Death of Two Pioneers. Capt Clarence M. Cox and Thos. Flewin Passed Away Yesterday. Heart Trouble Causes Demise of One of Victoria's Best Known Sealing Captains.

Yesterday morning at 7.15 one of the best known and most popular of Victoria's citizens breathed his last in the person of Capt. Clarence M. Cox. His death was caused from heart trouble, and the news of the demise, which spread like wild fire among his many friends...
