## ECLIPSES FOR 1865.

There will be Four Eclipses this year, as follows :

I. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, April 10th, in the Evening, and ending early in the Morning of the 11th, visible. Size only  $2\frac{1}{3}$  digits, or about one-fifth of the Moon's diameter. It begins at New York at 10h. 49 m., and ends at 35 minutes past 12 (midnight).

II. A Total Eclipse of the Sun, April 25th, invisible in North America.

III. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, October 4th, in the Evening; visible. Size,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  digits, or about one-third of the Moon's diameter. East of the Mississippi River, the Moon will rise with the Eclipse upon it, and in California the Eclipse will be invisible. At New York the Eclipse begins at 5h. 44m, and ends at 6h. 45m.

IV. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Oct. 19, in the morning, visible throughout North America, but mostly as a partial Eclipse. It begins at New York at 8h. 55m. and ends at 12 minutes past 12 (noon); size  $7\frac{1}{2}$  digits, or about two-thirds. For other places the time and size vary much.
