1. Reference is made to letter to Commanding General, Eighth Army, file AG 386.7 (9 Oct 47)CPC/CD, 9 October 1947, subject, "Procedure for Release from Custody at Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, and the Mint, Osaka," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
2. The physical custodians of the United States Vaults, Osaka Mint, Osaka, and Bank of Japan, Tokyo, are hereby authorized to release to the Japanese Government, against signed receipts, without specific authority or standard release authorization forms, as required by reference 1 above:
 - a. Property impounded as precious metals, and which is found by competent technical authority to contain no precious metals, or only traces of precious metals. Traces shall be defined as quantities which cannot be profitably separated.
 - b. Non-precious metal portions of articles from which the precious metals have been separated.
 - c. Books, records or other documents, including those relating to precious metals and gems, which are no longer of value.
 - d. Imitation, paste, and other settings and materials, usually used in jewelry or ornaments, found by competent technical authorities to have only small intrinsic values.
3. Currencies, pearls and stones, standardly recognized as precious gems shall not be released under procedure authorized by paragraph 2 above. Released items will include only those which have no history or

which bear no markings which would indicate other than Japanese ownership. Subsequent to releases, made as authorized by paragraph 2 above, a copy of the receipt received from the Japanese Government will be forwarded to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.

1. Attention invited to the inclosed communication from the Osaka Finance Office reporting loss of the shaft and pumping unit of a deep well pump, inventory number 32-32-5293, incurred in the course of dismantling and crating operations. Both items were allocated to the Phillipines by Allocation Notice 3-60 (pp 12 and 13, resp).

2. The shaft and pumping unit dropped to the bottom of the well in which the pump was installed while the contractor was attempting to remove it. The top of the shaft is 210 ft. below ground level. Repeated attempts to retrieve the shaft have been unsuccessful. The shaft can be retrieved, but the cost will be prohibitive and will be several times the value of the pump. The pump driving motor is intact and available. This headquarters has instructed the Osaka Finance Office to abandon efforts to retrieve the shaft pending further instructions.

3. The switchboard was damaged when the box in which it was crated dropped from a crane in the course of transportation. The marble switchboard plate was cracked in several places. It is beyond economical repair and is considered as scrap.

4. It is concluded from investigation that:

a. Dropping of the deep well pump shaft could have been avoided if the contractor had exercised better judgement in calculating risks involved in removing the shaft from the well, but is not attributed to actual negligence by the contractor.

b. The crate containing the switchboard was dropped due to a defective crane cable. The accident was beyond the control of the individuals moving the crate.

1. Upon completion of investigation of all documentary facts and contacting of persons who have knowledge of the alleged vandalism to the Winkler Building, the following facts and conclusion are submitted by the undersigned:

a. Major G. P. McElligott, Kobe Base S-4, was contacted in an effort to obtain additional information on which to base a thorough investigation.

b. Major McElligott was unable to furnish any information other than documents endorsed on down through channels from SCAP to C.O. Kobe Base, requesting an answer regarding the alleged vandalism by Army Personnel.

c. A reference listed in the indorsement by 8th Army, that a Board of Officers conducted an investigation on 22 June 1949, regarding the Winkler Building, was thoroughly checked with negative results. Lt. Olin Cook, AG Section, Kobe Base, and Capt. D. Crowe, Ass't. Adjutant, Hyogo M. G. Team, both stated, that there were no records indicating that a Board of Officers conducted an investigation regarding the alleged vandalism to the Winkler Building.

d. The Winkler Building is located outside the limits of East Camp on the South Side, and is approximately 102 yards from the nearest building inside the Camp.

e. The roving guard patrol checks the outside perimeter of East Camp during the hours of 0700 and 1800 daily, and passes directly in front of the Winkler Building frequently.

f. A walking Guard Post is located inside the Camp fence in front of the Winkler Building and manned during the hours of 1800 and 0600 daily.

g. Guards on the posts referred to in paragraphs e and f above would prevent acts of vandalism on or near their posts, if such were the case.

h. There is no definite proof that Military Personnel are responsible for the alledged vandalism to the Winckler Building.

i. The mere fact that the Winckler Building is close to East Camp does not constitute a justifiable complaint that Military Personnel are responsible for the alledged acts of vandalism.

2. In view of the above mentioned circumstances and lack of positive proof on the part of the complainant that Military Personnel are responsible for the alledged vandalism, the undersigned has arrived at the conclusion that, the Military Personnel of East Camp are in no way whatsoever, responsible for the acts of Vandalism committed on the Winckler Building.
