wore their own clothing during the training period. Shoes worn by the trainees were mostly Korean straw sandals, some composition rubber and canvas, with a few going barefooted.

**INTERROGATION OF DESERTER FROM 7TH COMPANY, 3RD BATTALION,
3RD BORDER CONSTABULARY GUARD BRIGADE AT UNPASAN**

On 3 November 1949, HAN SONG YONG, age 23, native of PUKSEPORI, SINKOSAN MYON (sub county), ANBYON GUN (county), HANGYONG NAMDO (Province) (1040-1820) a deserter from the 7th Company, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Border Constabulary Guard Brigade (BC), was interrogated by this office.

After graduating from the SINKOSAN Primary School, HAN assisted his father in farming until 20 July 1947, when he voluntarily joined the Constabulary Guard (BO AN DAE) in the hope of becoming a member of the local Police Administration Station (NOTE: At this time, the term "BO AN DAE" was attributed to all law enforcement agencies, rather than its present limitation to the BC). HAN was given four (4) months of military training in his neighborhood and was determined physically unqualified for the Police Administration Station position he desired. Instead, he was sent to a Sanitation Platoon of the Medical Corps in WONSAN (1040-1830). HAN received one (1) month's training in Medical Aid. HAN was subsequently transferred from the BO AN DAE to the BC and assigned to a Signal Company in July 1949, with the 3rd Brigade at SARIWON (870-1750). HAN served as liaison between Headquarters 3rd Brigade and GHQ, Border Security PYONGYANG (880-1820), carrying messages back and forth, in the rank of Sr Sgt. HAN approximated the strength of the 3rd Brigade as two thousand (2,000) in July 1948. In February 1949, the 3rd Brigade Headquarters removed from SARIWON to TAETAN (837-1706), its present location. At the time of its removal, these members of the BC were told that a full division was to move to HAEJU (870-1700). The 3rd Brigade is charged with the security of the 38th parallel from the Yellow Sea (810-1700) to the HWANGHAE DO border (1000-1700). The 1st BC Brigade Headquarters is located at CHORWON (1010-1720) and its responsibility was unknown to source. However, the make-up of the 1st Brigade is identical to that of the 3rd Brigade. The 3rd Brigade, composed of three (3) Battalions has deployed its 3rd Infantry Battalion in the UNPASAN (853-1698) (Mountains) north of ONGJIN (820-1680). Because of constant attacks by South Korea, both the 6th and 2nd Infantry Battalions of the 3rd Brigade are situated in the KACHISAN (Mountains) 962-1695). South Korean Forces are presently occupying approximately three hundred (300) meters of the KACHISAN north of the 38th parallel. The 6th Infantry Battalion suffered severe casualties in encounters with South Korean Forces which reduced the strength by one-half. However, by means of local conscription, battalion strength has been brought back up to par - six hundred (600). The 3rd Battalion is composed of the 7th, 8th and 9th Companies whose APO's (unit designation) are "817," "157" and "149", respectively. These unit designations are very unstable, changing every time a man deserts. Fifteen (15) km north of the Brigade Headquarters lies HAEJU wherein are located unknown contingents of the Peoples Army (IN MIN GUN). These IN MIN GUN serve as support for any emergency which might arise from an attack from the South, and offer artillery cover for the BO AN DAE offensively as well as defensively. The deployment of BC Troops is in a constant state of flux dependent upon demand. Usual moves of troops is for a period of seven (7) to eight (8) days. The longest period of move of any group was fifteen (15) days during the last six (6) months. During night-fall, one man from each squad of the three (3) battalions is positioned on the parallel. The 3rd Battalion is commanded by Major CHO PAN KIL, age 28. The 2nd Battalion is commanded by Major TAK YON DO, age 35. The commander of the 6th Battalion is unknown to HAN. The finest soldiers of the Brigade are assigned to the 6th Battalion. Also attached to the 3rd Brigade are the following units:

45-mm Gun Co at UNPASAN, strength: 40, CO, Capt, 4 45-mm guns and 1 ZIS truck.
82-mm Mortar Co at UNPASAN, strength: 40, CO, Capt, 4 82-mm guns and 1 ZIS truck.
HQ Co at UNPASAN, strength: 40, CO, Capt, 4 HQCs and 1 ZIS truck.
Engineer Platoon at TAETAN, strength: 40, CO, Lt and 1 ZIS truck.
Signal Co at TAETAN, strength: 12, CO, Capt, 1 ZIS truck.
Transportation Platoon at TAETAN, strength: 18, CO, Lt and 1 truck.
(additional trucks are needed are available at Hqs.)
Band Platoon at TAETAN, strength: 30, CO, Lt and 1 ZIS truck.
Medical Co, at TAETAN, strength: 15, CO, Capt, and 1 ZIS truck.
PPSH Co at TAETAN, strength: 150, CO, Capt.
Mounted Unit at HAEJU (strength: 40, CO, Lt.) 40 horses.

The 3rd Brigade is equipped with approximately forty (40) trucks, Soviet made ZIS and five (5) jeeps. All EM are armed with M/M rifles; the NCO's with M1 sub-machine guns; and the officers with pistols. Furthermore, each soldier has two (2) hand grenades; each squad one (1) ING; and each company one (1) signal gun.

Each soldier is equipped with but one uniform, one overcoat, and one pair of shoes. Distribution of the overcoats has been completed. Shoes were distributed in June 1948 - black Soviet made shoes for everyone except officers who received red Korean boots.

Training consists of simulated combat, range firing, tactics, physical training, etc., held daily although recognizing no schedule. Fire practice is held twice a week regularly. Troops practice thirty-six (36) methods of handling rifles - defensively and offensively.

During all periods of rest or recreation, troops are imbued with communism through the medium of one propagandist for every four (4) troops. Mass anti South Korean demonstrations are led by one "motto squad."

Each company chooses the best troops within that company and makes up "an advance" platoon which leads all advances.

There are six (6) professional propagandists in each company who make up new propaganda posters every three (3) days.

Each company has one sanitation squad of four (4) men (medical aid).

There is Democratic Youth representative as well as a North Korea Labor Party representative in every platoon, company and battalion.

Although there are three (3) meals served a day, the elderly troops feel satisfied while the younger are still hungry after meals. The meals consist of mixed rice for the most part with meat served twice weekly. Apples are served from time to time, as is soup, "kimchee," and fruit dishes.

There are no buildings at any of the positions of the 3rd Brigade, and all movement is restricted to trenches unless on patrol. Very few troops sleep at night because of the increased guard.

Propaganda currently being promulgated to the troops is as follows:

1. Japanese soldiers are training and fighting with the South Korean Army.
2. Starvation is prevalent in South Korea as is poverty.
3. The US is exporting all rice and grains to the US and importing only toilet articles (?) to South Korea.
4. The South Korean Government has sold South Korea to the US in exchange for arms which they use against North Korea.
5. Civil war and strife are manifest in South Korea.
6. No invasion of South Korea will be necessary by North Korea since the South Korea Labor Party is uniting all the people and leading them.

Despite this propaganda and its frequency, the number of troops of the BC who desire to defect is large. However, it appears that where this propaganda has failed, a lesser note of propaganda depicting the mass executions of defectors from the North to South Korea, has made its impression and deters many. This is true to the younger and less educated troops, whereas the number of officers defects is comparatively

large and is causing no little speculation among these less educated troops. HAN, who was suspected of having anti-communistic thought for the past year, was invited to go with his former Company Commander when the latter defected three (3) months, but due to the Company Commander's leaving prematurely, HAN had to wait another opportunity. HAN persuaded four (4) others to accompany him in his defection. Upon entering South Korea, HAN and his colleagues were greeted by the South Korean Army, amongst whom was his former Company Commander.

INTERROGATOR'S NOTE: Source appeared anxious to divulge all known information, but was hampered by lack of education and assignment not involving troop disposition or personnel.



PLAN FOR RAILROAD BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION OVER TUMEN RIVER AND PLAN FOR
RAILROAD CONSTRUCTION BETWEEN HONGUI DONG (1310-2240) AND YONGHYON DONG (1320-2230)

Following the liberation of Korea in 1945, the Soviets mobilized the residents of KYONGHUNG GUN (county) HAMGYONG PUKTO during October to mid-November 1945 to expand the 6 km long road between HONGUI and YONGHYON NI and constructed a bridge over the TUMEN RIVER from YONGHYON DONG to WAPONG (1320-2240) (GYACHOGT in Russian) on the Soviet side. The Soviets are now establishing a railroad and a railroad bridge in the area for the purpose of connecting Korea by rail with the USSR.

