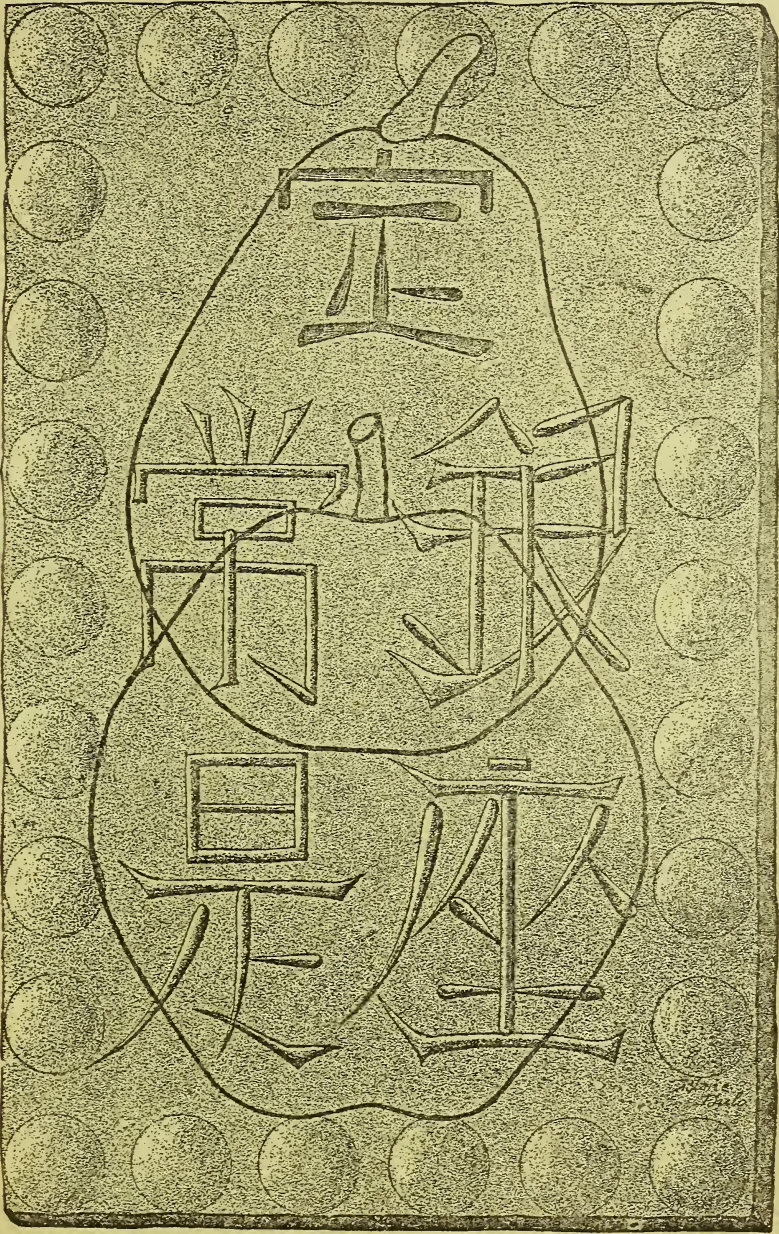

Registration of Plants.

The proposition of establishing a bureau for the registration of plants in connection with the Division of Pomology was recently brought before the Association of American Agricultural Colleges and Experiment Stations by Prof. L. C. Corbett, of the West Virginia University. After a careful consideration of the matter, the section appointed the following committee to consider the projected scheme and to report upon its feasibility, and if thought advisable to suggest the outlines of a plan to be presented to Congress. This committee consists of the following gentlemen: L. C. Corbett, Morgantown, W. Va., Chairman; W. A. Taylor, Pomologist of the United States Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.; Prof. L. H. Bailey, Ithaca, N. Y.; F. S. Earle, Auburn, Ala., and C. H. Shinn, Berkeley, Cal.

The suggestion is made that some central point in the United States be selected as the site for a great museum of plants, and that all plants placed upon the market may be officially registered, numbered and a description and specimens of the bloom, seed, foliage and fruit placed on

record. In every instance where plants are forwarded for registration it is proposed that specimens of the bloom, foliage, fruit, root, tuber or seed shall accompany the application for registration. The "Southern Farmer," in discussing the subject, gives the following as the ends to be sought:

"1. To discourage the duplication of names and the renaming of old sorts for commercial purposes.

