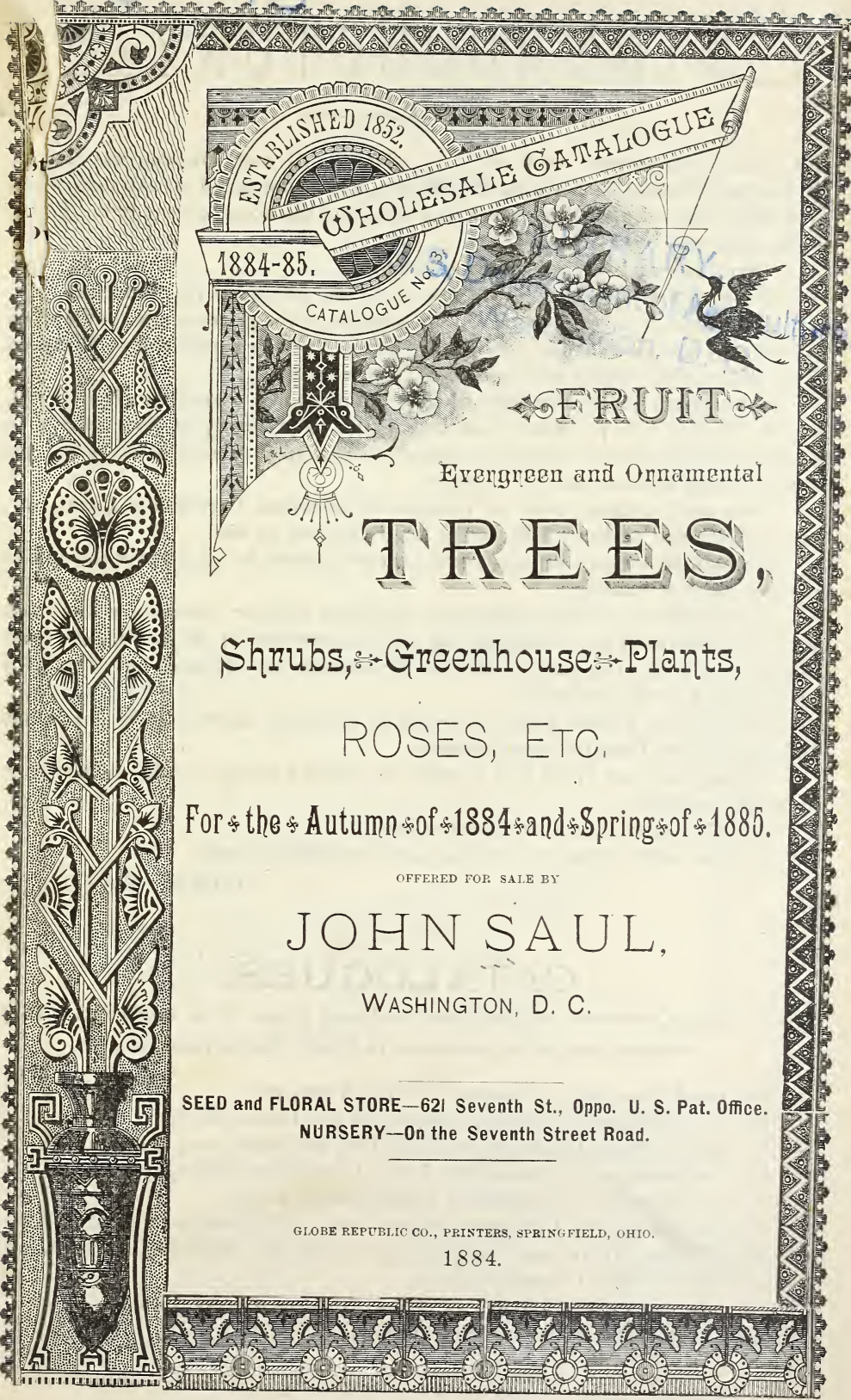

The articles in this Catalogue will be supplied at the prices annexed only when the quantity specified shall be taken. Five hundred will be supplied at the thousand rate; fifty at the hundred rate, and six at the dozen rate.

At the prices quoted the right of selection of Fruits, Plants, etc., is reserved, but the choice of the purchaser shall be adhered to as nearly as practicable. In no case will long lists of selected varieties be supplied at wholesale rates, but the usual discount allowed from retail prices.

Many small articles, such as Grapes, Strawberries, Greenhouse Plants, etc., can be forwarded perfectly safe, and at small expense, by mail.

In remitting for such articles a sufficient sum should be added over the cost to cover expense of mailing.

