I hereby promulgate the Law concerning the Restriction of use of the Emblem and Appellation of the Red Cross.

Law No. 159

Article 1. The emblem of Red Cross on White Ground, the Appellation of Red Cross or Geneve Cross, or any emblem or appelation similar to the foregoing shall not be used without authority.

The distinctive signes provided in Article 5 of the Treaty on the adaptation to the maritime warfare of the principles of the Geneve Convention, or any sign similar to the foregoing shall not be used on ships without authority.

Article 2. The Japan Red Cross Society shall be able , to use the emblem of Red Cross on White Ground and the appellation of Red Cross.

Article 3. Any person who wants to use the emblem of Red Cross on White Ground, in order to indicate the place of aid exclusively reserved to give free-of charge care to the injured or the sick, shall be able to use it by authorization of Japan Red Cross Society.

Article 4. Any person who has violated the provisions of Article 1, shall be punished by confinement for less than six months, or by a fine of less than one thousand yen.

Supplementary Provision:

This Law shall come into force as from January 1, 1948.

THE NON WAR SUFFERERS SPECIAL TAX

Chapter I. General Provisions

- Article 1. An unincorporated body referred to under Art. 2, Par. 6 of the Non War Sufferers Special Tax Law (hereinafter he called the Law) which is supposed to have a representative or an executive shall be liable for the non war damaged house tax and / or the non war sufferers tax, within the extent of its assets.
- Article 2. The public bodies referred to under Art. 6, Par. 3 and Art. 7, Par. 1, Item I of the Law shall, in addition to "To," "Do," "Fu" and "Ken," and cities, towns and villages, be an association of "To," "Do," "Fu" and "Ken"; an association of "Do," "Fu" and "Ken," association of "Fu" and "Ken"; an association of "To," cities, towns and villages, an association of cities, towns, and villages, an association of towns and villages; wards in Tokyo Metropolis; wards in cities, towns and villages; and bodies similar to towns and villages located in the area where the old Town and Village Regulation was not put in operation.
- Article 3. The public bodies referred to under Art. 7, Par. 2, Item 1 of the Law shall, in addition to "To," "Do," "Fu," "Ken," special wards and villages, be an association of local public bodies and property wards referred to under Art. 1, Par. 3 of the Law concerning Local Autonomy.

Chapter II. Declaration and Payment

- Article 4. (1) The following matters shall be stated in a return referred to under Art. 17, Par. 1 or 3 of the Law, in addition to matters referred to under Par. 1 of the same Article and the return shall be submitted to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment:
 - 1. Domicile or residence, or location of main office or principal business place and name or title, of the taxpayer.
 - 2. In the case coming under Art. 6, Pars. 1 to 3 inclusive of the Law, matters concerning inheritance, amalgamation or succession of business.

3. In the case coming under Art. 6, Par. 4 of the Law, to that effect.

(2) An unincorporated body other than the one referred to under Art. 2, Par. 6 of the Law which is supposed to have a representative or an executive shall state in the return referred to under the preceding paragraph domicile or residence and name of the representative or the executive, in addition to matters prescribed in the same paragraph.

- Article 5. The following matters shall be stated in a return referred to under Art. 17, Par. 2 of the Law, in addition to matters referred to under the same paragraph, and the return shall be submitted to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment:
 - 1. Domicile or residence, or location of main office or principal business place and name or title, of the taxpayer.
 - 2. In the case coming under Art. 6, Par. 5 or 6 of the Law, matters concerning inheritance or amalgamation.
 - 3. In the case of house which has been jointly used by two or more households or corporations, the floor space, rental value and method of the computation of the taxable standard, of the house

The provision of Par. 2 of the preceding Article shall apply in respect to the case of the preceding paragraph.

- Article 6. A person who desires to revise his return, taxable standard or amount of tax pursuant to Art. 19 of the Law shall file with the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment a document stating therein matters required to be revised and other relevant matters.
- Article 7. A taxpaper of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax, when on paying the non war damaged house tax and / or the non war sufferers tax pursuant to Art. 20 of the Law, shall pay the money to the principal office of the Bank of Japan or its branches or agencies, attaching thereto a note of payment in conformity with such form as may be determined by the Minister of Finance.
- Article 8. A taxpayer of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax who desires to apply for the deferred payment pursuant to Art. 26 of the Law shall, before the time-limit of payment as prescribed in Art. 20 or 31 of the Law, submit to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment an application stating therein matters as enumerated hereunder:
 - 1. Domicile or residence, or location of main office or principal business place and name or title, of the taxpayer.
 - 2. Amount of non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax to be paid.
 - 3. Amount of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax which is applied for the deferred payment and reasons therefore.
 - 4. Method for deferred payment tax and the time-limit for payment.

