

Distributing Points.

We are making St. Louis, Chicago and Philadelphia distributing points; and will deliver free of freight charges to transfer companies, at either of these places, all orders in car lots, to be shipped from Huntsville on the dates named below. Drayage charges at these points to be paid by the purchaser.

For St. Louis-Early shipments from September 20th to October 10th; late shipments from October 25th to December 10th, and in Spring.

For Chicago-In Spring.

For Philadelphia-November 1st and in Spring.

These orders will be packed in Hnntsville, and those for less than car lots will be combined to make up car lots and shipped to these points and distributed promptly to the varions railroads centering there. This plan insures quick time and low freight rates. Orders for less than car lots must be boxed at Hnntsville. The price of boxes will be additional.

This offer to deliver to distributing points free of freight charges will not apply to less than car-lot orders, if shipment is required at other than the above named dates; but we will ship car-lot orders at any time after September 20th anywhere desired within the territory tributary to the cities designated, and will deduct from the bill the cost of freight to the nearest distributing point.

There are some borers on peach roots; but everybody knows how to get them. We have inspectors' certificate which we attach on packages when requested.

We dig each order separately and not nntil time to ship. The trees are taken to the packing-house as fast as dng and boxed immediately. We do not "heel in" anything. Everything is sent out fresh. That is worth a big per centage to the customer who is expecting his trees on time and in good condition to handle again in filling orders.

These three-year-old Plnms are very straight and handsome. They were all pruned back last Spring to short spurs. The branches are only one year's growth. It takes an expert to tell them from two-year-old trees.

PEACH TREES--On Peach, Leading Varieties.

Our Peach Trees are budded on seedlings grown from Tennessee and Alabama Pits. They are free from aphis or root-knots, and have fewer borers than those from most nurseries. We can supply beautiful medium and small-sized peach trees this year. The lands upon which our peach trees are grown produces a light, well-matured tree, with fine roots. These trees will answer well the purpose of "June Buds," and are very much better to trans-plant, as they will be well matured to the terminal bud, while June Buds are often tender at the tips. The little trees we offer should not be confounded with the little culls left after the larger trees have been dug and offered so cheaply by other nurseries. Our peach trees have been grown with especial reference to the Southern trade, where small sizes are mostly wanted. The Yellows and Rosette are unknown in this locality, and we have been careful not to bring in any buds from affected localities. any buds from affected localities.

RATES .- As we send this list to the trade only, RATES.—As we send this list to the trade only, we make the difference in prices hetween the 10, 100 and 1000 rates very slight—simply sufficient, as a rule, to cover the difference in the expense of handling in the smaller numbers. We uni-formly tie in hunches of 10, when consistent with the order, and we suggest to our customers with the order, and we suggest to our customers to make their orders for varieties in multiples of 10 as far as practicable. Orders for 50 and not over 300 trees, if for not less than 10 of a variety, will he charged at the rate per hundred. orders requiring 300 trees or more, and not less than 10 of a variety, will he filed at the lowest quoted prices. Orders for less than 10 trees of one variety, will he charged at the rate per ten.

one variety, will he charged at the rate per ten. SEASON.—Our packing and shipping season begins by the 20th of Septemher, and continues until about the first of March. We have great advantages to offer here in early shipments for the North in Spring. We do not accept orders for trees we do not grow, as we never huy trees to sell again. You can de-pend upon us for fresh dug trees. Each order is taken up separately, aud not until it is wanted for shipment.

SHIPPING DIRECTIONS.—We respectfully heg our patrons to furnish us with explicit direc-tions as to shipping, and the mode of conveyance hy which they desire trees forwarded. When no particular directions are given, we forward according to the best of our judgment. But in no case do we assume any responsibility as to safe delivery and condition of Trees and Plants often a proper shipment by us. after a proper shipment hy us.

RELEASE. -- When prepayment of freight is not required, we will Release and Guarantee, and take forwarder's receipt and mail to consignee. required, we will access that an all to consignee. It is left to the option of the shipper of trees over some railroads, whether he will release them or not under the clause "Value less than \$5.00 per 100 lbs." If released under this clause, the freight is less on roads governed hy this classification, and we will assume it to he proper to make this release, without reference to the value of the trees, nuless instructed to the con-trary. This clause does not apply upon roads ander some of the district classifications, and hecanse of this confusion we will not he held responsible for any oversight to release, unless instructed hy our customers. Claims for delay or loss must he made to the forwarders. instructed hy our customers. Claims f or loss must he made to the forwarders.

PACKAGES.—The cost of package must he added to the prices quoted in this list.as follows: Boxes 30 inches square, from 7½ to 9 feet long, as the trees may require, each \$2.50; hoxes 24 inches, \$2.00; hoxes 18 inches, \$1.50; hales from 25c. to 75c. each.