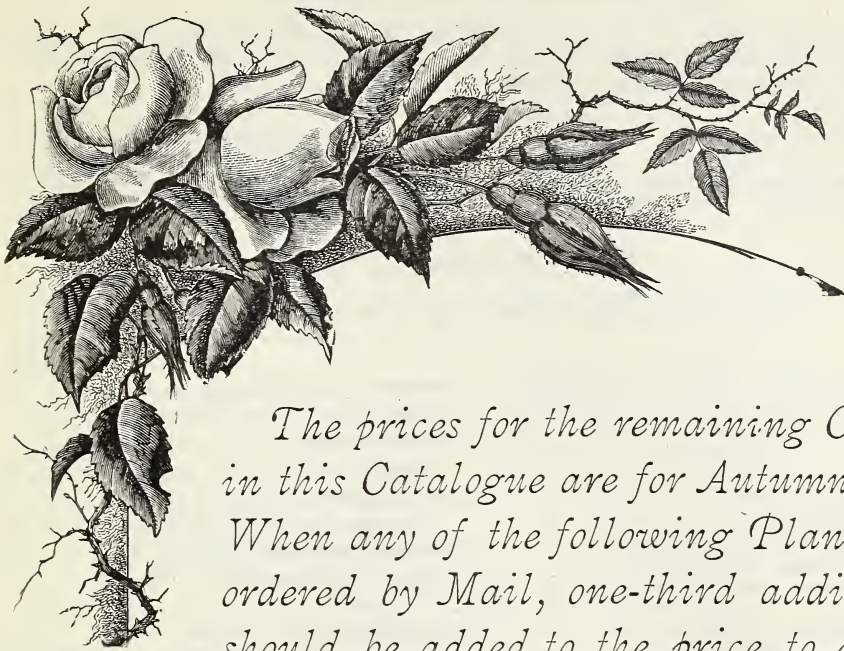

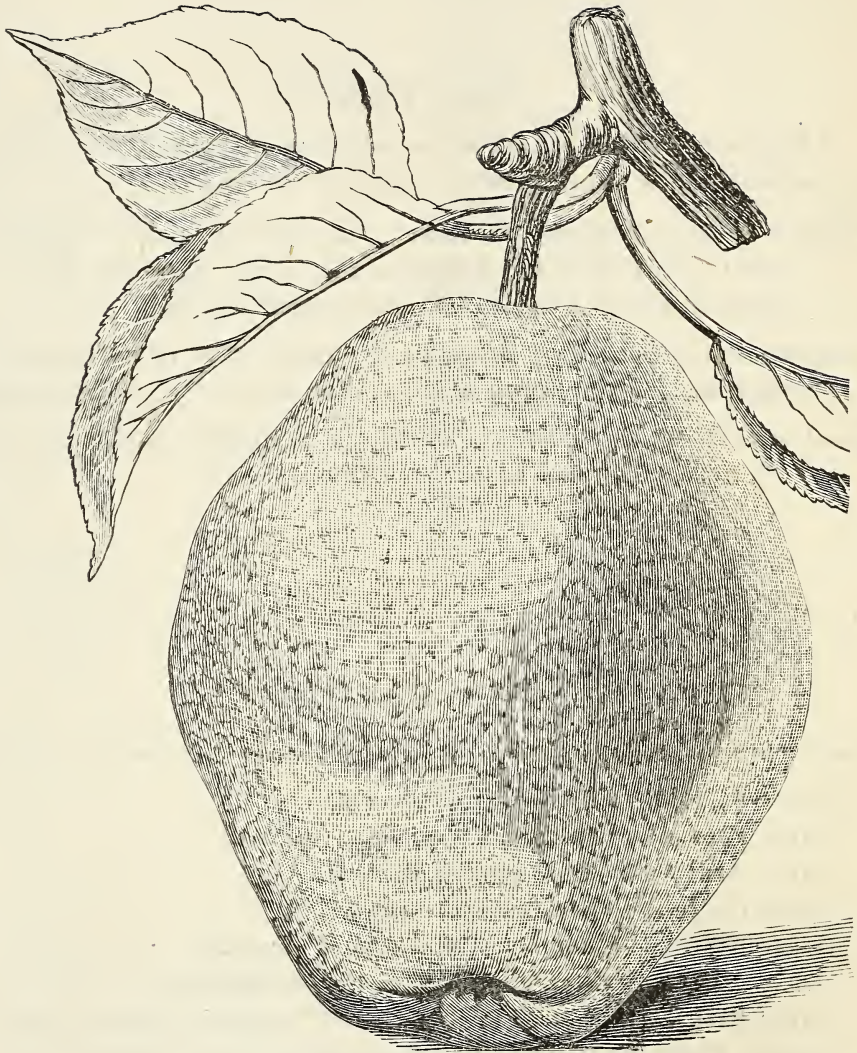
