SEN. MOYETIÈRE.—Deepest orange heavily bordered with bright lemon; an extremely profuse bloomer.

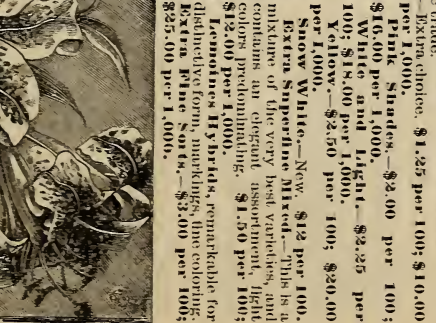
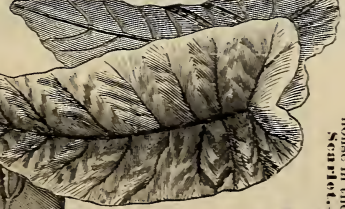
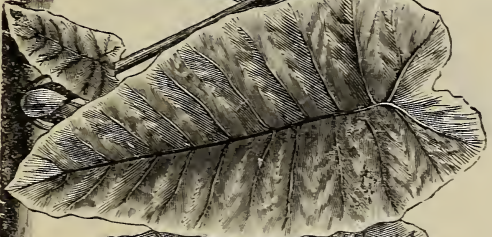
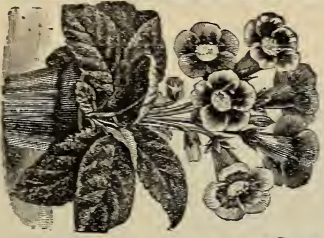

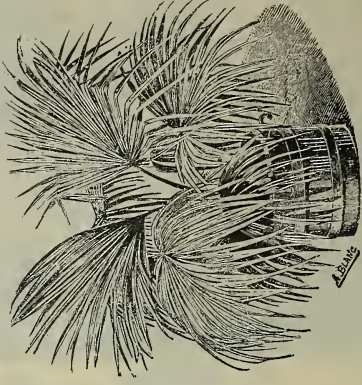
