

2 December 1950

- 1015 General Willoughby came in.
- 1025 General Fox called and we returned the call at 1030.
- 1030 General Fox.
- 1055 Called Col. Frazier (G-3). Col. Jark later brought up some TS papers to Gen. CW.
(1130) Colonel Bunker called to report that the Laurence questions and answers had been given out to the press. I called him back later to tell him that it had not come from this office, but probably from Joe Fromm, and he said it came from David Laurence.
- 1135 Major Terrance of AFRS called to say that they had received an interview with Gen. MacArthur and wanted to know if they had permission to use it. We called back to report that the one with Hugh Baillie was better and an even better one would probably come out this afternoon.
- (1330) Col. Tait of G-2 called. They wanted Gen. Whitney to know that they have been informed that one of the Turkish correspondents is on his way back from Korea with the intention of filing news stories regarding what he feels was unfair treatment given the Turkish Brigade.
- 1400 Called Major Williamson and Col. Echols, getting neither, and asked office to send over messenger to pick up press release.
- 1510 Mr. Dwight Martin of Time Magazine received a cable from his New York office asking certain questions which he would like to get answers to from Gen. MacArthur. (Gen. Whitney said not to call back because possibly the release of the p.m. would answer some of the questions.) Mr. Martin is staying at the Press Club.
- 1740 Called Dwight Martin after several calls from him and told him he could come in to see the General right away. He came in--1750.
Finally contacted Gen. Willoughby for same...

3 December 1950

- 0955 Colonel Echols returned our call.
- 1000 Returned Air Marshall Bouchier(?)'s call and told him Gen. CW would see him any time. He will come in around 11 or 1115.

3 December 1950 (continued)

1040 Howard Handleman called.

1120 Air Marshall Baucher.

1255 Called Gen. Willoughby to tell him that Gen. CW said NOT to print article in Stars & Stripes, about which Gen. Willoughby had inquired.

1600 G-2 delivered special communication on repatriation.

4 December 1950

0905 Gen. Whitney went in to Gen. MacArthur's office. (Returned at 1145)

0908 Buck Hathaway called to see whether there had been a reconsideration re General MacArthur making a recording for their national campaign, and I reported Gen. Whitney's original answer still held--NO. (CW confirmed later to me.)

1040 Front office picked up press packs--I explained that General Whitney had not seen them yet because he has been in conference all morning with General MacArthur, and asked them to please return them. They agreed.

1515 Mrs. MacArthur called. CinC wanted to speak to Gen Whitney. Gen Whitney had already left. Called house and left message.

1600 Gen Whitney called. Asked me to locate story which CinC had heard on 3 o'clock news broadcast from San Francisco alleging Defense Minister Shinwell of England had charged Gen MacArthur had exceeded authority when he crossed 38th Parallel.

Called PIO who checked with the 3 news agencies and the AFRS, and reported the story had not yet come through. Gen Whitney told Maj Williamson to wire AFRS San Francisco for the story, but in the meantime it was located in the afternoon pack. Called PIO - told them it had been located, and suggested they send another radio cancelling previous request.

5 December 1950

- 0900 Mrs. MacArthur called reference luncheon arrangements for Governor Stassen.
Called General at home.
- 0930 Called Admiral Joy ref appointment for Gov Stassen.

General said that if Mr. Rizzo called to tell him Gov Stassen has appointment at 11 a.m. with Admiral Joy (on his own).
- 0950 Gen Whitney went to Chief of Staff's Office. Said to let him know when Gov Stassen comes at 1030.
- 1056 Gen MacArthur called. Told him Gen Whitney was in Chief of Staff's Office. Said to have him call him right away.
- 1030 Governor Stassen
- 1040 During conference with Gov Stassen, Gen Whitney asked for Questions and Answers paper; this morning's AP story concerning Arthur Krock (which we had already returned to Col Bunker's office)
- 1050 Called Admiral Joy.

Returned AP article to Col Bunker; Gov Stassen retained Questions & Answers paper.
- 1200 Howard Handelman sent up copy of teletype on US foreign policy.
- 1410 Called Mr. Garey of Time-Life (56-3907) to ask him what the question was which he wanted to ask Gen. CW. He wanted CW's reaction to Japanese reprinting of Life article "My Dear General" (interchange of ltrs between Gens. MacArthur, Whitney and Premier Yoshida). Before cabling N.Y. his recommendatn
- 1416 Called Mr. Garey to tell him Gen. felt it would be reprinted with purely political motives, and that it would be unfortunate and regrettable.
- 1435 General Stratemyer.
- 1850 Called H. Handleman.
- 1905 General Willoughby called (Gen. not here; left word).