If, in the case of the preceding paragraph, the taxpayer desires to apply for the deferred payment for more than six months, he shall state in the application referred to under the same paragraph kinds, quantity, value and location of mortgages and, in case of personal guarantee instead of mortages, domicile or residence, or location of main office or principal business place, name or title and state of assets, of the guarantor, and the reason regarding the payment of tax difficult within

six months in addition to matters prescribed in each number of the same paragraph.

- Article 9. The kinds of property to be presented as mortgage, in accordance with Art. 26, Par. 1 of the Law shall be as follows:
- 1. National and local government bonds; and corporate debentures or other securities which the superintendent of a taxation office deems reliable.
- 2. Land.
- 3. Insured house.
- 4. A factory foundation, mine foundation, fishery foundation, railway foundation, truck foundation, canal foundation and a automobile transportation foundation.
- 5. A personal guarantee of a gurantor whom the superintendent of a taxation office deems reliable.
- Article 10. A person who desires to offer the property mentioned under Item 1 of the preceding Article as mortgage shall deposit the same with the Deposit office and deliver the deposit receipt to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment; provided that with respect to registered national bonds and corporate debentures registered in accordance with the Corporate Debentures Registration Law a registration-notification note or registration certificate shall be delivered and, as to national bonds registered in the class B National Bond Registration Book, the deposit receipt shall be delivered after putting the inscribed national bonds into deposit with the Deposit Office.

In case the property mentioned under Items 2 to 4 of the preceding Article has been presented as mortgage, the superintendent of a taxation office shall put the mortgage, into registry or registration with a registry office or registration office.

A person who desires to have his tax guaranted by a guarantor in accordance with Item 5 of the preceding Article shall submit to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment a document attesting to the guarantee of the guaranter.

Article 11. In case the deferred payment of the tax has been paid out, the superintendent of a taxation office shall release the property from mortgage.

Article 12. In case, before the payment of the non war damaged house tax in the form of the 2nd restricted account referred to under Art. 27, Par. 1 of the Law (hereinafter he called the 2nd restricted account), a part of the credits has been transferred to the new account or a new banking institution (meaning the new banking institution referred to under Art. 15 of the Financial Institutions Reconstruction and Reorganization Law; the same goes hereinafter) by virtue of the same Law, the taxpayer may pay the tax in the form of the 2nd restricted account only such amount of tax which he may request to pay in the 2nd restricted account as divided in proportion of the ratio of the amount outstanding in the 2nd restricted account.

Article 13. A taxpayer who desires to pay the non war damaged house tax in the form of the 2nd restricted account pursuant to Art. 27, Par. 1 of the Law shall submit to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place

of payment an application stating therein the following matters before the time-limit for payment mentioned in Art. 20 or 31 of the Law:

1. Taxable standard of the non war damaged house tax and amount thereof.

2. Amount of tax in the non war damaged house tax to be applied for the payment in the form of the 2nd restricted account.

3. Kinds of the 2nd restricted account to be used for payment and the name of the banking institutions concerned.

The application of the preceding paragraph shall be accompanied with a document certifying a fact what the non war damaged house bas been sold and the countervalue for the transaction has become to belong to the 2nd restricted account.

Article 14. (1) In case payment of the non war damaged house tax in the form of the 2nd restricted account has been permitted, the taxpayer shall, presenting the permit and deposit book or a certificate of the 2nd restricted account, notify the banking institution which is the party to the contract to the effect that he is going to pay the non war damaged house tax in the form of credits equivalent to the amount to be appropriated for the payment of non war damaged house tax.

(2) In case the notification of the preceding paragraph has been made, the credits concerned shall, notwithstanding other statutes or contracts, be regarded as having been transferred to the Government, and, at the same time, the non war damaged house tax equivalent to the amount of credits shall be deemed to have been paid. In this case the banking institution shall notify the particulars as may be specified by the Minister of Finance to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment.

Chapter III. Reinvestigation

Article 15. A person who desires to apply for the reinvestigation provided for under Art. 32, Par. 1 of the Law: Shall submit an application accompanied by documents attesting to his complaints with the Director of the Regional Financial Bureau through the superintendent of the tax office covering the place of payment.

