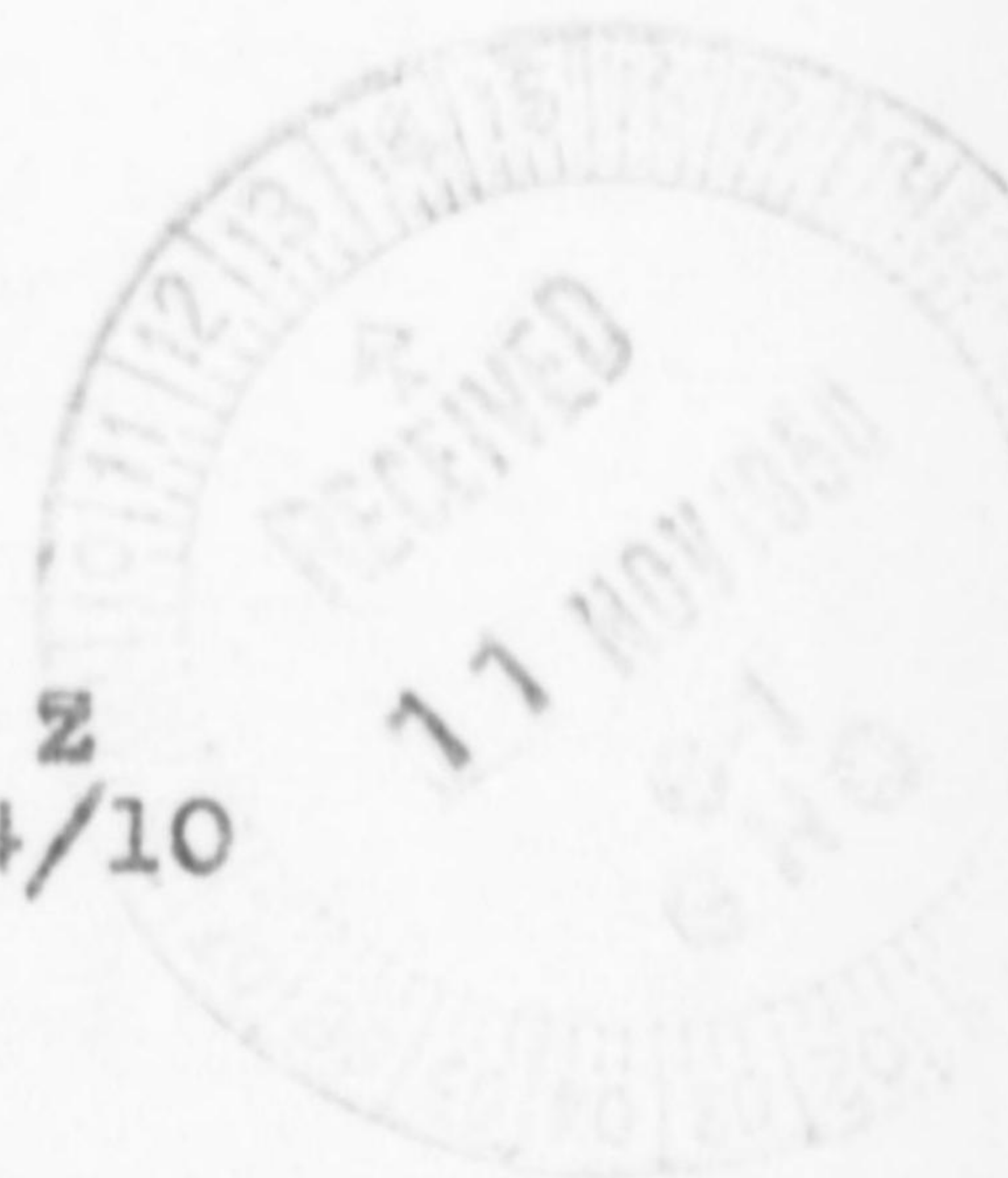

1. Reference is made to WCL 24105, dtg 032356Z Nov 50, which gives the current recruitment status of visiting experts for NRS and requests comments on several priorities.

2. It is recommended that Dept of Army be requested to take the following action:

a. Priority 15. Request recruitment of Hall or Malone in order. (Ltr referred to in WCL 24105 states extremely unlikely that Ralph W. Marquis, original nominee, can be made available at anytime during FY 51. Names of alternates have been furnished previously.)

b. Priority 16. Request early recruitment of Brashears.

c. Priority 17. Request Wilson be informed that Miss Mary L. Collings, Extension Staff USDA, now SCAP consultant on Home Economics Extension, will depart Japan about mid February leaving no Home Economist on staff. Highly desirable Wilson arrive early January for consultation with Collings. However, later arrival Wilson acceptable.