6 December 1950

0900 Called PAL; there is mail; we are sending over for it.

0955 General Milburn.

1000 Mr. Harold E. Stassen.

1040 Returned General Allen's call re not printing article he had questioned.

1100 Mr. Bennett of the Phil.-U.S. War Damage Commission called. Wants apptm. with Gen CW (has a pckge from Mr. Osmena). Gen CW said to set him up for 6 o'clock tomorrow evening (MR. B. leaves tomorrow at midnight).

1225 Mr. Stassen.

1430 Capt Bilger fr Dependent Housing called. Said the State Department were interested in purchasing US House No. 330 (Gen Whitney's house) (after the Occupation, of course) --- wanted to know when the State Department Engineer could come out and inspect it.

The General said to let us know when he wanted to come, and we would check with Mrs. Whitney as to whether or not the time would suit her.

Capt Bilger's telephone number is 57-8670. He said it would probably be some time to-morrow.

1700 Called Mr. Young. Not available. Left message to please call in the morning, and let us know how much the General owes him for the rice he purchased for him. When he calls, please advise the General.

The General also said to ask Mr. Bettencourt how much he owes him for the paper.

1800 Lt. Rowell, son of Colonel Milo Rowell, formerly of Government Section., & friend
Lt. Rowell is stationed at Camp Zama, A Battery, 21st Anti-Aircraft.

1740 Air Vice Marshall Boucher called.

7 December 1950

- 0810 Mrs. Whitney called. Sd Gen. MacArthur had just phoned the house to ask Gen. CW to get in touch with Gen. Willoughby to ask him to be at the conference this morning.
- 0820 Called General Willoughby.
- 0830 Called various offices in C/S to check time of conference as previously announced (9 o'clock). No luck, so Major Napier went over.
- 0840 Called General Hickey at his home....
- Note: Harold said that Mrs. Whitney came over to see him last night and paid him for the paper....
- 0855 Capt Kean of C/S office called to report that conference will be held in C/S' little room at 9:30.
- 0900 Called General Willoughby.
- 0915 Mrs. Canada called--"Charlie" will attend party.
- 0940 Mr. Harold Lady called requesting appt. with Gen. CW for five minutes some time today. He may be reached at 08-1510. Told him we would call him this P.M., and if he didn't hear from us, to call back.
- 1130 Mr. Yount advised cost of rice \$30.00 (i.e. 200 lbs at 15 cents per lb) Have left message on General's desk.
- 1215 Capt. Bilger (57-3670) called to ask if 1000 Saturday morning would be all right for Mr. Callahan to come out to look at the house. He would like answer this afternoon. If he is not there, please leave message with the Corpl. who answers the phone....
- 1345 Called Mr. Lady to set up apptmt for tomorrow morning at 1045.
- 1600 Called Mr. Lady and altered appointment to 1745 this evening.
- 1430 Called Gen Willoughby. Later Mr. Bettencourt handcarried papers to him.

7 December (Cont'd)

1600 Gave Capt Curtis the \$30.00 for delivery to WOJG Young at American Embassy.

I asked the General re appointment for Mrs. Rosario D. Tuertollano of Allied Veterans Legion Inc. (Hotel Yashima, Rm. 201, 24-0177). He said to call and say that he was extremely busy at the present -- would she let us know what questions or matters she wishes to take up with the General, and we will let him know, etc. etc.

However, I called but was not able to contact her. Left message at the Hotel to call Gen Whitney's office.

1730 Called Gen Willoughby at Imperial Hotel.

8 December

Called Capt Bilger, and told him it would be alright for the State Dept Engineer (Mr. Callahan) to come to the house any time between 12 noon and 3 p.m. to-day. I told him Mrs. Whitney would not be there, but that she had told the maids to show him around. Capt Bilger called back later to say that Mr. Callahan would be out shortly after 12 o'clock.

1100 Gen Willoughby's office called. Said they were sending up some papers for Gen Whitney.

1210 Capt Pagnotta from G-2 brought up some papers for the General. Called him later and he came up and collected same.

1215 General Willoughby.

Mrs. Carnes called to accept invitation for Richard's party for Bob Carnes.

