PRESS AND PUBLIC OPINION

General

11. Universal interest was displayed by all elements of the press in the visit of the Commanding General, United States Army Forces in Korea to the United States, and the success of his mission.

Foreign News Reports

12. The entire press displayed great interest in foreign news reports concerning world affairs and their reflection on the problems of Korea and the Moscow Decision.

CHUNG GI SIN POK

13. editorialized on the return to Korea of Lieutenant General John R. Hodge; expressed its gratitude to him for his efforts to help Korea; and stated that, although material support is acceptable, it hoped that the aspiration of Koreans for a complete independence for the united Korea may be factual in the very near future.

LABOR

DAI DONG SIN MOON:

15. Editorialized on the labor movement in South Korea; and observed that it is evidencing all the indications of being rational and legal.

U.S. -- U.S.A.R. JOINT COMMISSION

MINJU ILBO:

16. reported that the leftists are willing to support the Moscow Decision and to see the realization of the agreement, whereas the Rightists are divided into two factions, one headed by Dr. KWON, Syngman, urging a general election and the establishment of an interim government, and two, the Chungking Provisional Government Elements who desire the establishment of the Provisional Government.

REF. SYDNEYHYUN DAI ILBO:

17. reporting on the mass meeting held on 27 April at Seoul Athletic Field welcoming Dr. RHEE, Syngman back to Korea published the substance of his address to the audience gathered as follows, i.e.

"We supported General Hodge's policy and cooperated with him but we failed because the Communists would not cooperate with us. Mr. Kim Koo, Dr. Kim Kiu Sic and I talked over the matter of coalition between the Rightists and Leftists but that also failed and I could not support General Hodge's policy any more. Then I had a talk with General Hodge and decided to go back to the States. I criticized General Hodge's policy while in the States, but the international situation changed to the extent of making the U. S. alter its policy toward Korea. Mr. Truman made the famous speech proposing aid to Greece and Turkey. Now the Koreans, with the aid of God, are going to have complete independence. From now on, whether Korea is going to have independence or not depends entirely on the efforts of the Koreans. Koreans must unite and work together. We must establish an independent government by the general election. The government that we are going to establish in South Korea is not a separate government, but a government for the united Korea. We must remember that. Right now we must stop talking about re-instating the Provisional Government. If we cannot carry out our own way then by that time we may put up our own provisional government and then launch a fight. As to the Coalition

Committee, it has already lost importance of its own and Dr. Kim himself agrees with this, and he would not be persistent in this matter. Whether the Joint Commission will hand out the independence that we want, or not, remains to be seen. Along with the Joint Commission meeting we must have our own preparation for Korean independence, through the means of the general election. I have no ambition - I only wish to see the complete independence for Korea. If it comes, even if I die on the following day I shall be satisfied."

This mass meeting passed the following resolutions:

- 1) the people must support the supreme leader, Dr. Khee's policy for Korean independence;
- 2) by the general election we must establish an interim government in South Korea as a prelude to the union of South and North;
- 3) The extreme minority elements should be overcome and led to the complete independence course.
- 4) we must reject the opportunists and opportunism;
- 5) let us immediately remove the 36th line.

KOREAN INDEPENDENCE PARTY

SEOUL SEIN MUN:

18. reported that the Korean Independence Party admits that Mr. KIM, Eoo and other members of the Chungking Government have resigned from the party, the explanation given being that the annual national convention meets in May and the officers would be changed at that time.

CHOSUN DEMOCRATIC PARTY

SEOUL LIAISON BO:

19. reported that the Chosun Democratic Party has alleged that, in conducting the general election in South Korea, the members of the Korean Interim Legislative Assembly should have in mind the presence of large numbers of persons from North Korea; and that provision should be made for them to have appropriate representation.

UNITED PEOPLEBAI DONG SIN MOON:

BO. reported that the Headquarters of the United People issued the following statement on 16 April:

"Our supreme leader, Dr. Rhee, went out to the international diplomatic stage and presented the Korean case to arouse international public opinion. At last it brought about the change of American policy toward Korea. He sent Ben Limb to England, while he visited Generalissimo Chiang Ki Shek in China. The Generalissimo promised that he would help Korea to obtain her independence and our leader, who is 80 years old, is very much encouraged by that. All the Koreans who have a conscience should be moved and touched by this old Korean patriot who has been pouring his heart and blood into the cause of our fatherland. It is very fortunate for our people to have a leader like this today, and his diplomatic success and his return to Korea mark a new epoch in our independence movement. The Doctor will tell us clearly the way for independence. Thirty million people must welcome Dr. Rhee, the great supreme leader, with one heart and we must pledge ourselves to proceed along the course indicated by Dr. Rhee."

LABORING PEOPLE'S PARTY

DAI DONG SIK MOON:

21. reported that, on 14 April, the Central Executive Committee of the Laboring People's Party met and elected LYUH, Woon Heung as its chairman, stating that he would form a new party; further, that on the same date, the Labor Party of South Korea issued a statement saying that Mr. LYUH's new party and the Labor Party of South Korea will make a common front, fighting against the Rightist camp.