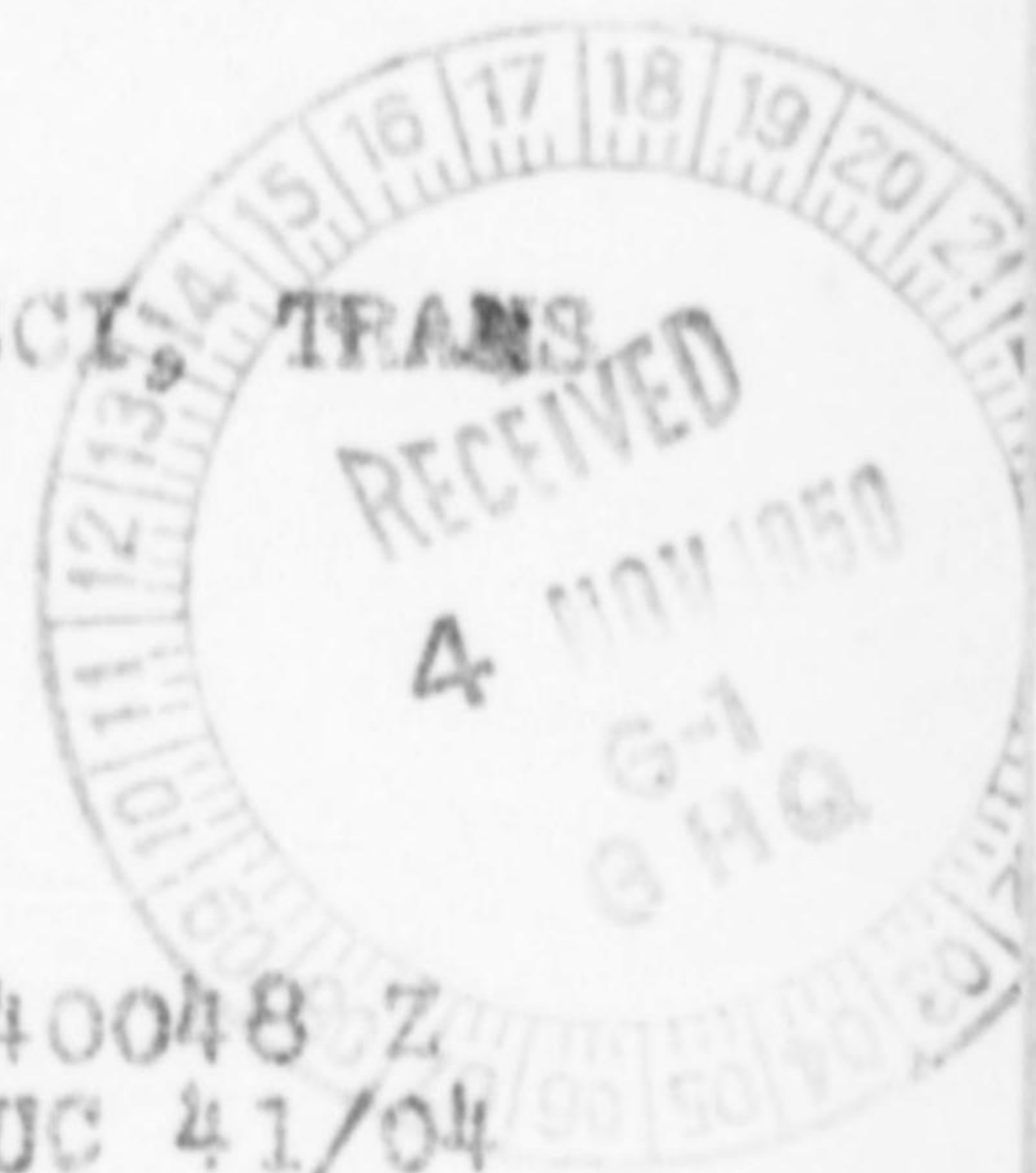

In the event present experimental work on lime is found to be deficient, make recommendation for such experiments on the major crops in Japan as will provide results on proper lime use capable of valid interpretation. Make spot checks to ascertain whether current farm practices are correlated with best information available on proper lime use. Evaluate to the extent feasible with current research, soil survey and other information available, opportunity for increasing agricultural production through proper use of lime. Fertilizer consumption in Japan is at a high level. On 15 million acres of cultivated land Japanese each year use approximately 2 million MT 20% Ammonium Sulfate, 1 1/2 million MT 16% Superphosphate and 300,000 MT 50% Potash. Lime use, principally as burned lime, now is at rate of about 600,000 MT per year. Soils generally are acid. 

2. Concerning reference 1a, recruitment has been underway to obtain a qualified individual for this project since February 1950. Five individuals have been recommended to Dept of Army by NR; none of these nominees has accepted the offer of employment and NR has no knowledge of additional qualified specialists who are available. Accordingly, it is recommended that priority 5 be changed to the following:

a. Soil Scientist (Agricultural Lime Specialist)

(1) Duties: Evaluate experimental work done by Japanese Government on use of lime, with a view toward determining validity of research results. In the event present experimental work on lime is found to be deficient, make recommendation for such experiments on the major crops in Japan as will provide results on proper lime use capable of valid interpretation. Make spot checks to ascertain whether current farm practices are correlated with best information available on proper lime use. Evaluate to the extent feasible with current research, soil survey and other information available, opportunity for increasing agricultural production through proper use of lime. Fertilizer consumption in Japan is at a high level. On 15 million acres of cultivated land Japanese each year use approximately 2 million MT 20% Ammonium Sulfate, 1 1/2 million MT 16% Superphosphate and three hundred thousand MT 50% Potash. Lime use, principally as burned lime, now is at rate of about 600,000 MT per year. Soils generally are acid. Preliminary observations are that increased use of lime appears to offer potential for significantly increasing agricultural production.