8 December (Cont'd)

1310 Called Coal Order number and ordered 5 tons large-size coal for U.S. House 330.

1650 Mrs. Tuertollano of Allied Veterans Legion Inc. said that she has something for Gen. CW and also has a confidential message for him from them. She spoke as though she couldn't return to the Philippines until she has talked with him.

1700 Called Mrs. Tuertollano and made apptmt. for her Sunday a.m. 1030.

1815 Called Mr. Lady.

2045 Returned General Willoughby's several calls.

9 December 1950

1110 General Willoughby.

Mr. Rizzo advised appointment for Mr. Hugh Moffatt of Time & Life for to-morrow morning (Sunday) at 1045.

11 December 1950

Dr. Ralph Reid called and said he would like to drop in for a moment and say good-bye to the General, as he is returning to the States in the morning.

1500 Capt Boydston from Signals (Crypto) called to say General Whitney's ETA at Haneda was 1715. Advised Maj Napier immediately, who advised Mrs. Whitney and is making all other arrangements.

Capt Harper called from Furniture Repair to say the toaster which the Sgt brought in for repair is ready to be picked up. Left note for Mrs Whitney.

1400 Gen Willoughby called. Left message he had called.

1815 Gen Whitney returned to office.

1816 Called Howard Handelman

1820 Howard Handelman called. General read statement to him.

1835 Called Mr. Randell, ABC, at Correspondents Club. Gen read statement to him.

12 December 1950

Capt Kennedy (WAC) from PIO called and asked if the General would prepare a letter of commendation for Major Williamson in connection with his work through the Korean campaign, coordination of activities, etc. This was requested by Col Echols in connection with recommendations for PIO awards he was preparing. I gave the information to Major Napier who will take up with the General

0930 Called Gen Back

0945 Called Mr. Felipe Buencamino at Teito Hotel.

1030 General called urgently to meeting in Gen Hickey's Chief of Staff Conference Room

Capt Curtis is having ltr to Mr. Reed copied.

12 December (Continued)

Gen Whitney called Maj Williamson and asked that he send up reactions, as soon as they came in, to Gen MacArthur's statement yesterday on the Korean situation.

Reference previous entry re letter of commendation for Maj Williamson -- Maj Napier reported that the General said he would take no action unless Col Echols took the matter up with him personally. Refer any queries to Maj Napier.

1805 Returned General Back's call.

Col. Hightower borrowed our file copy of the Herald-Tribune scathing article for General Hickey. 1820--returned it.

1825 Returned General Willoughby's call.

13 December 1950

1020 Col Mahoney called from Gajo-in Hotel.

1130 Letter was delivered from Pal.

1455 Called Colonel Canada.

1732 Courier brought a Personal letter for General Whitney "to be delivered before six o'clock".

1808 Returned Mr. Moffat's call and told him Gen. would be glad to see Mr. Gottfried right away.

1815 Mr. Gottfried.

1820 Mr. Rizzo called and asked that Mr. Gottfried wait until his arrival, because he wants to help him get air passage to Korea tomorrow.

1910 Miss Shellenberger called to decline party invitation; had previous plans, but appreciated invitation.

- 1020 Colonel Echols.
- 1106 Called Mr. Moffett of Time-Life.
- 1122 Colonel Echols returned our call.
- 1129 Colonel Goodfellow.
- 1155 Col. Bunker called.
- 1215 G-2 delivered mssge re enemy's awareness of our position.
- 1208 Called Colonel Bunker.
- 1218 WCL-32306 was put into an envelope to be picked up by Air Marshall Bauchier (26-8481) who talked to the Gen. on phone at 1212.
- 1240 Russell Brines called.
- Had hand-carried to Col. Goodman at Imperial: copies of CinC's mssges to Arthur Krock, Barry Farris, David Lawrence and Hugh Baillie
- 1445 Mr. Mahoney returned call. Would be at Gajo-en until 1700 hrs.
- 1450 Called Col Goodfellow at Rm 180 Imperial Hotel. Not in.

14 December (Cont'd)

- 1455 Called Gen Willoughby. General asked him to come up.
- 1500 Called Col Echols.
- 1520 Called Gen Willoughby's office. Told his secretary that the General could not wait any longer - had not been out to lunch yet - but that there had been a very strong attack made against Gen Willoughby, and the General thought Col Goodfellow (who was returning to the U.S. in the morning) might be able to do some good. Secretary advised that Gen Willoughby had just gone to his quarters - said we understood he was coming up here, but said they did not know anything about that. Gen Whitney then left for lunch.
- 1730 Air Vice Marshall Boucher. Spent over an hour with the General.
- 1800 Col Myers G-2 asked if he could come up and see the General. The General said not to call back,
- 1840 Col Echols.

