Lieut. C. W. CLAMPITT in a PB4Y-1P aircraft of Fleet Air Photographic Squadron ONE took off from Agana Airfield, Guam, M. I. on 23 July 1945 at 0845 King to photograph enemy installations on Truk Island. He arrived over his target at 1235 King and took good vertical photographs of all the airfields and of Dublon seaplane base all from an altitude of 18,500 feet. Heavy meager and accurate antiaircraft fire was encountered over Dublon. The aircraft was shaken by the blast of the bursts, but no damage was sustained. There was no enemy fighter interception. Lieut. CLAMPITT returned to Agana at 1800 King.