In case the superintendent of the tax office has received the application of the preceding paragraph, the application shall be deemed to have been received by the Director of the Regional Financial Bureau.

Article 16. When the application for reinvestigation as provided for in Par. 1 of the preceding Article is filed, the Director of a Regional Financial Bureau may examine the applicant of matters necessary for decision to be given after reinvestigation or require him to submit a statement of accounts or other documents deemed necessary for the decision to be given after reinvestigation.

Chapter IV. Miscelianeous Provisions

Article 17. The notification prescribed in Art. 30, Par. 2 of the Law (inclding the case where it is applied with the necessary modifications by virtue of Art. 42, Par. 2 of the Law) shall be made by announcing in the official gazatte the name and trxable amount of a taxpayer and corrected or

- determined taxable amount (in the case of Art. 42, Par. 2 of the Law name of the taxpayer and the amount of penalty tax).
- Article 18. In case a house on which the non war damaged house tax is to be imposed has been lost or partially damaged because of natural calamities either the date of investigation but before the time-limit of payment prescribed in Art. 20, Par. 1 of the Law, the superintendent of a taxation office may abate or exempt the non war damaged house tax equal to the amount computed by multiplying the amount of non wor damaged house by the ratio of the amount of losses due to the loss or partial damage of the house bears to the value of the house as of the date immediately before the loss or the partial damage, pursuant to the provisions of Art. 35, Item 1 of the Law.
- Article 19. In case a house subject to the non war damaged house tax has been let for rent to the Nation by order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for the use thereof by the payment date set forth under Art. 20, Par. 1 of the Law, the superintendent of a taxation office may abate the tax by not more than 5/10 of the amount of the non war damaged house tax to be imposed on the house, pursuant to Art. 35, Item 3 of the Law
- Article 20. In case a house subject to the non war damaged house tax has been appropriated for Reparation to the Allied nations, the superintendent of a taxation office shall exempt the non war damaged house tax due on the house, pursuant to Art. 35, Item 4 of the Law.
- Article 21. In case a house subject to the non war damaged house tax and which has been kept under custody of the Nation by order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has been returned to the Allied nation or Allied national referred to under the provisions of Art. 1, Par. 2 of the Imperial Ordinance No. 294, 1946 (Imperial Ordinance concerning the Restitution of Allied property) by order of the Minister of Finance issued on the basis of the said Ordinance, or in case the ownership thereof is transferred by virtue of Laws and Ordinances or Orders issued on the basis of Laws and Ordinances the superintendent of the tax office shall exempt the non war damaged house tax due on the house, in accordance with Art. 35 of the Law.
- Article 22. In case personal estate or a house owned and used by the taxpayer of the non war sufferers tax (or other member of his household as of the assessment date in case the taxpayer is the householder) at the time of natural calamities, within the enforcement area of the Law has been lost or partially damaged because of natural calamities after the date of investigation but before the timelimit of paymenr prescribed in Art. 20, Par. 1 of the Law, the superintendent of a taxation office shall abate or exempt the non war sufferers tax equal to the amount computed by multiplying the amount of the non war sufferers tax imposed by the ratio the amount of losses arising out of the loss bears to the total value of the said house and the personal estate as of the date immediate before

- the loss or partial damage, pursuant to Art. 36, Item 1 of the Law; provided, however, that in case the ratio proves less than 20%, this shall not hold good.
- Article 23. In case a machine, an implement or other objects (excluding a house, the same goes in this Article and Art. 24) owned and used by a tax. payer (including other member of his household as of the assessment date in case the taxpayer is a householder) of the non war sufferers tax has been appropriated for the Reparation to the Allied nations, the superintendent of a taxation office shall exempt the non war sufferers tax equal to the amount computed by multiplying the amount of non war sufferers tax imposed on the house which is used directly for the custody of the said machines, implement or other objects by the ratio which the floor space in the house used directly for the custody of the machine, implement or other objects bears to the entire floor space of the house, pursuant to the provisions of Art. 36, Item 3 of the Law.
- Article 24. In case a machine, an implement or other objects owned and used by a taxpayer (including other member of his household as of the assessment date in case the taxpayer is the householder) of the non war sufferers tax which had been kept under custody of the Nation by order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has been returned to the Allied nation or Allied national referred to under Art. 2, Par. 1 of the Imerial Ordinance No. 294, 1947 (Restitution of Allied Property) by order of the Minister of Finance issued on the basis of the said Ordinance, or the ownership of the machine, implement or the objects is transfered by virtue of Laws and Ordinances or Orders issued on the basis of Laws and Ordinances the super intendent of the taxation office shall, in accordance with Art. 36, Item 4, abate or exempt a part of the non war sufferers tax imposed on the house used for the custody of the machine, implement or other objects in proportion of the ratio which the floor space in the house used for custody of the machine, implement or other objects bears to the entire floor space of the house.
- Article 25. In case a taxpayer is acknowledged by the Government to be scarcely able to pay the tax because of the heavy loss of ability to pay on account of natural calamities or other reasons, the superintendent of a taxation office may abate or exempt the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax by virtue of the provisions of Art. 35, Item 2 or Art. 36, Item 2 of the Law.
- Article 26. A taxpayer of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax who desires to be favoured abatement or exemption of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax by virtue of Art. 35 or Art. 36 of the Law shall so request stating reasons to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment.

