OUR COUNTY OFFICERS.

A meeting of the Republican Central Committee was held on Thursday, when it was decided to put the full ticket for county officers in the field at the coming election—notwithstanding the late decision of the Supreme Court.

Hon. Marons P. Wiggin, one of our Superior Judges, is our nominee for election to the position he now so creditably fills by appointment of the Governor.

Harry Batin, for County Clerk, was an excellent selection. He has long been in the well-known firm of Boone & Wright, and is popular with all who know him, and if elected will make an efficient officer.

W. T. Elliott, for Treasurer, is a resident of Bridgeport, and one of the pioneers of the county, and perfectly reliable, and if elected the county funds will continue in good hands.

For District Attorney we have the well-known and popular attorney, T. A. Stephens, familiarly called "Tom." All know that he is well qualified for the position, and that he will be elected we have no doubt.

For Coroner and Administrator, J. C. Banker, of Mainmoth, but formerly of Bodie, is in the field. He is an energetic and capable young man, and would make a good officer.

Mrs. C. A. Sullivan will be re-elected Superintendent of Public Schools, having held the position during the past year very satisfactorily to the people.

S. G. Thompson, of Bridgeport, is the nominee for Surveyor, an office he has held several years satisfactorily.

The candidate for Supervisor is A. F. Hector, an old resident of Bodie, and enjoys the reputation of being a good business man—just what is required in a Supervisor.

For Justices we have our present Justices Estess and Newman, who have conducted the business in a manner satisfactory to the honest, law-abiding citizen, if not to the rough element, and they will be re-elected.

J. A. Grant and W. H. McKillip are the candidates for Constables of Bodie Township. Grant is an old and well known officer, and McKillip is said to be well qualified for the position.

The True Hero of Gettysburg.

Many people, and not a few presses, mention General Hancock as "the hero of Gettysburg." This is a mistake. That honor belongs to the late General Meade.

During the past month the overland railroads carried 3,091 passengers East and 2,663 West—a loss of 428. The loss by sea amounted to 393, there being 955 arrivals and 1,399 departures. The net loss by both routes was 821.

A GLORIOUS VICTORY.

The Presidential election has really been decided by the elections which occurred in Indiana and Ohio on Tuesday last, resulting in both States in an overwhelming Republican majority.

Ohio, the home of our next President, General Garfield, has done nobly, rolling up a Republican majority of at least 25,000. In the Buckeye State we have gained at least six Congressmen, and have secured a United States Senator in place of Thurman.

The great revolution in Indiana, so long a Democratic State, has paralyzed the Democratic party, its leaders knowing full well that if that State went back on the party at this stage of the game, the Democratic Cock was cooked—its crowing days were passed, and the Presidential contest virtually ended in favor of Garfield and Arthur.

County Sea Items. Taxes.—On Monday last the Board of Supervisors fixed the rate of taxation at four per cent, as follows: State, 64 cents; general fund, \$1.00; contingent, 35; current, 25; school, 21; salary, 30; hospital, 20; road, 15; Court House, 50; interest on road bonds, 20.

Sentenced.—On Monday last Judge Briggs sentenced Wm. Lee, convicted of grand larceny in stealing amalgam from Hanson's sluice boxes, to four years imprisonment in the State Prison.

Great Register.—The Great Register has been placed in the hands of the printers. It will contain 3,223 names.

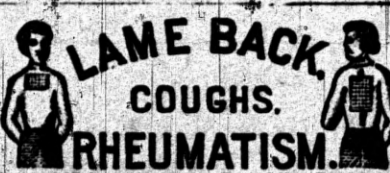
