


At the request of Capt F.W. Wagener I have continued the red line laid down on the half & marked X-Y-Z to letter B-S so as to show the division line agreed upon between Capt F.W. Wagener & The West Shore Corp. The point 'B' being located on the land by division rod. Since this plat was made the location of the creek has changed.

The point on the eastern line of Capt F.W. Wagener's land on this plat marked in red by letter 'B' is nine hundred and fifty seven (957') feet from the point on Grove St. marked 'C' on this plat & which is located on the land by an iron bolt Surveyed Aug. 1914
