## APPROVAL IS SOUGHT

FINAL ACTION TO BE TAKEN AT LUNCHEON WEDNESDAY AT METHODIST CHURCH

Members of the board of directors of the old Chamber of Commerce of Glendale and members of the executive committee of citizens interested in the re-organization of the Chamber of Commerce, heid a meeting recently to consider the proposed constitution and the hy-laws.

After some discussion, a constitution and by-laws were passed upon, being practically the same, it is announced, as those in force in about 300 Chambers of Commerce throughout the United States.

### To Discuss Sewer Question

The meeting has a two-fold pur-First, the adoption of the new standard constitution and by-laws and second, the discussion of the sewer problem. Frank H. Olmsted, the engineer who has been retained by the city administration to draw up plans and specifications for the sewer system, will be present and outline the plans he has under way. After Mr. Olmsted's talk there will be a general discussion from the floor, every member having an opportunity to ask questions.

Persons having memberships assigned them, in some cases will not receive 'invitations due to inability of the office force to make all the changes necessary, however they are all cordially invited.

The proposed constitution and bylaws will be submitted to the membership of the Chamber of Commerce at a luncheon to be held in the banchurch at noon tomorrow. All members of the reorganized Chamber of Commerce are invited to be present and act upon the proposed constitution and by-laws






