### LAW RELATING TO NEWSPAPERS.

1. Subscribers and advertisers, who do not give express notice to the contrary, are held responsible for the continuance of their subscriptions and advertisements.

2. If subscribers order the discontinuance of their periodicals, the publisher may continue to send them until all arrears are paid.

3. If subscribers refuse or neglect to take papers from the office to which they are directed, they are held responsible until they have settled their bills.

4. If subscribers move to other places without informing the publishers, and the papers are sent to their former direction, the subscribers are responsible.

5. The courts have decided that refusing to take periodicals from the office or removing or leaving them uncollected is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

6. If persons pay in advance for a newspaper or quarterly advertisement, they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the end of the time that they do not wish to continue taking it, otherwise the publisher is authorized to send it on, and the subscriber will be responsible until an express notice and payment of arrears is sent to the publisher.

7. Any person who receives a newspaper and makes use of it, whether he ordered it or not, is held in law to be a subscriber.