15 December 1950

- 1000 Col Canada came up to see the General. The General is not well to-day and is running a temperature.
- 1100 Mr. Kazamayer called from Rm 505, Gajoen Hotel. He is a friend of Admiral Decker who had written to the General ~~in the General's~~ that he was coming. Set him up for appointment at 1100 to-morrow morning. (Kogyo Club)
Mr. Kazamayer asked me to contact Mr. Toda at the Industrial Club/(23-1546/9) and request him to get in touch with him, which I did.
- 1345 Called Mr. Hoberecht.
- 1620 Called IBM to request repairman check the machine. No power will come through either through a direct plug-in, or through the variac. They will send someone tonight if possible, or Monday morning.
- 1750 Returned General Back's call.

Telephone repairmen to come in this evening after duty hours; rip up carpeting and put in new wiring for Gen's tel. which still would not work after 2 hrs repair this afternoon.

15 December, 1950

1853 Col Myers, G-2, called. General said not to call back.

16 December 1950

0930 Called Mr. Hoberecht

Telephone repairmen asked that we let them know when the General leaves this afternoon. They have a few finishing touches to take care of.
Their telephone No. 26-8242.

1030 Changed Mr Kazmayer's appointment from 1100 to-day to 1800 this evening.
Later called him at the Gajoen Hotel (49-3111 Ext 505) to ask him if he could make it at 1830, but he had already left the Hotel.
Left message for him to call. If he does, ask him to come in at 1830; if not, when he comes in this evening, explain to him what happened, and tell him the General will be in as soon as possible.

Note: Telephone men finished their work on General's phone today.

18 December 1950

Note: Mr. Rizzo informed me that Mr. Mahoney has an apptmt. w/ Gen. CW tomorrow at 1100 with Geo. C. Matsumoto, JLJC. Marked the calendars. (Mr. Mahoney will pick up an envelope which the Gen. gave us, with some of his own corres. in). See file folder.

0930 General went out of office. (Returned 1100.)

1030 Mr. Handleman called to say he is sending pkg of clippings on Gen. MacArthur's statement to Mr. Faris, which Mr. Faris thought Gen. CW might like to see.... (Arrived 1105)

1032 A package was delivered to the Gen. from Sr. Peralta.

1100 Called Mrs. Whitney who was not at home. Left word for her to call.

1101 General Back called. Came up a few minutes later.

18 December 1950 (Continued)

- 1230 A ltr from John Canson, Manila, was brought in by two young men who had hand-carried it from Manila.
- 1445 Messrs. Panton & Shaw, from DAILY EXPRESS LONDON brought in editorial defending Gen MacArthur's position in Korea (Daily Express dtd 6 Dec 1950) -- Mr. Randell of ABC had told them Gen Whitney would be interested in the article. They said they would very much like to see the General, when he can spare a moment. They are staying at the Marunouchi Hotel.

21 December 1950

21 December 1950 (Continued)

1005 Called General Back.

1035 Mr. Folster of NBC called again; we returned the call at 1050. (He said Mr. Dunn was leaving for Manila.)

1110 Colonel Echols.

Note: Captain Curtis is looking into the matter of a silk UN flag for the General. He reports that QM has requested permission to make eight more silk flags, but have not received approval yet. When approval does come through, it will take six to eight weeks thereafter to make them.

1210 Mr. Bautista (had to wait because General was in Front Office).

1830 Col Reid of G-1 called to inform the General that General Officers would be at airport to-morrow morning at 1040 to meet remains of General Walker.

23 December 1950 (Cont'd)

1800 Called Colonel Strother, Chief, TI&E, at his home. Told him Gen Collins letter to Gen MacArthur had not appeared in this evening's Stars and Stripes as PIO had indicated it would be, and asking him to be sure it would appear in to-morrow's issue.

1010 General Whitney departed for airport with General Wright to be present at formation to meet remains of the late Lt. General Walton H. Walker, killed in jeep accident yesterday in Korea. Returned 12 noon.

I asked if they had a Florida address for him, but he said no, that he was leaving Florida this week, would be spending 2 weeks with his brother in Pinehurst, N.C. and thence to Washington for a medical check-up. The General said "never mind."

Finally located a clipping in our Newspaper Clippings file --- a Japan News item dated 13 Jan 51 entitled "MacArthur Not Muzzled".

