#### **MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2022-07**

# AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF AGNO AND CORRELATIVE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

Be it Ordained by the 11th Sangguniang Bayan of Agno, Pangasinan, in Regular Session assembled:

**SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.** This ordinance shall be known as the "Agno Traffic Ordinance of 2022."

**SECTION 2. SCOPE OF APPLICATION**. This ordinance shall be implemented on all roads, highways, streets, alleys, sidewalks, and bridges in the Municipality of Agno.

**SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY**. The Municipality of Agno hereby declares that it is its policy that the movement of people and commodities over the road network be as effective, safe, unhindered, and orderly as feasible for the municipality's economic and social vitality and viability;

**SECTION 4. EXEMPTIONS FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES.** The driver of any emergency vehicle may do any of the following when it is expedient and safe to do so:

- 1. with a sounding siren, bell, or repeater horn, drive in any direction or any part of a road or overtake or pass on either side of another vehicle;
- 2. stop, leave waiting, or park the vehicle at any place at any time; or
- 3. exceed the speed limits prescribed in Section 7 of this ordinance.

#### SECTION 5. DEFINITION OF TERMS. When used in this ordinance, the terms:

- 1. **Alcohol** refers to alcoholic beverages classified into beer, wine, and distilled spirits, the consumption of which produces intoxication.
- Chemical tests refer to breath, saliva, urine or blood tests to determine the blood alcohol concentration level and/or positive indication of dangerous drugs and similar substances in a person's body.
- 3. Dangerous drugs and other similar substances refer to drugs listed in the schedules annexed to the 1961 Single Convention on Narcotics Drugs, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, and in the schedules annexed to the 1971 Single Convention of Psychotropic Substances as enumerated in its attachment which is an integral part of Republic Act No. 9165, otherwise known as the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002" and those that the Board may reclassify, add to or remove from the list of dangerous drugs.
- 4. Driver shall mean every and any licensed operator of a motor vehicle.
- 5. **Driving under the influence of alcohol** refers to the act of operating a motor vehicle while the driver's blood alcohol concentration level has, after being subjected to chemical test by the Municipal Health Officer or his duly authorized representative, reached the level of intoxication, as established jointly by the Department of Health (DOH), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM), and the Department of Transportation and Communications (DOTC).
- 6. Driving under the influence of dangerous drugs and other similar substances refers to the act of operating a motor vehicle while the driver, after being subjected to a confirmatory test as mandated under Republic Act No. 9165, is found to be positive for use of any dangerous drug.
- 7. Foot Peg refers to a flat form attached to the motorcycles on which to stand or brace the feet.
- 8. Minor any person below eighteen years of age.
- 9. Motorcycle refers to any two-wheeled motor vehicle having one or two riding saddles.
- Motor Vehicle shall mean any vehicle propelled by any power other than muscular power.
- 11. Public Roads refer to roads designated by the national government or local government units as roads for public use such as, but not limited to, national highways, provincial roads, city, municipal, and barangay streets.
- 12. Public Utility Vehicles refer to motor vehicles for hire and used to carry or transport passengers or goods.
- 13. Rider refers to the driver of a motorcycle.
- 14. Seat belt device shall refer to any strap, webbing or similar device in the form of pelvic restraint or lap belt, upper torso restraint or shoulder strap or a combination thereof designed to secure a person in a motor vehicle in order to mitigate the results of any accidents.

**SECTION 7. SPEED LIMIT**. The rate of speed of any motor vehicle shall not exceed the following:

- On open country roads, with no "blind corners" not closely bordered by habitations: 80 km/hr for private vehicles and motorcycles; 50 km/hour for motor trucks, Public Utility Jeeps (PUJs), and buses, and 40 km/hour for tricycles.
- On "through streets" and highways, clear of traffic and no "blind corners" when so designated: 40 km/hour for private vehicles and motorcycles; 30 km/hour for motor trucks, PUJs, buses and tricycles.
- 3. On Municipal streets with light traffic when not designated "through street": 30 km/hour for private vehicles, motorcycles, motor trucks, PUJs, buses, and tricycles.
- 4. Through crowded street approaching intersection, at "blind corners", passing school zones, passing vehicle which is stationary, or for similar dangerous circumstances: 20 km/hour for all types of motor vehicles.

