Join us at the National Gallery of Art Library and help to improve and create Wikipedia articles about African American art and artists.

This Wikipedia Edit-a-thon accompanies the exhibition, In the Library: The Evans-Tibbs Archive of African American Art, which showcases the life and work of Thurlow Evans Tibbs Jr., an accomplished art appraiser, broker, collector, and dealer, as well as the founder and director of his eponymous art gallery in Washington, DC. Tibbs is best known for his donation to the Corcoran Gallery of Art, now an important part of the National Gallery's holdings by African American artists. To support his research, Tibbs amassed approximately more than a thousand reference files comprising more than seventy boxes of material documenting art of the African diaspora. Tibbs opened up his reference collection, now commonly known as the Evans-Tibbs Archive, to artists, students, and scholars. The archive



Wikis

- A website where anyone can edit any page at any time
- Meant to be "quick"
- Remembers all versions (nothing ever destroyed)
- Hyperlinks between pages

Wikipedia policies

- Neutral Point of View written so all sides can agree
- Notability significant independent sources -> importance
- Verifiability Using reliable sources to reference information
- No original research point to existing scholarship
- Assume good faith start with congenial spirit
- Conflicts of interest disclose and abide by terms of service





Edit w/ Visual Editor = What you see is what you get (mostly)


- 1. Locate article
- 2. Select 'Edit'

3. Unsure if you are in Visual Editor?
Select the Pencil (red arrow), select 'Visual editing'
4. Edit as you would in a word processor

Artwork

Thomas works in many mediums, including egg tempera painting, cut paper, and linocut and woodblock prints. In 2013, she had a solo show at Paper Hammer where she displayed 14 prints from two series, The Reading Room and The Book of Fishing. [4][8] Thomas has exhibited artwork at the Seattle Art Museum, The Tacoma Art Museum, The Whatcom Museum, and in museums and galleries throughout the US.[1]


The Judkins Park light rail station, located adjacent to the Northwest African American Museum, will feature artwork from Thomas as part of Sound Transit's public art program.^[9]







Create A New Article: Three Ways to Get Started

- Use your Sandbox for practice
 - Start a 'Draft'
 - Start a Mainspace article

Use your Sandbox

- 1. Select Sandbox
- 2. Select Edit or Edit Source
- 3. Create article or section
 - 4. Create 'Draft' article
- 5. Copy/Paste Sandbox content into the draft article

Start a Draft Article

- 1. Use the Article Wizard (Wikipedia: Article Wizard) or enter 'Draft: Article Title' into the WP search bar and select red link to start
 - 2. Start the article
 - 3. Publish in draft form



Start a Wikipedia Mainspace Article

- 1. Enter 'Article Title' into the WP search bar to confirm that it doesn't already exist
 - 2. Select red link to start
 - 3. Start the article
 - 4. Review to ensure the article is ready to publish (quality sources, link to other articles, etc.)
 - 5. Publish






