To whom it may concern:

This is to certify that I, [REDACTED], Albuquerque, New Mexico, did, on the 9th Day of August, 1952, between the hours of 6P.M. and 6:30 P.M., sight an unknown aerial object in motion over North Albuquerque.

Said object appeared to be at an altitude of approximately 2,000ft. and was travelling North at a speed estimated 100 M.P.H. Object was rising during forward motion and was visible for at least 2 minutes until it passed out of range of the naked eye.

Witness my hand this 13th. Day of August, 1952.

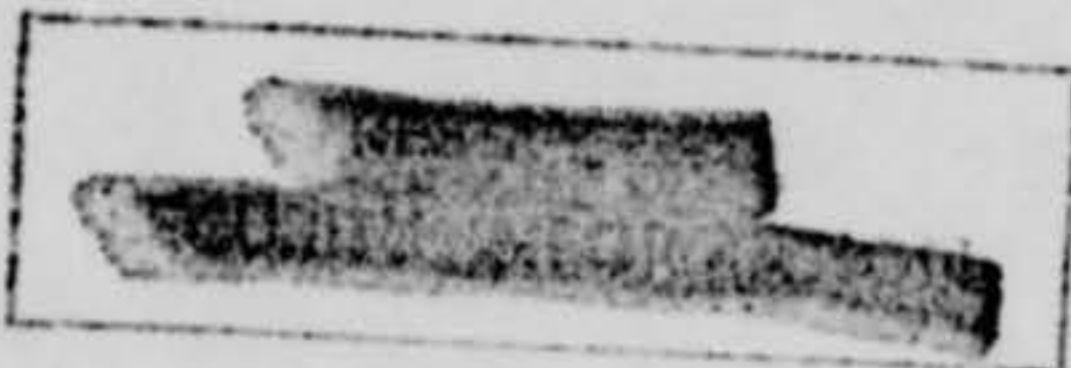

E. [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] observed an unconventional airborbe object over Albuquerque, New Mexico. This object had no visible means of propulsion. It was round and appeared to be slightly larger than an F-86 at the same altitude. The object was dark in color- appearing almost black. It remained motionless for a moment and disappeared in a straight line towards the north at a speed of approximately 400 MPH. This object was observed for a period of from three to seven minutes.</p> <p>The reliability of the above observers is considered good.</p>

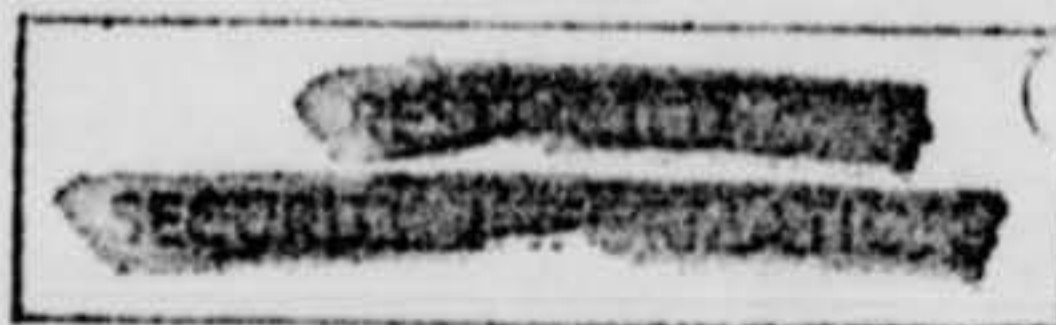

SWORN STATEMENT

I, [REDACTED] 34th Air Division (Defense)
Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico, do hereby wish to make the following statement:

At approximately 1815MST on the 9th day of August, 1952, I did see an unconventional object. The reason for me to notice this object was several people standing in the road looking up. This object was round in shape and remaining motionless when first sighted. The area surrounding it was clear. It was gray in color and left at a high rate of speed, approximately 400 MPH in a straight line with no visible means of propulsion. This object was larger than a P-36 fighter, at the same altitude and distance from me. I watched this object approximately 5 to 6 minutes before it disappeared. It disappeared in a northerly direction.

SWORN STATEMENT

I, J. [REDACTED], being first duly sworn, upon my oath depose and say:

That I am a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of New Mexico, am 44 years of age, have been living in New Mexico practically all of my life and in Albuquerque for the past 8 years.

