X IMPERIAL DIET

A House of Peers

The House of Peers was formerly composed of 404 members, but was increased in March 1945 by the addition of seven members from Korea and 3 from Formosa. The house is composed of (a) male members of the Imperial Family of full age;# (b) Princes and Marquises of the age of 30 and upwards; (c) Counts, Viscounts, and Barons of the age of 30 and upwards who have been elected by the members of their respective orders, to the total number of 18 Counts, 66 Viscounts, and 66 Barons; (d) persons above the age of 30 who have been nominated members by the Emperor for meritorious services to the state, or for erudition, not to exceed 125 in number; (e) 4 members of the Imperial Academy of Sciences above the age of 30 who have been elected by the membership of that body; (f) one or two persons above the age of 30 who have been elected in Hokkaido and each prefecture from among and by the respective 100 or 200 male inhabitants thereof paying therein the highest amount of direct national taxes on land, trade, or industry, to the total number of 66. Term of membership for those in categories (c), (e), and (f) is seven years. The following have all been identified as members since the outbreak of war in December 1941.

XI . POLITICAL ORGANIZATIONS

A detailed history of recent Japanese domestic politics would be too lengthy, too complex, and probably too inaccurate for inclusion here. A brief summary of the background, however, may aid in understanding the situation.

In 1940 Premier Kenoye announced the abolishment of all established political parties; they were to be replaced by a single party known as the Imperial Rule Assistance Association (Taisei Yokusan Kai). It is interesting to note, however, that some identification with the earlier party organizations is still being maintained in the House of Peers, and certain cabinet appointments seem to indicate a certain regard for these older affiliations.

In anticipation of the general election held in April 1942, a committee of the IRAA was formed to assure the election of government-approved candidates in the Imperial Diet. Following the election, this committee was transformed into the Imperial Rule Assistance Political Association (Yokusan Taisei Seiji Kai). Purpose of this reorganization was to relieve the IRAA of its political functions and to utilize its widespread organization both to generate enthusiasm for the war, and to transform that enthusiasm into mass action suited to the needs of the government. To carry out this function, the IRAA had as its subsidiaries a Youth Corps, and a number of Patriotic Service Associations. Membership in these organizations was so widespread that virtually every Japanese home was represented therein. Also under the Administration of the IRAA was the East Asia Development Headquarters, whose purpose was to organize in a similar fashion the peoples of the occupied areas. Thus, the IRAA, instead of an organization for gauging and channelizing public opinion, was perverted to become an arm of the government.

In the meantime, the IRAPS, with a small membership, also failed to become a sounding board for public opinion, but was sued instead as an instrument for controlling the Imperial Diet.

In March 1945 this whole arrangement was scrapped. The IRAPS was abolished, and was replaced by the Dai Nippon Political Association. The IRAA was also abandoned, and its subsidiaries became National Army Volunteer Corps.

At the time of this transformation, it was stated that in contrast to the IRAPS, which was "primarily concerned with political activities

within the Imperial Diet," the new party "is purely an executive organization of the national defense movement." In contrast to the IRAPS being a central political party, the new party is to have numerous local branches and strong district organization.

Tokyo reported a speech made by General (Ret.) Jiro Minami, president of the newly formed party, as follows (3-31-45): "Minami stressed that the organization, which was formed for the purpose of contributing to winning the war, is not a 'yes' organ of the government. Minami added that the organization is completely outside the government. 'While the organization will cooperate with the fighting services, it does not mean it will be completely subject to their orders.....Representing the nation at large, there may be times when the organization will advise or urge reflection on the part of the government and fighting services,' Minami said."

It was later announced that more than 300 Diet members belonged to the new organization.

The principal members of the now defunct organizations are given here because some held important posts in the new organization, and because others may again assume importance in Japanese political affairs.

XIII JAPAN'S ECONOMY

A The Zaibatsu

The following is a list of the heads of the most powerful and most important commercial families in Japan. A large measure of the economic wealth of Japan is concentrated in their hands. It is emphasized, however, that these men are the titular heads of these families. Responsibility, authority, and matters of high policy, while theoretically resting with them, are in practice diffused through the family council and the business council. Some of these men are undoubtedly active in running the affairs of their family; others, because of age or lack of ability may be content to do the Japanese equivalent of clipping coupons.

To determine actual economic power at a level below this one is to enter a maze of financial interests that weave through all the major industries of Japan and involve overlapping directorships, holding companies, exchange stock ownership, and similar complexities.

No attempt is made here to define the individual sphere of interests, as they extend in some cases through every economic field of any conceivable importance. The group represented here is believed to contain most of the important family fortunes of Japan; however, there may be a few others who would be considered important enough, to make the team. The extent of government encroachment in the Zaibatsu sphere of influence is not known. Under the Tojo regime, a determined effort was made to bring all Japanese industry under government control, and there are indications that this trend has been continued.

"Zaibatsu," the term commonly used to identify these lords of Japan's economy, is roughly translated as "plutocrat" or "plutocracy."

E Banks

The Japanese policy towards banks, as outlined by radio Tokyo 4-16-44, is "to integrate the material and manpower strength of the banking institutions, eliminate unreasonable competition, standardize rules and regulations, and amalgamate the main administrative forces." In other words, the government wishes to utilize the minimum of manpower and facilities in the banking field, and to deal with a centrally controlled banking system rather than a number of competing units.

To implement this policy, the government has created government appointed control associations, brought many small banks under the direct control of the government-operated Bank of Japan, has forced numerous mergers among the large banks, and has attempted to eliminate competing branches of the large banks.

There is some evidence that the great financial houses of Japan have taken none too kindly to this policy, especially those whose banking adjuncts have been eliminated by merger, or curtailed by reduction of branches.

The following list comprises only the more powerful and important banks. (In March 1944 Radio Tokyo stated there were then 1,299 family name banks, i.e., Mitsubishi, Yasuda, Nomura, and 3,695 local banks.) Unless otherwise noted, the information concerning the officers is pre-war.