27 March (Continued)

Signal Corps delivered pictures we had ordered yesterday, but the caption still had given General Whitney a middle initial. Told Gen Back's secretary who said she would see it did not happen again.

0945 Mr. O. K. Armstrong (Representative from Missouri) was in. Would like to see General Whitney later in the day. If he does call or come in again today, the General will see him at 1745 tonight or at 1100 tomorrow.

1020 Called Mr. Handelman. Not in; left message for him to call the General.

1050 Called Colonel Williamson. Asked if he had the INS Hutchison story from Washington. Handelman had mentioned it to the General. Will look for it and send it up. (Williamson's secretary gave me the latter information as the Colonel was not in.)

General wanted to know what AFP stood for. Translated: Agency French Press.

1100 General Sams was in.

1130 Mr. Moffett of Time Magazine came in.


1150 Mr. Handelman called.

1200 Col. Telesco came in.

1350 Mr. Rutherford Poates telephoned.

30 March 1951

- 0840 Called PIO (Col Williamson) and told him that as from to-day the General wants to receive all press packs; that he will go through them and pick out those of interest (PIO have previously been doing this); and that he (Gen Whitney) will see that Colonel Bunker receives them all by 1045 each morning.
- 0900 Called Capt Sessions at PIO to check as to whether he had received the above message from Col Williamson. Said he had, and would see that the instructions were carried out each morning.
- 0915 Air Vice Marshal Bouchier telephoned.
- 0925 Called Signal Office (Gen Back's secretary) and asked if they had any pictures of the trip to Korea of the 24th. (After each trip they usually send up the pictures, but have not seen any of last trip).
Said she would check with Gen Back and let us know.
- Capt Curtis is having copied (original and 2) press packs dealing with reactions abroad to General MacArthur's March 24th statement.
- 1030 Called JAPAN NEWS (57-9332) and declined invitation of Editor-in-Chief, Mr. Gordon Jenkins, for Gen and Mrs Whitney for first anniversary celebration at Industrial Club on 10 April 1951
- 1035 The General told me to tell Miss Ruth Hays to watch the newspapers very closely for reactions to Gen MacArthur's March 24th statement --- which I did.
- 1145 Called Philippine Airlines. Nothing in to-day's mail for the General. I advised him.
- 1245 Put in a call to Ambassador Muccio in Pusan, Korea for General Lowe.
(Procedure: Dialed 2633, asked for Korea operator, told her Ambassador Muccio was at the US Embassy in Pusan -- put me through in a couple of minutes).
- 1245 Called General Fox, Deputy Chief of Staff. Gen Fox has someone with him. His aide, Mr. Perry, will call us when he is through.



March 30, 1951 (cont'd)

1305 General Fox called.

1310 Called Col. Bunker to find out if the CinC was free. Gen. Whitney left for front office.

March 31, 1951

0910 Mr. Handelman called. General busy.

0930 Called Mr. Handelman.

1050 Called General Wright. Not available but will call General Whitney soon. General Wright called.

1210 Called Mr. Hoberecht.

1415 Left for CinC's office.

1440 Mr. Rizzo called. Discussed appointment for Mr. Smith, Editor of the San Francisco Chronicle at 1800 today.

1530 Called Gen. Lowe.

1800 Mr. Smith came in.

April 1, 1951

0815 I called PIO in an effort to track down a "flimsy" on the MacArthur "controversy". Was released by a "conservative" London paper and upheld MacArthur's statement. I remember seeing it but couldn't find a copy of it among those we had typed up. PIO will send up a copy.

April 2, 1951

Mr. Hurd coming in at 1800 this evening.

1100 Mr. Smith of San Francisco Chronicle came in.

1125 Gen Willoughby called; later at 1145.

2 April 1951 (Cont'd):

1310 Colonel Myers.

Miss Helen Loeb advised appointment on Wednesday, 4 April at 1100 for Mr. Irie, Chief of H.R. Legal Bureau and the 5 other members of Legislative Services Mission which returned from U.S. on Saturday.

Col Napier had told Miss Loeb that either Tues or Wed morning would suit the the General, so she set them up for Wednesday morning.

Marked on our calendar and the General's.

3 April 1951

General Whitney absent from the office to-day .

Howard Handelman called several times. Said I would let him know when the General returned.

Lt. Richstatter advised that plane departed at 1625 and expected time of arrival is 1850. Plane 8613 at Haneda Air Field.