In case the superintendent of the taxation office has made a decision on the exemption or abatement of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax by virtue of Art. 35 or 36 of the Law, he shall notify the decision to the taxpayer.

Article 27. A person who desires to be favoured the application of Art. 37, Par. 2 of the Law shall submit an application stating therein the same to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment by the filing date of the return referred to under Art. 17 or Art. 18 of the Law.

Article 28. A person who desires to inspect returns filed by taxpayers or documents regarding correction, determination or revision of taxable standards or the amount of tax may so request to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment.

Article 29. A person who desires to give an information in accordance with Aat. 39, Par. 1 of the Law shall inform the matters as enumerated hereunder to the Minister of Finance or to the Directot of a Regional Financial Bureau:

Name and domicile or residence of the informer.
 Details of the fact that a person deemed liable to pay the tax failed to file his return or of the suspicion of an omission in the taxable standard or the amount of tax shown in the return.

3. Name or title and domicile or residence, or location of a main office or principal business place, of a person deemed liable to pay the tax or of a taxpayer referred to under the preceding item.

Article 30. The amount of a reward to be given to an informer by virtue of Art. 39, Par. 1 of the Law shall be determined within the limit of the amount not exceeding 10% of the tax recovered by the determination or connection of the taxable standard enabled by the information (excluding an amount of the tax to be added to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax by virtue of Art. 40 of the Law or of the tax to be additionally collected pursuant to Art. 41 of the Law), with due consideration given by the Director of the Local Financial Bureau to the importance of the contribution the information made to determination of correction of the taxable standard.

The reward referred to under Art. 39, Par. 1 of the Law shall be delivered by the Director of the Local Financial Bureau having jurisdiction over the place of payment.

Article 31. The amount of tax to be added to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax in accordance with Art. 40, Par. 1 of the Law (including the same paragraph as applied, by virtue of Par. 3 of the same Article, to the additional collection of the tax to be made in accordance with Art. 31 of the Law) shall be computed, according to the number of days enumerated under each of the following items, by multiplying the amount of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax to be paid by the taxpayer at the rate of 5 sen per 100 yen per diem:

1. In respect to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax to be paid pursuant to Art. 20, Par. 2 of the Law, the number of days elapsed since the day following the timelimit of payment prescribed in Par. 1 of the same Article to the date of payment referred to under Par. 2 of the same Article.

2. In respect to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax arising out of the revision of the return, or the taxable standard or the amount of tax which is to be paid pursuant to Art. 20, Par. 3 of the Law, the number of days elapsed since the day following the time limit of payment prescribed in Par. 1 of the same Article to the date of payment referred to under Par. 3 of the same Article.

3. In respect to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax arising out of the correction of Art. 29, Par. 1 or 3 of the Law or determined pursuant to Par. 2 of the same Article, which is to be paid by virtue of Art. 31 of the Law, the number of days elapsed since the day following the time-limit of payment prescribed in Art. 20, Par. 1 of the Law to the date of payment referred to under Art. 31 of the Law.

The amount of tax to be added to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax which is equal to the amount of tax in delay as referred to under Art. 26, Par. 1 of the Law shall be computed, according to the number of days enumerated under each of following items, by multiplying the unpaid amount (excluding the amount of tax in arrears) of tax in delay at the rate of 5 sen per 100 yen per diem:

1. In respect to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax equal to the amount of tax to be paid as the first instalment, the number of days elapsed since the day mentioned hereunder to the payment date of the tax in delay concerned:

(a) In respect to the deferred amount of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax which is to be paid in accordance with Art. 20, Par. 1 of the Law, the day following the time-limit of payment as prescribed under the said paragraph.