That on Saturday, August 9, 1952, at approximately 6:00 P.M., as I was in my automobile and leaving my home at [REDACTED] Albuquerque, New Mexico, I saw whom I afterward learned to be Sgt. [REDACTED] and his wife standing in front of my house looking in a northerly direction, which caused me to look in such a direction, where in the sky in a clear space among the clouds I sighted some sort of an airborne object, which to me appeared to be a round object, dark in color and apparently having no wings, but it was so far away that it might have had wings which I could not distinguish with the naked eye. When I first sighted this object it was some distance from me and not being experienced in the field of observing and estimating the size and speed of aircraft at a distance, I could not too well tell the size or speed but I would judge that the size was about that of one of the large bombers and from information that I have received as to speed traveled by a bomber or jet-propelled airplane I would estimate the speed that this object was traveling to be about 400 to 500 miles per hour. I observed this object for about three minutes and it appeared to be traveling away from me slightly to the west on a straight north course and it appeared to me to be traveling on a level line in a steady course neither raising nor putting on a burst of speed and then slowing up.

After observing this object for about three minutes I then drove my automobile to the east three houses away from my house where my neighbor [REDACTED] had been watching this object. After stopping and talking to [REDACTED] he sighted it again in the sky but I was unable to see it at that time.

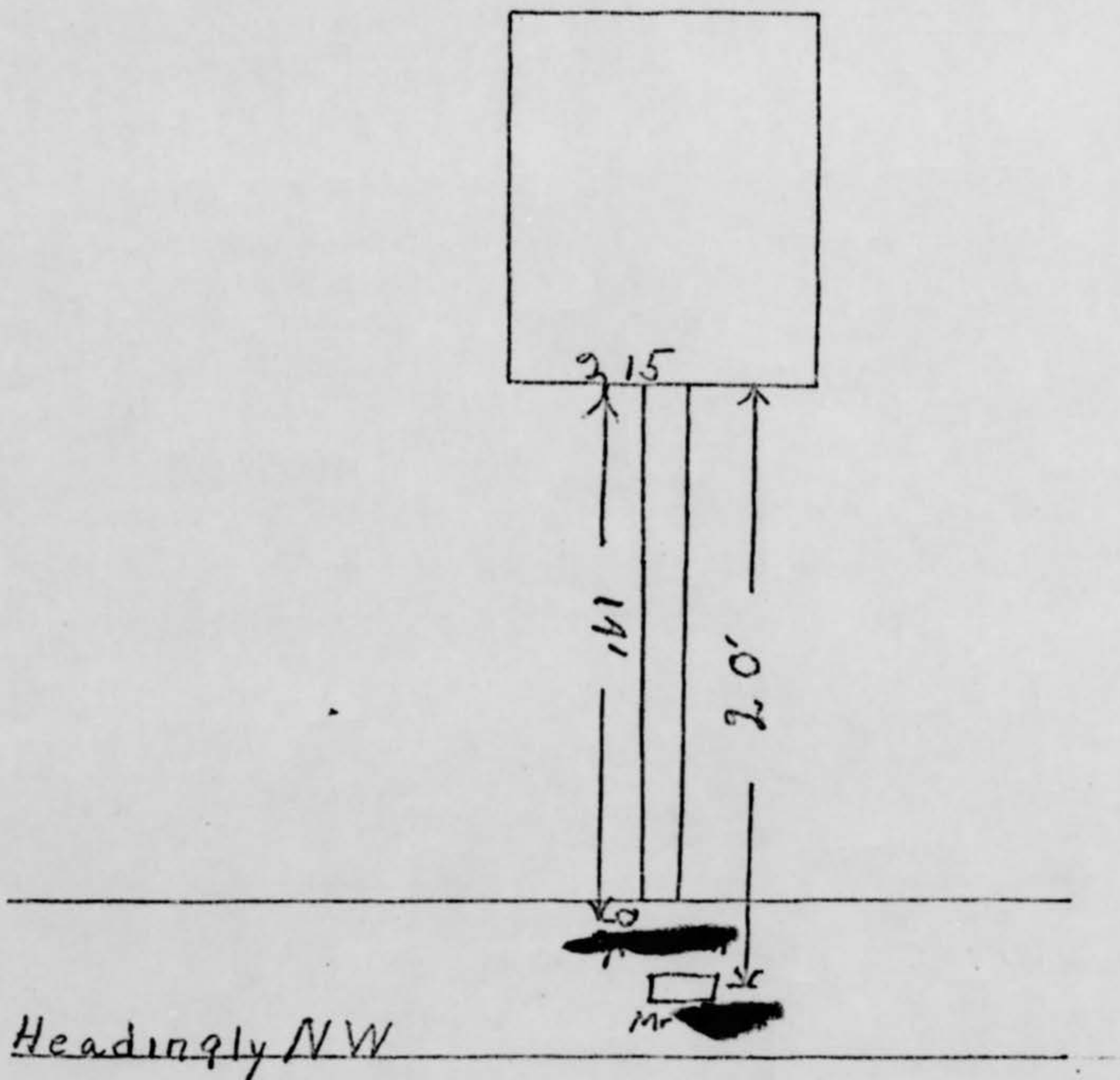