1900 Gen. Willoughby called. Wanted the General to call when he came in.

4 April 1951

0900 Col. Skyler (Stars & Stripes) called.

0905 I called Lt. Richstatter. General wanted copy of telegram to General MacArthur from the "Freeman", Washington, D. C., signed by Henry Hazollit (?) and received 2 or 3 days ago.

0910 Called PAL and there was no mail for the General from Manila.

1020 Mr. Hoberecht of UP called. General was busy.

General had me call Col. Williamson for copy of "Dispatch from Korea explaining the demobilization of part of the Korean reserve forces as a decision of the Korean Government and why".

1030 Called General Back. Not in but will call General Whitney upon arrival. He called later.

4 April 1951 (cont'd)

- 1045 Mr. Rendell of American Broadcasting Co. came in; as the General was busy has made an appointment with him at 1200 today.
- 1100 Called Col. Williamson on telegram acquired earlier from "Rich". In telegram reference was made to NY Times dispatch of 31 Mar from Taegu to the effect that "arms had been refused 400,000 South Korean enlistees and why". The General wanted to know if a copy had been retained by our censors of same. He advised that they would look and forward same. Later; General has copy.
- 1100 Mr. Irie, Chief, HR Legal Bureau & group were in.
- 1200 Mr. Rendell of ABC came in.
- 1205 Helen Lambert called. General busy so got her number. 26-7281. (Press Club)
- 1220 Gen. Sams called and will be over in about 10 minutes.
- We previously had notation on the calendar for April 4th to remind the General to send birthday message to Mr. Hearst --- however, Mr. Faris had given the General the wrong date ---- have now made notation on our calendar and the General's for the 28th --- (birthday is on the 29th).
- 1500 Mrs Lambert called again -- General in CinC's office -- said she wanted to talk to him about the overall plan for the Youth Organizations in Japan. Said she would call again at about 4 o'clock. I mentioned it to the General when he returned -- he said to tell her to contact Col Nugent of CI&E -- that the matter was out of his province, but that he would be glad to be of any help. However, she did not call again.

5 April 1951

- 0915 Called Gen. Wright. Wasn't in but will call back. Gen. Wright called later.
- 0920 Gen. Willoughby called.
- Called Lt. Richstatter for copy of Radio DA 87359. Never did see contents of same. Has been returned at which time picked up letter from Mr. Fromm, 4 April, containing set of questions asked by Dave Lawrence.

5 April 1951 (cont'd)

0950 Mr. Hoberecht called.

1050 Mr. Coniff of INS called.

1100 Mr. Handelman called.

1105 Mr. Brien of AP called.

1125 Mr. Coniff of INS came in.

1130 I called Col. Williamson for copy of UP dispatch (this date) by Stewart Hensley in Washington - - - reporting that General MacArthur had been authorized to release air attach on Chinese basis if the Reds sent in their full Air Force against the UN Troops in Korea. Gen. Whitney is going to call Capt. Thompson on it as soon as he has read it.

1140 Mr. Handelman called and said he now has the story on the interview with the London Daily Telegram. Gen. busy so put note on his desk to that effect.

1145 Called Col. Williamson to advise him that Howard Handelman is sending him a story right away, from London by a military commentator for the Daily Mail quoting General MacArthur. General Whitney wants a copy.

1145 I called Gen. Hicky to see if he were available to Gen. Whitney. Was still at the "briefing" at that time;

Capt Curtis checked with the Postal Officer reference official mail to the Philippines, or other foreign countries:

Procedure: If we have official mail for Philippines or other foreign countries, we must address in plain envelope, and hand-carry to Rm 253 this building (Mail Room) where they will insert the stamps. (This is of course unless it is addressed to an APO, Embassy, etc.) Official mail to an individual in the U.S. may be sent in franked envelope.

1800 Mr Handelman telephoned.

1815 Called PIO - asked them to send up INS release Mr. Handelman had discussed with the General.

10 April 1951

During the morning the General talked with Messrs. Hoberecht, Brines, Handelman, and John Rich of NBC.

1105 Called General Wright.

1320 Mr. Brines called again. Called him back at home: 33-5720.

1322 Gen. Willoughby called to find out if the General had received the booklet he forwarded last night. Later the General advised that he had and would call Gen. Willoughby later.

Capt Curtis just advised that in future when we have anything to be via NWA, if we will telephone Mr. Sykes (23-5463 -- I entered number in our book under NWA) he will send a boy over to collect it.
