



1. Attention is invited to the inclosed copies of a study prepared by the G-2, Geographic Section of this Headquarters, "Military Geography of Southeastern Siberia." This study is a consolidation of Military Geographical data which has been obtained by our systematic interrogation of Repatriates, thorough research of Japanese General Staff documents, and brief extracts from Russian Sources.
2. In view of their possible importance, special stress is placed on airfield material. Note that this text contains data on over 200 airfields, not covered in JANIS 75, Chapter XII, Air Facilities.
3. A complete terrain study on this area is now in the process of production.