(b) In respect to the deferred amount of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax (including the amount of tax to be added pursuant to the preceding paragraph) to be paid in accordance with Art. 20, Par. 2 of the Law, the day following the date of payment prescribed in Art. 20, Par. 2 of the Law.

(c) In respect to the deferred payment of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax arising out of the revision of the return or of the taxable standard or amount of tax, which is to be paid in accordance with Art. 20, Par. 3 of the Law (including the amount of tax to be added pursuant to the preceding paragraph), the day following the date of payment prescribed in Art. 20, Par. 3 of the Law.

(d) In respect to the deferred payment of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax arising out of the correction referred to under Art. 29, Par. 1 or 3 of the Law (including the amount of tax to be added pursuant to the preceding paragraph) or of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax determined pursuant to Par. 2 of the said Article (including the amount

of tax to be added in accordance with the

preceding paragraph) which is to be paid by virtue of Art. 31 of the Law, the day following the date of payment prescribed in Art. 31 of the Law.

2. In respect to the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax equal to the amount of the tax to be paid as 2nd and later instalments, the number of days elapsed since the day following the time-limit of payment of the deferred tax of the preceding instalment to the payment date of the instalment concerned.

3. The superintendent of a taxation office may, in case he recognizes good excuses, exempt the additional amount of the tax referred to under Par. 1, as may be determined by the Minister of Finance.

Article 32. In the case where the non war damaged house tax and/or the non wat sufferers tax referred to under Art. 20; Par. 2 or 3 of the Law has been paid or the non war damaged house tax and/ or the non war sufferes tax equal to the additional tax of Art. 31 of the Law is to be collected, the amount of the tax to be additionally collected pursuant to Art. 41 of the Law shall be computed, according to the term of time from the day following the filing date of the return prescribed in Art. 17 or Art. 18 of the Law to the day on which the return concerning the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax is filed, or to the day on which the notification of correction or determination of the taxable standard or amount of tax is made, by multiplying the tax concerned at the rate of 5% for each month elapsed.

Article 33. The amount which may be applied for the refundment or exemption of the non war damaged house tax pursuant to Art. 43, Par. 1 of the Law shall be one equal to the non war damaged house tax (excluding the amount of the tax to be added to the non war damaged house tax pursuant to Art. 40 of the Law, or of the tax to be additionally collected by virtue of Art. 41 of the Law) on the house which has been transferred in accordance with Art. 60, Par. 1 of the War Indemnity Special Measures Law.

Article 34. A person who desires to apply for the refundment or exemption of the non war damaged house tax pursuant to Art. 43, Par. 1 of the Law shall submit an application stating therein the following matters to the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the place of payment:

1. Location, number, kind and floor space of the house which has been transferred pursuant to Art. 60, Par. 1 of the War Indemnity Special Measures Law.

2. Taxable standard and amount of the non war damaged house tax imposed upon the house.

3. Date of transfer.

4. Name or title and domicile or residence, or location of a main office or principal business place, of a person who received the house by

5. Amount of tax which is applied for the refundment or exemption.

Article 35. If, inrespect to the non war damaged house tax paid in accordance with Art. 27 of the Law, there is any overpayment in the said tax

paid in the form of the 2nd restricted account the refundment shall be made in the form of the 2nd restricted account.

If, in the case of the preceding paragraph, a part of the 2nd restricted account appropriated for the payment, has been transferred to the new account or a new banking institution by virtue of the Financial Institutions Reconstruction and Reorganization Law, the 2nd restricted account shall be instrumental to the refundment in proportion to the out standing amount of the 2nd restricted account in the entire amount of the 2nd restricted account once paid in for the tax-payment.

If, in the case of Par. 1 all or a part of the 2nd restricted account as appropriated for the payment has become void due to the final liquidation of the old account made pursuant to the Financial Institutions Reconstruction and Reorganization Law, or in accordance with the Special Treatment Law of the Loss of the Deposit Bureau such amount in the overpayment as corresponding to the ratio which the invalid part in the 2nd restricted account bears to the entire amount of the 2nd restricted account once paid in for the tax payment shall not be refunded.

Article 36. A corporation liable to pay the non war sufferers tax which has neither main office or principal business place within the enforcement area of the Law shall, when appointed the place of payment, inform the same to the superintendent of a paxation office which administers the area where a house used within the enforcement area of the Law is located.