"2. To form a national herbarium of economic plants, which shall be made up largely from type specimens.

"3. To simplify the matter of nomenclature.

"4. To aid the student of varieties as well as of variation of plants under culture.

"5. To secure the originator of a truly valuable variety some reward for his labor, the same as is now accorded the inventor.

"The incorporation of such a clause (No. 5.) will, I am sure, secure the hearty co-operation of all plant breeders, nurserymen and seedsmen, and this co-operation we must have in order to advance the scientific ends sought.

"It is further proposed that this central bureau be made a part and parcel of the present Division of Pomology of the United States Department of Agriculture. A very valuable nucleus for the beginning of such work is had in the fruit models now in the museum of that department.

"Each person interested in this matter will kindly formulate his ideas on the subject and send to some member of the committee, who will put them in such form that a bill may be drafted at an early date and presented before Congress. The ideas in having the members of the committee so scattered is to get the needs of the several sections of the United States as well represented as practicable. It is hoped that each one interested will lend hearty co-operation in the matter."

There is no doubt of a possible good in this proposal to establish a system of plant registry as a means of discouraging unprincipled nurserymen and seed men who may have the habit of exploiting old varieties of fruits and vegetables under new names, and thus deceiving the public and inducing them to pay high prices for plants or seeds that can be bought elsewhere for a great deal less.—Texas Farm and Ranch.

They were grown from root-grafts, transplanted at one year old, cut back to the ground and one shoot allowed to grow. They have the appearance of two-year buds, and are very fine roots and tops.

In this issue of our price list we show the numbers, sizes and prices in all varieties remaining unsold to date. Correspondents should, however, give us the privilege of substituting varieties, sizes and prices, as far as it can be allowed, if in a hurry for shipment, as we do not substitute as a rule, without permission.

DISTRIBUTING POINTS.—We are making St. Louis, Mo., Rochester, N. Y., and Philadelphia, Pa., distributing points; and will deliver free of freight charges to transfer companies, at either of these places, all orders in car lots, or in less than car lots, to be shipped from Huntsville early in Spring and placed in cold storage, so that customers can get their trees early and at a day's notice when shipment is desired.

Orders should be sent in as early as possible to insure a good assortment, as our surplus is less than usual.

CUT PRICES AND COMPLIMENTARY PRICES.—We will not cut prices nor sell anything at "complimentary prices," as we have done heretofore in closing out at St. Louis.

We have orders from three New Jersey customers who have planted our Kieffers on "own roots" several years since, saying they found them superior as orchard trees to Kieffers received from other nurseries. The three orders aggregate 3500. We have a few thousand more of these trees to sell.

We have a good supply of Apple Seedlings now ready for shipment at Huntsville. We will make low prices for shipment either from Huntsville, Shenandoah, Iowa, or Wymore, Nebraska.

We have a few thousand Japan Pear seedlings for sale. No. 1, 3-16 to 1/4, very fine for grafting, at \$10.00 per 1000.

Terms and Conditions Governing Quotations in the Price List of the Huntsville Wholesale Nurseries.

RATES.—As we send this list to the trade only, we make the difference in prices between the 10, 100 and 1000 rates very slight—simply sufficient, as a rule, to cover the difference in the expense of handling in the smaller numbers. We uniformly tie in bunches of 10, when consistent with the order, and we suggest to our customers to make their orders for varieties in multiples of 10 as far as practicable. Orders for 50 and not over 300 trees, if for not less than 10 of a variety, will be charged at the rate per hundred. Orders requiring 300 trees or more, and not less than 10 of a variety, will be filled at the lowest quoted prices. Orders for less than 10 trees of one variety, will be charged at the rate per ten.

SEASON.—Our packing and shipping season begins by the 20th of September, and continues until about the first of March.

We have great advantages to offer here in early shipments for the North in Spring. We do not accept orders for trees we do not grow, as we never buy trees to sell again. You can depend upon us for fresh dug trees. Each order is taken up separately, and not until it is wanted for shipment.

