SUMMARY

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The attached letter from the Secretary of State requests that the War Department declare the C-45B now assigned to WDGS, G-2 for use of the Military Air Attache, Urugumy surplus in that country to permit its sale to the Urugumyan Government. This airplane has recently been replaced with a C-47B. The attached disposition form from WDGS, G-4 indicates that the Secretary of War has directed compliance with the above cited request. Accordingly a reply to the Secretary of State is forwarded herewith indicating that subject C-45 is surplus to the War Department and that the Military Attache at Montevideo has been advised to report this airplane to the Foreign Liquidation Commission representative for sale to the Uruguayan Government.

The attached letter has been coordinated with the Assistant Secretary of War for Air.

My dear Mr. Secretary:

Reference is made to the enclosed paraphrase of telegram no. 812 dated December 17, 1945 from the American Embassy at Montevideo to the Department regarding the desire of the Uruguayan Government to purchase the C-45 aircraft now assigned to the Military Air Attache at Montevideo.

It is understood that in view of the Embassy's request, the Military Air Attache at Montevideo has been instructed by the War Department to leave the aircraft in question in Uruguay. It is further understood that the War Department has indicated its willingness to declare this aircraft, together with available spares, surplus to military requirements, upon the receipt of a request from the Department that this be done for the purpose of their sale to the Uruguayan Government. Since the Department is informing the Uruguayan Government that it is disposed to accept payment for the aircraft and spares in question as a charge against the Uruguayan Lend Lease credit balance, it would be appreciated if the War Department would not declare them surplus for the purpose mentioned. Upon being informed that this has been done, the Department will recommend that the corresponding allocation be made by the Surplus Property Administration.

The Department believes that the War Department concurs with it in the view that the sale of this aircraft to the Uruguayan Government will result in material benefit to the United States.

FR: American Embassy, Montevideo, Uruguay. Dated December 17, 1945.

No. 812

With reference to Department's telegram 450, November 21, the Military authorities of Urugyay regret that aircraft could be purchased only with credit balance of Lend Lease payments on deposit in the United States. Embassy strongly recommends in view of their great interest in this airplane that the Military Air Attache be authorized to leave this plane in Montevideo when he leaves for the United States on December 26 and that after method of payment is agreed the plane and spare parts be declared surplus and delivered. Uruguayan Government cannot request additional funds for this purchase in view of budgetary deficit.
