We are making St. Louis, Chicago and Philadelphia distribnting points; and will deliver free of freight charges to transfer companies, at either of these places. all orders in car lots, to be'shipped from Huntsville on the dates named below. Drayage charges at these points to be paid by the purchaser.
For St. Louis-Early shipments from September 20th to October 10th; late shipments from October 25th to December 10th, and in Spring.
For Chicago-In Spring.
For Philadelphia-November 1st and in Spring.
These orders will be packed in Hnnteville, and those for less than car lots will be combined to make up car lots and shipped to these points and distributed promptly to the varions railroads centering there. ## PEACH TREES--On Poach, Leading Varioties.

Our Peach Trees are budded on seedlings grown from Tennessee and Alabama Pits. They are free from aphis or root-knots, and have fewer borers than those from most nurseries.

We can supply beautiful medium and small-sized peach trees this year. The lands upon which our peach trees are grown produces a light, well-matured tree, with fine roots. These trees will answer well the purpose of "June Buds," and are very much better to transplant, as they will be well matured to the terminal bud, while June Buds are often tender at the tips. The little trees we offer should not be confounded with the little culls left after the larger trees have been dug and offered so cheaply by other nurseries. Our peach trees have been grown with especial reference to the Southern trade, where small sizes are mostly wanted. The Yellows and Rosette are unknown in this locality, and we have been careful not to bring in any buds from affected localities.

## Terms and Conditions Governing Quotations in the Price List of the Huntsville Uholesale Nurseries.

Rates.-As we send this list to the trade only, we make the differonce iu prices hetween the 10 , 100 and 1000 rates very slight-simply sufficient, as a rule. to cover the difference in the expense of handling in the smaller numhers. We uniformly tie in hunches of 10 , wheu consistent with the order, and we suggest to our customers to make their orders for varieties in multiples of 10 as far as practicahle. Orders for 50 and not over 300 trees, if for not less than 10 of a variety, will he charged at the rate per hundred. orders requiring 300 trees or more, and not less than 10 of a variety, will he filed at the lowest quoted prices. Orders for less than 10 treos of one varioty, will he charged at the rate per ten.
Season.-Our packing and shipping season begins hy the zoth of Stoptemher, and continues until ahout the first of \$larch.
We have great advantages to offer here in early shipments for the North in Spring. We do not accept orders for trees we do not grow, as we never huy trees to sell again. You can depend upon us for fresh dug trees. Each order is takeu up separately, aud not until it is wanted for shipment.
Shipping Directions. - We respectfully heg our patrons to furnish us with explicit directions as to shipping, aud the mode of conveyance hy which they desire trees forwarded. When no particular directions are given. we forward according to the best of our judgment. But in no case do we assume any responsibility as to safe delivery and condition of Trees and Plants after a proper shipment hy us.
Release. - When prepayment of freight is not required, we will Release and Guarantee, and take forwarler's receipt and mail to consignee. It is left to the option of the shipper of trees over some railroads, whether he will release them or not under the clause "Value less than 85.00 per $100 \mathrm{l} \mathrm{bs}^{\circ}$." If released under this clause, the freight is less on roads governed hy this classification, and we will assume it to he proper to make this release, without reference to the value of the trees, naless instructed to the contrary. This clause does not apply upon roads ninder some of the district classifications, and hecanse of this confusion we will not he held responsible for any oversight to release, unless instructed hy our customers. C'laims for delay or loss must he made to the forwarders.

Packages.-The cost of package must be added to the prices quoted in this list, as follows:

Boxes 30 inches square, from 71/2 to 9 feet long, as the trees ray require, each 2.50 ; hoxes 24 inches, 2.00 ; hozes 18 inches, 81.50 ; hales from 25 c . to 75 c . each.

Packing.-Goods will he packed in moss, and especial care taken to insure their arrival in the hest condition.

Assortments. - We do not require enstomers to take an assortment they do not wish, hnt will sell one variety alone if desired. If any suhstitution can be allowed, either in grade or variety, it should he so stated when making the order. As a rule we do not suhstitnte without permission.

Cadtion. - We accept all orders npon the condition that they shall he void, should any injnry befall the trees from frost, hail, storm, fire, or other causes over which we have no control

Terms.-Cash. When desired, we will allow 30 to 60 days from date of shipment to responsihle,
prompt-paying customers. Parties with whom we bave had no husiness transactions. will save time hy sending reference, with order. We wish it expressly understood that payment is expected from the first collections made. and the time named is only intended as so many days of grace in which to make returns. To northern customers, who wish to lay in stock for Spriug trade, we will ship late in Fall or early in Spring, and allow time fcr paymeut till May 15th. If shipment is required in the Fall for Spring use, a note is to be given upon receipt of the trees. We do not allow any discount for cash, hut we make our prices low to command cabh, or prompt returus. In orders when the time is not mentionerl, 30 days is to he understood. Interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum must he paid on over due accounts. Should prices he changed, either higher or lower, during the season, the prices ruling at the time the order is made, are expected to stand.
Forms of Payment.-All hills are payahle at the office of the seller, and remittances should he made hy drafts on New York, Chicago or St. Louis, or hy money orders on eome Expresp Company, or hy postal orders. We will, however, accept checks from those of our customers who may he located at places having no hanking, express or postal facilities, provided they make them in every case payable "with exchange", or add $1 / 4$ of one cent. to the amount of the hill for the cost of collection.
Grades.-We grade very carefully, in some cases hy caliper, in others hy height. When graded hy hoth caliper and height, the caliper must govern, as the height then named is only to be considered approximately. When graded hy leight or caliper, we include the lower numher and exclude the higher. Instance: in a grade of 4 to 5 feet trees, the 4 feet trees are included, hut not the 5 feet trees. If 5 feet trees are wanted, the 5 to 6 feetgrade must he ordered.
Guarantee of Genuineness.- While we exercise the greatest diligence and care to have all our Trees, etc., true to lahel, and hold ourselves in readiness, on proper proof, to replace all trees, etc.. that may prove untrue to lahel, free of charge, or refund the amount paid. it is mutually understood and agreed to, hetween the purchaser and ourselves, that our guarantee of genuineness shall in no case make us liahle for any sum greater than that originally received for said trees, etc., that shall prove untrue.
ACCEPTANCE.-Notice should he sent us hy telegraph, at our expense, if there is any cause of complaint, or should the trees he refused, stating reasons. (laims for deduction, from whatever cause, will receive consideration only when made promptly upon the receipt of the trees. If trees show any signs of shrivelling upon arrival, they can usually he restored hy heing thoroughly watered and huried entirely under the ground for two or three days. Should there be any frost in the trees upon arrival, they should not he removed from the box until the frost is all out. The hoz should he placed in the cellar or protected in some other way.
