SUMMARY OF RELEVANT POINTS (with page references):

In this order dated 8 months prior to the Jap attack on Pearl Harbor and $3\frac{1}{2}$ months prior to the German attack on Russia, Hitler states his aim is to induce Japan to intervene actively in the Far East as soon as possible, thus tying down strong English forces and focusing interest of the U.S. on the Pacific. Hitler's idea here is not war against the U.S. however, as he indicates hope of conquering England and keeping U.S. out of the war. He says Japs must not be told of his plan to invade Russia.

Concerning Collaboration with Japan.

The Fuehrer has issued the following directives for the cooperation with Japan:

1.) The aim of the cooperation based on the Three-Power-Pact, must be to bring Japan, as soon as possible, to active operations in the Far East. Large English forces will hereby be immobilized, the center of the U.S.A. interest will be diverted to the Pacific.

In view of the still undeveloped state of war mobilization on the part of her opponents, the prospects of success for Japan will be the greater, the earlier she intervenes. The "Barbarossa" enterprise provides especially favorable political and military prerequisites for this purpose.

2.) For the preparation of the cooperation, it is necessary to strengthen the Japanese war potential by all means

For this purpose, the High Commands of the branches of the Armed Forces must meet in a comprehensive and generous way, the demands of the Japanese concerning the communication of German warfare and combat experiences and assistance in matters of war economy and technics. Reciprocity is desired, but must not render the negotiations more difficult. These requests by the Japanese which might effect the conduct of the war in a short time must naturally be put in the foreground.

In special cases the Fuehrer reserves the decision for himself.

3.) The alignment of the mutual plans of operation is a matter for the High Command of the Navy.

For this, the following guiding principles are to be followed:

- a) It must be emphasised that it is the common goal of the war to force England down rapidly in order to keep the U.S.A. out of the war. As for the rest, Germany has neither political nor military or economic interests in the Far East, which might give rise to reservations with regard to the intentions of the Japanese.
- b) The great successes achieved by Germany in economic warfare, makes it particularly advisable to employ strong Japanese forces for the same purpose. Moreover any possibility of assistance for German economic warfare must be utilized.
- c) The rare material situation of the Treaty Powers requires that Japan seizes those territories which she needs, - especially if the U.S. intervenes - , for the continuation of the war. The deliveries of crude rubber must be carried on even after Japan enters the war, since they are of vital importance for Germany.
- d) The conquest of Singapore, England's key position in the Far East, would mean a decisive success for the active warfare of the Three Powers.

Besides, attacks on other systems of bases of the English sea power - of the American sea power only if the entrance of the U.S.A. into the war cannot be avoided - will serve to shake the enemy's power system there and, just as in the case of attacks on the sea lanes, will bind essential forces of every kind. (Australia).

A date for the beginning of discussions on operational matters cannot as yet be set.

4.) The military committee to be formed in accordance with the Three-Power-Fact are to deal only with such questions which concern equally the three participating powers. In the first place the tasks of economic warfare will belong into that group.

It is up to the "Main Committee" assisted by the High Command of the Wehrmacht to make decisions in individual cases.





Der Führer hat für die Zusammenarbeit mit Japan folgendes befohlen:

1.) Das Ziel der durch den Drei-Mächte-Pakt begründeten Zusammenarbeit muss es sein, Japan so bald wie möglich zum aktiven Handeln im Fernen Osten zu bringen. Starke englische Kräfte werden dadurch gebunden, das Schwergewicht der Interessen der Vereinigten Staaten von Amerika wird nach dem Pazifik abgelenkt.

Die Erfolgssichten für Japan werden angesichts der noch unentwickelten Kriegsbereitschaft seiner Gegner um so grösser sein, je früher es zum Zingreifen kommt. Das Unternehmen "Barbarossa" schafft hierfür besonders günstige politische und militärische Voraussetzungen.

2.) Zur Vorbereitung der Zusammenarbeit ist es erforderlich, die japanische Wehrkraft mit allen Mitteln zu stärken.

Hierzu ist von den Oberkommandos der Wehrmachtteile den japanischen Wünschen auf Mitteilung deutscher Kriegs- und Kampferfahrungen und Unterstützung wehrwirtschaftlicher und technischer Art in umfassender und grosszügiger Weise zu entsprechen. Gegenseitigkeit ist erwünscht, darf aber nicht die Verhandlungen erschweren. Im Vordergrund stehen hierbei natürgemäß diejenigen japanischen Anträge, die sich in kurzer Zeit für die Kriegsführung auswirken können.



1. A top secret directive to Wehrmacht and Navy signed by KEITEL.

b. Japan's military power has to be strengthened by the disclosure of German war experiences and support of a military economic and technical nature has to be given.

c. The common aim to beat England quickly and keep the U.S. out of the war must be stressed and the Japanese told that Germany has no other interests in the Far East.

d. The seizure by the Japanese of territories rich in war materials of Singapore is of prime importance.

e. The plan Barbarosa (war against Russia) is mentioned in the order as creating specially favorable political and military conditions for Japanese intervention in the Far East.

The Fuehrer has issued the following directives for the cooperation with Japan:

1.) The aim of the cooperation based on the Three-Power-Pact, must be to bring Japan, as soon as possible, to active operations in the Far East. Large English forces will hereby be immobilized, the center of the U.S.A. interest will be diverted to the Pacific.

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2.) For the preparation of the cooperation, it is necessary to strengthen the Japanese war potential by all means

For this purpose, the High Commands of the branches of the Armed Forces must meet in a comprehensive and generous way, the demands of the Japanese concerning the communication of German warfare and combat experiences and assistance in matters of war economy and technics. Reciprocity is desired, but must not render the negotiations more difficult. These requests by the Japanese which might effect the conduct of the war in a short time must naturally be put in the foreground.

In special cases the Fuehrer reserves the decision for himself.

- 3.) The alignment of the mutual plans of operation is a matter for the High Command of the Navy.

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- b) The great successes achieved by Germany in economic warfare, makes it particularly advisable to employ strong Japanese forces for the same purpose. Moreover any possibility of assistance for German economic warfare must be utilized.
- c) The raw material situation of the Treaty Powers requires that Japan seizes those territories which she needs, - especially if the U.S. intervenes - , for the continuation of the war. The deliveries of crude rubber must be carried on even after Japan enters the war, since they are of vital importance for Germany.
- d) The conquest of Singapore, England's key position in the Far East, would mean a decisive success for the active warfare of the Three Powers.

Besides, attacks on other systems of bases of the English sea power - of the American sea power only if the entrance of the U.S.A. into the war cannot be avoided - will serve to shake the enemy's power system there and, just as in the case of attacks on the sea lanes, will bind essential forces of every kind. (Australia).

A date for the beginning of discussions on operational matters cannot as yet be set.
