

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

As READ AT THE ANNUAL MEETING, FEBRUARY 20TH, 1888.

HE Council of the Society has much pleasure in submitting its twenty-fourth Annual Report to the subscribers.

It was stated in last year's report that it was intended to make the Gardens as attractive as possible before the opening of the Exhibition and this object has been kept steadily in view. The Government was good enough to assist by placing an extra £1,000 for the use of the Society, on the estimates for 1887-8 and this has been of great assistance in carrying out needed alterations and improvements.

The following is a list of the principal works completed since the last report was published. A new Museum has been built and the old one converted into a Crocodile House, a handsome enclosure has been erected for peacocks and other gaily plumaged birds with a house in the centre, a new paddock has been enclosed for the

Wapiti deer and another adjoining for a pair of Nylghaies, purchased recently from the Adelaide Society, houses having been built in both paddocks. New enclosures have been constructed for the Ostriches. Emus and Cassowaries. A new house and enclosure has been put up for the Bactrian Camels mentioned in last year's report, which arrived safely in April last. A house has been built for the Yaks in their paddock and several smaller enclosures have been made or altered for the better. The fence round the lower pond, a large sheet of water, has recently been removed and has made it accessible to the public thus forming a very pleasant pienicing ground. This has been done to compensate visitors for the loss of the ground enclosed by some of the aforementioned enclosures. Near the pond several swings have been erected for children. The Kangaroo paddock has been divided into three compartments with a house in each, and the different varieties of large Kangaroos separated, removing a just cause of complaint, that all the Kangaroos being together, it was impossible for visitors not acquainted with the several kinds to tell one from the other. A large and handsome arch has been erected near the Wombat caves at a place where several paths meet. In addition to the works enumerated a good many minor improvements have been effected. The Native Encampment and several other important additions still remain to be completed before the opening of the Exhibition.

The Council has not been unmindful of the necessity of keeping up and extending the Zoological collection. The number of specimens in the Gardens having now increased to thirteen hundred or more. The Director personally visited Queensland some months ago principally for the purpose of obtaining the Wallaroo Kangaroo, which are most difficult to procure. Three specimens have now been secured and other animals and reptiles and a number of beautiful Queensland parrots have been received as the result of his visit. Several animals and birds have also arrived from the Calcutta Zoological Gardens and others are expected, and it is intended to send the Assistant Director again to

England to procure fresh stock in May next, when he will commence sending out his purchases as soon as the great summer heat of the Red Sea is passed, returning to Melbourne at the end of the year.

The Melbourne Zoological Gardens may now be said to have arrived at a distinct period of their history, as after a long struggle with insufficient funds, and bad means of access, the difficulties have at length been overcome and the Gardens by constant and unremitting care have now obtained a very creditable position. They have become so attractive that visitors are yearly increasing, the tramways have also been of great assistance in this direction, and by the end of the year it is hoped that the branch tramway to the Garden Gates will be an accomplished fact, as it is intended, early in the next session, to ask for the sanction of Parliament to construct it. The Council consider that the future of the Society is now assured and the efforts of the Directors will be not merely to keep the Gardens and collection of animals up to their present standard, but to increase their attractiveness to the full limit of the funds at the disposal of the Society.

The Continental Concerts under Mr. Siede's direction, were tried again this year, but after several had been given, it was found that there was not on an average sufficient visitors to make them pay and they were therefore reluctantly discontinued.

About fourteen thousand Trout Fry were placed last season in suitable rivers and creeks in different parts of the colony, which were obtained as usual from Sir Samuel Wilson's Estate "Ercildoune," through the kindness of his representative in Melbourne, Mr. Archibald Fisken. Encouraging reports have been received as to the increase of English Trout in streams either wholly or partly stocked by the Society, notably in tributaries of the Upper Yarra and the Goulburn. Large numbers of Trout Fry have also been placed in Gippsland streams, but, as yet, no reports have come to hand as to their success in those rivers and creeks. The Council would be glad to receive intimation of the presence of these fish in Gippsland waters. The Council desire most cordially to thank Mr. C. M. Officer, M.P., for his services during the past year as President and also Mr. Purchas, the Hon. Treasurer. The following are the three members who retire, having attended the fewest number of meetings, but are eligible for re-election. Mr. Godfrey, Mr. Bruce, and Mr. Tyler.

The officers for the ensuing year were then elected, with the following result.:—President, George Bruce, Esq.; Vice Presidents, C. M. Officer, Esq., M.L.A., Charles Ryan, Esq.; Hon. Treasurer, Albert Purchas, Esq.; Members of Council, F. R. Godfrey, Esq.; and J. C. Tyler Esq., were re-elected.

On the motion of Mr. Godfrey, seconded by the Hon. C. J. Jenner, who referred in complimentary terms to the management and conduct of the garden, a special vote of thanks was unanimously passed to the Director and Assistant Director, for their valuable services to the Society, which the Director briefly acknowledged, stating that no effort should be wanting on his part, or that of his son, not only to keep the gardens up to their present standard, but to increase their attraction both in a scientific aspect and as a place of amusement year by year.

The retiring President Mr. C. M. Officer, stated on vacating the chair, that his year of office had been of the most agreeable character, in every way.

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE

ZOOLOGICAL & ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY

PURSUANT TO THE ZOOLOGICAL AND ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY INCORPORATION ACT NO. 794, 1884, SECTION 8, AND APPROVED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.



1. Membership.—A subscriber of One guinea or upwards annually, which shall be payable in the month of January, shall be a member of the society; and contributors, within one year, of Ten guineas or upwards shall be life members of the society; and any person who may render special services to the society shall be eligible for honorary membership, and may be elected as such by the Council, or by any annual general meeting.

