WHILE the French and British reparation notes have not been made public, it is understood that the two sets of views contrast as follows: FRANCE—Demands cessa-

tion of passive resistance in the Ruhr before negotiations are opened; insists on retention of French troops in the Ruhr until Germany pays; opposes the appointment of an international commission to determine what Germany must pay.

BRITISH — Suggests ap-

pointment of an international commission to fix the exact amount of German reparations and method of payments; favors more lenient policy towards Germany economically and the restoration of German industries.

Great Britain announced her intention to publish her reparations correspondence with France in hope of forcing worldwide pressure for a settlement. Premier Bald-win of England and Foreign Secretary Lord Curzon, speaking in Parliament, em-phasized the necessity for

Seeks United Action Over Ruhr Reparations Issue: **Situation Serious** 

BULLETIN

PARIS, Aug. 2.—Possibility that Premier Stanley Baldwin, of England, would announce a break with France on reparations ssue, led to exciting trading on the Bourse today. Francs fell to the lowest level in history, selling at 17.51 for one United States dollar.

Despite the gloom in financial

circles, political forces were opti-mistic that Baldwin would make an agreement with France.

ONDON, Aug. 2.—Official statements made in parliament today indicated that Great Britain will appeal to the world to force a settlement of the Ruhr reparations issue. It is possible this may prove the worst step towards independent British action. The allied negotiations are deadlocked and the British are seeking outside pressure to force France to show her hand. Premier Stanley Baldwin, in the House of Commons, made a statement on the reparations prob-lem, which did not reveal whether Great Britain intends to negotiate

separately with Germany, and avoided mentioning the possibility of a break with France. Seeks United Action The statement indicated Great Britain would wait world reaction on today's invitation before taking

the next step.

The statement declared the said that Great Britain will publish her reparations notes showing the world her endeavors to

bring about a settlement. Hope was expressed that this action might convince the world of the imperative necessity for prompt and united action."

Two Communications Great Britain had sent two communications to France, one a note, the other a "covering" or explanatory document. Premier Baldwin, in Commons, revealed that France had ignored the note. This note, the premier said, called upon Germany to stabilize the mark, balance the budget and submit to international cotrol by financial administration. advised Germany to withdraw all decreases organizing passive resistance, and to disavow sabotage in the Ruhr. France Makes Reply PARIS, Aug. 2.—The French foreign office, replying to that section of Premier Baldwin's address in the House of Commons today asking that the Franco-English correspondence on reparations be made public, late today, published a summary of the French reply to the recent British

The summary states first that cessation of passive resistance in the Ruhr must necessarily precede any negotiations between France and Germany.







Has Restful Night

"The president had a restful
night," said Dr. Sawyer, after he
and Dr. Joel T. Boone, had completed their preliminary examination of the patient between seven and eight o'clock this morning. Now that the president's tempera ture is normal, it has been the pulse and respiration that have een giving the doctors considerable concern as both have been abnormally high.

Over night, however there was in appreciable drop in both, and the physicians were much elated

Yesterday the president's pulse varied from 116 to 120, and this morning dropped down to 110. This morning's examination revealed the respiration is now down to 36. The physicians are convinced that satisfactory progress is being made and are apparently confident that the prog-

ress already attained will be maintained during the day. After the preliminary examination this morning, by Doctors Boone and Sawyer the medical staff gathered for the using morn-

ing consultation after which a medical bulletin will be issued.

There was every indication, even before Dr. Sawyer's announcement, that the president has passed a restful night. He slept the early part of the night, awoke early and called for Dr. Boone on duty in an adjoining room. Mr. Harding chatted with the physician and appeared to be in excellent spirits.

Sleep Aids Recovery The sleep has largely overcome the nervous exhaustion which Mr. Harding was suffering from to a marked degree when he arrived in San Francisco. The more he can sleep, the doctors said today, the more rapid will be his complete recovery. Offers of places other than the Palace hotel from the stage of his convalescence have received here the last few days. Prices of merchandise are ridiculously low in Germany. For \$125 Dr. Harrower was able to purchase enough cloth to make uniforms for about forty nurses at a hospital where he visited.