The railroad is 6 km long located between HONGUI DONG RR Station and YONGHYON DONG.

The railroad bridge is located between YONGHYON DONG and WAPONG over the TUMEN River 200 meters southeast of the former bridge. It is usually referred to as the TUMEN'S YONGHYON Bridge.

The Soviets finished all necessary land surveying between HONGUI DONG and YONGHYON DONG, and all water depths and bottom of the TUMEN River and placed markers (poles) along the route in November 1948.

Work on the project has been going on since February 1949 with mobilized residents of HAMGYONG PUKTO. Pillars for the RR Bridge have been set and the work of laying rails is going on. Approximately 20 per cent of all the work has been completed.

The railroad bridge now under construction is ferro concrete, exact dimension unknown.

Thought Tendency

Laborers are sent to the various factories and mines, however, living conditions, etc., are entirely different from what they had been promised through North Korean propaganda. They are living in tents and dormitories even though they have relatives and families in North Korea, and are working like prisoners. They have now realized the true situation in North Korea and complain a great deal.

In MUSAN Forestry Business Office and other places, five or six workers were arrested merely because they spoke of their complaints.

Escapes

Due to the hard labor, poor food and other hardships, many of the conscripted laborers are escaping from their places of work, and up until the end of September the escapees numbered 21 per cent as follows:

Guards

Before 1 August 1949, guards were only guarding industries, but since that date guards have been posted at the laborers camps, dormitories, tents and residences to prevent the laborers escaping. Self protection units are guarding day and night.

Propaganda Platform

The output of North Korean mines and factories is increasing every day, and in order to set up a democratic state, in a limited time, strong and ample labor power must be maintained.

Laborers conscripted will be encamped in residences at the various mines and factories where they work. After the regular 8 hour work day they will be free to relax and enjoy easy life in their homes.

Daily necessities, such as clothing, special rations, etc., will be supplied to make life of laborers easier, for which the North Korean Government will be responsible.

Number of Laborers Conscripted

1st Conscription, from August 1948 to January 1949. Of the 4000 planned conscription, only 3,240 were conscripted.

Of the 3240 conscripted, 100 are Chinese stone cutters and these were sent to the KIM IL SUNG University in PYONGYANG.

Method of Conscription

Male Koreans, ages 20 to 50, who have families living in Manchuria, are the only

The old road between YONCHON and PYONGGANG, constructed during Japanese control, has many curves and the width is only about 2 meters, therefore not adequate for a big traffic in the troop concentration area.

In order to meet the possible requirements of increased transportation, a new highway, parallel to the old one has been recently constructed.

The ONTAE RI Bridge constructed during the Japanese Regime over the CHANGJIN GANG (River) which flows between CHONGONG NI (1000-1690) and PAEKHAK, 80 feet long, 20 feet wide and 20 feet high built of ferro concrete, has been repaired to be utilized for strategic purposes.

Location ONTAE RI, CHONGONG MYON sub county, YONCHON GUN county, 1km west of CHONGONG NI RR Station.

Date of Repair Early August 1949

Guards 30 guards on 1 day shifts are guarding this bridge from the CHONGONG NI Company (which moved to this location on 10 August 1949) of the Border Constabulary Guards at the former SONGDO Farm, 4 km east of ONTAE RI Bridge of SANNAE RI, CHONGONG MYON.

Purpose of Repair As that region is flat with no hills or valleys, this bridge offers an important cover for the Peoples Army.

Large stones have been placed close to pillars under the bridge and Peoples Army guards are guarding this bridge which is considered as better concealment than regular underground trenches.

It is reported that if the bridge would be bombed during a battle the stones underneath the bridge could be used as a substitute for the bridge.

Miscellaneous The labor was compulsory labor by the villagers of ONTAE RI.

3 guards armed with M/N rifles, PPSH sub machine guns, or sometimes "38" or "45" type rifles are guarding three guard posts near the barracks. Units of 50 or more are detailed to the perimeter every day at 0600 hours.

Soldiers are billeted in tents. There are 50 tents for the soldiers and 1 tent for horses. The tents for soldiers are 12 by 6 meters and the one for horses is 25 by 6 meters.