#### SECTION 8. TRAFFIC CITATION TICKETS.

- Any person apprehended for violating any provision (s) of this Ordinance shall be issued a
  Traffic Citation Ticket in the form prescribed for the purpose and to be issued by the
  apprehending officer of the Philippine National Police and/or any duly authorized
  personnel by the Municipal Mayor, with proper identification.
- 2. In the absence of the offending owner, operator, or driver, the apprehending officer shall place the Traffic Citation Ticket conspicuously on the vehicle.
- 3. The offender shall comply with the provisions of the Traffic Citation Ticket within the number of days prescribed therein.
- 4. Traffic Citation Tickets shall be issued to the erring vehicle driver, owner, or operator who will be cited for violation.

**SECTION 9. ENFORCEMENT OF TRAFFIC RULES.** The enforcement of rules and regulations related to the use of all streets, thoroughfares, alleys, bridges, sidewalks and other places intended for transportation and pedestrians shall be enforced by the Agno PNP and/or any duly authorized personnel by the Municipal Mayor, with proper identification.

**SECTION 10. PAYMENT AND COLLECTION OF FINES.** All fines as herein prescribed shall be paid to the Municipal Treasurer not later than five (5) working days after apprehension. Official Receipt shall be issued upon payment.

**SECTION 11. NO CONTEST PROVISION.** Any person who is cited for violation of any provision of this Ordinance who does not want to contest the violation and is willing to pay voluntarily the penalty imposed upon him/her prior to the filing of formal complaint shall be allowed to pay said fine with the Municipal Treasurer's office to avoid being prosecuted. Corresponding official receipt shall be issued upon payment.

The violator shall be given five (5) working days from issuance of the Citation Ticket within which to pay the fine/penalty, otherwise, a case shall be filed against the violator.

SECTION 12. LEGAL BASIS. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Section 447 (a) (5) (v) and (vi), Section 17 (a) (b) (2) (viii), Section 447 (3) and (4), of the Local Government Code of 1991.

SECTION 13. MINOR DRIVING. It shall be unlawful for owners of motor vehicles, motorcycles, tricycles, and other automobiles to let, allow, consent, permit or tolerate, or by negligence, cause any minor from driving within the territorial jurisdiction of Agno, Pangasinan. The registered owner of the automobile/motor vehicle shall be presumed the owner thereof for purposes of imposing the penalty or fine.

Suppose the registered owner of the automobile/motor vehicle being used by a minor is either untraceable or unable to appear at the Office of the apprehending officer, in that case, the minor's parents or guardian are accountable or liable to the offense due the minor being involved.

SECTION 14. TRAFFIC SIGNS, SIGNALS, AND ROAD MARKINGS. The Office of the Municipal Mayor is hereby authorized to install all traffic signs, signals and road markings intended to inform drivers and regulate the use of streets, alleys, bridges and sidewalks.

SECTION 15. MUNICIPAL TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT OFFICE. A Municipal Traffic Management Office shall be created through the enactment of a separate ordinance. The Office of the Municipal Mayor or his duly authorized Representative, with proper identification shall enforce traffic management in the Municipality pending the enactment of the appropriate ordinance.

**SECTION 16.** APPROPRIATION. The sum of **Ten Thousand (P10,000.00) Pesos** shall initially be allocated for the initial printing of the Traffic Citation Tickets, to be charged from the MOOE of the Mayor's Office. Thereafter the costs of the subsequent printings shall be charged to the accumulated collection of fines and penalties for traffic violations.

SECTION 17. RELATION TO NATIONAL LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS CLAUSE. This ordinance was carefully prepared so as not to conflict with any national law. Should there be such a conflict, the national laws, rules, and regulations shall prevail and the case shall be indorsed to the Department of Transportation/Land Transportation Office or the Philippine National Police who has the authority to handle the case.

No provision in this ordinance or any ordinance of this Municipality shall be construed to prohibit the DOTr-LTO or any National Government Agencies to come in the territory of Agno, Pangasinan to enforce a national laws, rules, and regulations.

**SECTION 18. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If any provision or part of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the constitutionality or validity of the other provisions or parts hereof.

**SECTION 19. REPEALING CLAUSE.** If any provision or part of any existing ordinance is not consistent with this Ordinance, the same is hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 20. EFFECTIVITY.** This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after three (3) consecutive weeks of publication in a newspaper of General circulation in the Province of Pangasinan.