Article 37. A taxpayer of the non war sufferers tax, when changed the place of payment, shall so notify to the superintendent of the tax offices covering the old and new place of payment.

Article 38. In case a taxpayer of the non war damaged house tax and/or the non war sufferers tax has appointed a taxpayment agent, he shall inform the name and domicile or residence of the agent to the superintendent of a taxation office which administers the place of payment.

Article 39. A person required to file a return pursuant to Art. 48 of the Law shall by the time-limit set forth under Art. 17 or 18 of the Law Submit his return stating therein the following matters either to the superintendent of the tax office covering the location of the house referred to under Art. 48, Item 1 of the Law in case the taxpayer comes under said item, or to the superintendent of the tax office covering the domicile (in case of no domicile in the enforcement area of the Law, the residence) or the main office or principal business place of the taxpayer, in case the taxpayer comes under Items 2-5 of the same Article:

1. Domicile or residence of tax-payers, of location of main office or principal business place.

2. Summary of fact coming under the provisions of Art. 48 the Law.

The return referred to under the preceding paragraph shall be accompanied by the affirmation or other document issued by the competent authorities attesting to the fact which comes under each item of Art. 48 of the Law.

Article 40. A taxation official shall, when he inspects houses, books, papers or other things pursuant to Art. 45 of the Law, take an inspector's pass as may be provided for by the Minister of Finance.

Article 41. "The Government" referred to under Art. 18, Par. 1 of the Law and under the latter half of Art. 46, Par. 2 of the Law shall mean "the Minister of Finance" and "the Government" referred to under Art. 33 of the Law shall mean "the Director of the Regional Financial Bureau which administers the place of payment."

Besides the preceding paragraph, "the Covernment" referred to under the Law shall mean the superintendent of a taxation office which administers the place of payment, unless otherwise specified, in the present Law.

5. The outline and plan of working activity and an estimate for income and expenditure

6. The domicile or the location of a principal business place or main business office and name or title of the management

7. The personal history of the management (in case the management is a corporation the personal history of the representative of the corporation).

The application of the preceding paragraph shall be accompanied with the copy of the school rules in the case of a private school or of the library ruler in the case of a private library.

Article 2. In case a corporation established pursuant to Art. 34 of the Civil Code or other corporation not aiming at profits desires to be favoured of the designation of the Minister of Einance made pursuat to Art. 14, Item 4 of the Law, it shall submit an application stating therein the matters enumerated below, to the Minister of Finance, within the time limit of filing a return as referred to under Art. 17 or Art. 18 of the Law, through the superintendent of a taxation office having jurisdiction over the area where the house concerned is located:

1. The purposes of the working activity and the title of the corporation

2. The location of the main business office

3. The date of approval or permit for establishment

4. The outline or plan of the working activity and the estimate for income and expenditure

5. The personal history of the director

6. The location, structure, purpose of use and floor space of a house to be designated.

The application of the preceding paragraph shall be accompanied with the copy of the charter or articles of a corporation and an inventory.

Article 3. The note of payment as referred to under Art. 7 of the Non War Sufferers Special Tax Law Enforcement Regulations (shall hereinafter be called the Regulations) shall be prepared according to the Form No. 1.

Article 4. A banking institution which has accepted a request of the payment of the non war damaged house tax in the form of the 2nd restricted accounts of deposits made pursuant to Art. 14, Par. 1 of the Regulations, shall inform the matter to the superintendent of a taxation office having

jurisdiction over the place of payment according to the From No. 2, within 7 days after the date on which the application has been accepted.

Article 5. The superintendent of a taxation office may, in case he deems it due to the other reasons than an intention or fault on the side of a taxpayer that the taxpayer has failed to file his return within the filing date of Art. 17 or Art. 18 of the Law, or that, in the case where a return was revised later on pursuant to Art. 19 of the Law, the taxable standards or the amount of tax shown in the original return of the revised return has been in error, or that the taxable standards filed or revised by a taxpayer has differed from the taxable standards or the amount of tax investigated by

the Government, exempt the addition altax referred to under Art. 31, Par. 1 pursuant to Par. 3 of the said Article.

A person who desires to be favored of the exemption of the additional tax pursuant to the provision of the preceding paragraph, shall make request stating the reason therefor to the superintendent of the competent taxation office.

The superintendent of a taxation office when decided on the exemption of the additional tax, shall notify the same to the taxpayer.