2. Election of council.—At the annual meeting to be held in the month of February, 1885, nine members, comprising the whole of the elected members of the council, shall be elected by ballot, and thereafter the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall annually retire from office, and also three other members of conncil (namely those who have attended the fewest meetings of the council since their appointment) shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election, subject to Regulation No. 9.

3. Vacancy in council, how supplied.—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death, resignation, or non-attendance of any member of the council for a period of two months, witbout leave of the council, the remaining members shall, in due course, appoint another member of the society to be a member of the council in the place and stead of the member who shall so resign or absent himself; but such new member shall be nominated at an ordinary meeting of the council prior to the meeting at which he is elected.

4. Council to fill up vacancies.—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death or resignation of the president, vice-president, or honorary treasurer, the council may appoint from amongst themselves, or the other members of the society, a person to fill the vacancy so occurring, and the person elected shall hold office only until the next anunal meeting but shall be eligible for re-election for the subsequent year. Provided that such vacancy shall not be filled up unless seven days notice in writing shall have been sent to each member of the council, stating the vacancies which it is proposed to fill up.

5. Eligibility of members of council.—No person shall he eligible as a member of conncil unless he be a subscriber to the funds of the society of at least One guinea per annum, and any member of Council whose subscription shall be in arrear for three months after his subscription is payable shall cease to be a member of Council: Provided that this rule shall not apply to persons who may have become life-members of the society, hy a payment of Ten guineas, or who may be honorary members of the society, and provided also that a month's notice in writing shall be sent to the member so in arrear before his place can be filled up.

6. Meetings of council.—The council shall meet at least once a month, three members to form a quorum, and transact the business of the society. And the director shall have power to call a special meeting of the council whenever occasion may require.

7. Minutes of proceedings.—Minutes shall be made in books kept for the purpose of all proceedings at general meetings of the members, and minutes shall also be made of the proceedings of the council at their general and special meetings, and of the names of the members attending the same, and such minutes shall be open to inspection by any member of the society at all reasonable times.

8. Moneys to be paid to treasurer.—All subscriptions and other moneys received on account of the society shall be paid to the treasurer, or some person authorized hy him, who shall place the same in a bank, to be named by the council, to the credit of the Society; and no sum shall be paid on account of the society until the same shall have heen ordered by the council, and such order be duly entered in the book of the proceedings of the conncil and all cheques shall be signed by the treasurer as such, and be countersigned by the president or one of the vice-presidents, and hy the director.

9. Annual meeting.—An annual meeting of members shall be held in the month of Fehrnary in each year, and the council shall report their proceedings during the past year, and shall produce their accounts duly audited for publication; and the meeting shall elect by ballot the office-bearers for the ensuing year, and fill up any vacancy which may exist in the council: Provided that no person shall hold the office of president or vice-president for two years successively.

10. *Medals.*—No medal of the society shall be awarded to any person except hy the vote of at least seven members of council, present at a council meeting, and after notice of motion for awarding such medal shall have been given at the next preceeding meeting of the council.

11. *Time of gardens opening and closing.*—The gardens are open from half-past nine a.m. till half-past four p.m. in winter, and six p.m. in summer, except on Sundays when the gates are not opened until half-past one p.m.

12. Dogs not allowed in gardens.—Visitors are not allowed to hring dogs into the gardens. A penalty of Two pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation, in addition to which the owner of any dog found in the gardens will he held responsible for any damage done by such dog.

13. *Prohibitions.*—Visitors are especially prohibited from teasing or disturbing the animals or birds; also from interrupting the workmen by conversation or otherwise; also from leaving bottles, broken glass, or crockery, paper, or litter of any kind in the gardens; from lighting any fire therein; from posting any bills on the fences, houses, or trees; and from playing cricket, football, or other games within the gardens. A penalty of Ten shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

14. Children, unprotected, not allowed in gardens.—Children under twelve years of age will not be allowed within the gardens unless with a parent or other adult, and if found therein may be expelled therefrom.

15. *Prohibitions.*—Walking across the shrnbberies or flower borders, pulling flowers or branches from the plants, shrubs or trees; standing upon or climbing over any of the fences, climbing trees or bird-nesting, cutting names or letters or marks of any kind, or writing on any of the seats, or trees or fences, or any building erected for the accommodation of the public are strictly prohibited. A penalty of Ten shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

16. Entrance into enclosures prohibited.—Entrance into those parts of the grounds which are specially enclosed for plantation, or other purposes, is strictly prohibited, under a penalty of Five shillings.

17. Smoking prohibited.—Smoking in the summer time, at such times as may seem necessary to the directors for the safety of the gardens and the property therein, is prohibited, and at such times notices to that effect will be posted at the gates. A penalty of Five shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

18. *Expulsion on misbehavior.*—Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency, or swearing or using bad language, or committing a breach of any of the above regulations may be forthwith removed from the gardens, and any member of the society so misbehaving shall cease to be a member.

19. Charges for admission.—Admission to the gardens is free on Sundays. On Mondays non-subscribers will be admitted on payment of One shilling for each adult and Sixpence for each child under twelve years of age, but the Society shall have power to charge One Shilling for each adult and Sixpence for each child under twelve years of age on any day (Sunday excepted) that an Instrumental Concert may be given in the Gardens. On all other days of the week non-subscribers will be admitted on payment of Sixpence for each adult and Threepence for each child under twelve years of age. State and other schools will be admitted to the gardens on application to the director at half the usual entrance fees. Members of the society admitted free.

20. Repeal of pre-existing rules.—All rules and regulations of the society in force prior to its incorporation and up to the date of these regulations coming into effect are hereby repealed.