SHIPPING DIRECTIONS.—We respectfully beg our patrons to furnish us with explicit directions as to shipping, and the mode of conveyance by which they desire trees forwarded. When no particular directions are given, we forward according to the best of our judgment. *But in no case do we assume any responsibility as to safe delivery and condition of Trees and Plants after a proper shipment by us.*

RELEASE.—When prepayment of freight is not required, we will Release and Guarantee, and take forwarder's receipt and mail to consignee. It is left to the option of the shipper of trees over some railroads, whether he will release them or not under the clause "Value less than \$5.00 per 100 lbs." If released under this clause, the freight is less on roads governed by this classification, and we will assume it to be proper to make this release, without reference to the value of the trees, unless instructed to the contrary. This clause does not apply upon roads under some of the district classifications, and because of this confusion we will not be held responsible for any oversight to release, unless instructed by our customers. Claims for delay or loss must be made to the forwarders.

PACKAGES.—The cost of package must be added to the prices quoted in this list, as follows: Boxes 30 inches square, from 7½ to 9 feet long, as the trees may require, each \$2.50; boxes 24 inches, \$2.00; boxes 18 inches, \$1.50; bales from 25c. to 75c. each.

PACKING.—Goods will be packed in moss, and especial care taken to insure their arrival in the best condition.

ASSORTMENTS.—We do not require customers to take an assortment they do not wish, but will sell one variety alone if desired. If any substitution can be allowed, either in grade or variety, it should be so stated when making the order. As a rule we do not substitute without permission.

CAUTION.—We accept all orders upon the condition that they shall be void, should any injury befall the trees from frost, hail, storm, fire, or other causes over which we have no control.

TERMS.—Cash. When desired, we will allow 30 to 60 days from date of shipment, to responsible

prompt-paying customers. Parties with whom we have had no business transactions, will save time by sending reference, with order. We wish it expressly understood that payment is expected from the first collections made, and the time named is only intended as so many days of grace in which to make returns. To northern customers, who wish to lay in stock for Spring trade, we will ship late in Fall or early in Spring, and allow time for payment till May 15th. If shipment is required in the Fall for Spring use, a note is to be given upon receipt of the trees. We do not allow any discount for cash, but we make our prices low to command cash, or prompt returns. In orders when the time is not mentioned, 30 days is to be understood. Interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum must be paid on over due accounts. Should prices be changed, either higher or lower, during the season, the prices ruling at the time the order is made, are expected to stand.

FORMS OF PAYMENT.—All bills are payable at the office of the seller, and remittances should be made by drafts on New York, Chicago or St. Louis, or by money orders on some Express Company, or by postal orders. We will, however, accept checks from those of our customers who may be located at places having no banking, express or postal facilities, provided they make them in every case payable "with exchange", or add ¼ of one cent, to the amount of the bill for the cost of collection.

GRADES.—We grade very carefully, in some cases by caliper, in others by height. When graded by both caliper and height, the caliper must govern, as the height then named is only to be considered approximately. When graded by height or caliper, we include the lower number and exclude the higher. Instance: in a grade of 4 to 5 feet trees, the 4 feet trees are included, but not the 5 feet trees. If 5 feet trees are wanted, the 5 to 6 feet grade must be ordered.

GUARANTEE OF GENUINENESS.—While we exercise the greatest diligence and care to have all our Trees, etc., true to label, and hold ourselves in readiness, on proper proof, to replace all trees, etc., that may prove untrue to label, free of charge, or refund the amount paid, it is mutually understood and agreed to, between the purchaser and ourselves, that our guarantee of genuineness shall in no case make us liable for any sum greater than that originally received for said trees, etc., that shall prove untrue.

ACCEPTANCE.—Notice should be sent us by telegraph, at our expense, if there is any cause of complaint, or should the trees be refused, stating reasons. Claims for deduction from whatever cause, will receive consideration only when made promptly upon the receipt of the trees. If trees show any signs of shrivelling upon arrival, they can usually be restored by being thoroughly watered and buried entirely under the ground for two or three days. Should there be any frost in the trees upon arrival, they should not be removed from the box until the frost is all out. The box should be placed in the cellar or protected in some other way. The presence of frost in the boxes is not to be considered an evidence of bad condition, as we pack to secure the trees against damage, if the frost is allowed to come out in the natural way. Goods will be considered accepted if removed from the boxes in which they are packed, without notice of complaint to us and without our orders for their disposition.
