MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, French Mission in Japan

SUBJECT : Japanese Yen Funding

1. References are:

a. Memorandum from French Mission dated 5 February 1947, subject: Japanese Yen Funding.

b. Memorandum for Allied Commissions and Delegations in Japan from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 123(27 Aug 46)ESS/FI, dated 27 August 1946, subject: Japanese Yen Currency Funding.

c. Memorandum to Chief, French Mission in Japan, dated 17 January 1947, subject: Japanese Yen Funding.

2. Letter, reference 1 a, requests a quarterly credit of ¥1,000,000 "for the payment of relief and subsidies that it pays to the various cultural and religious institutions which it helps, or supports, in Japan". In addition, an amount equal to "a minimum monthly credit of 450,000 yens" is requested. No schedules or supporting data are furnished.

3. Reference 1 a also states that "the Treasury Department and the War Department have wired instructions to SCAP's Finance Division" to attempt to aim at a satisfactory solution of the difficulties with which the French Mission is now faced. The Mission further requests the unblocking of ¥3,000,000 from "funds belonging to the French Government and deposited with the Yokohama Specie Bank". No such instructions have been received by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. Reference 1 c, paragraph 4, stated that subsequent funding for the month of January in excess of the maximum amount of ¥4,000 per capita based on accredited strength of twenty-nine would be subject to further consideration pending receipt of detailed information to be submitted in monthly "Report of Expenditures" required by funding regulations reference 1 b. Reference report has not been received. The only additional reasons for increase of yen funding set forth in reference 1 a are for the partial payment of salaries and for the payment of relief and subsidies that the French Government pays to various cultural and religious institutions.

5. The support of cultural and religious institutions, while recognized as worthy projects, cannot be classed as an Occupation Expense. The request for ¥450,000 per month plus a quarterly allowance of ¥1,000,000 cannot be favorably considered without further supporting data.

6. The request for unblocking of ¥3,000,000 from the accounts belonging to the French Government cannot be favorably considered.

2. In order that a claim for the restitution of looted property be complete, it will be necessary to submit the detailed information requested in paragraph 1 a,b,c, of the inclosed form. Any correspondence used in connection with claims for looted property must likewise include the information required in the approved claim form.

The Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, presents its compliments to the French Mission in Japan and has the honor to refer to the latter's memorandum No. 7 DST, dated October 14, 1946, with inclosed copy of a letter from Mr. F. Chevallier, concerning the release of blocked accounts belonging to the estate of the late Mr. J. Darbier.

Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government AG 386.7 (27 Nov 46) ESS/FI, SCAPIN-1364, subject, "Supplemental Instructions Relating to Guarantee of Deposits", is applicable to the subject blocked accounts. Guaranteed therein are the accounts of deposit of United Nations nationals or other non-Japanese nationals resident in Japan between December 7, 1941, and September 2, 1945, who were imprisoned, interned, or put under house arrest, or had their property taken, blocked, or sold by the Japanese Government due to their nationality or sympathies. According to the evidence submitted in the letter mentioned above, the accounts in the estate of the late Mr. Darbier are entitled to be guaranteed.

In order to effect transfer of blocked accounts guaranteed by the subject Memorandum, SCAPIN-1364, the applicant or other properly authorized representative of the applicant (in this case the estate administrator) is required to file a certificate of imprisonment or other document indicating that the subject national (in this case Mr. Darbier) was imprisoned, interned or put under house arrest. Such certificate, along with other documents pertaining to the blocked accounts, should be presented to the Banking Bureau of the Japanese Ministry of Finance which will authorize the release of said accounts.

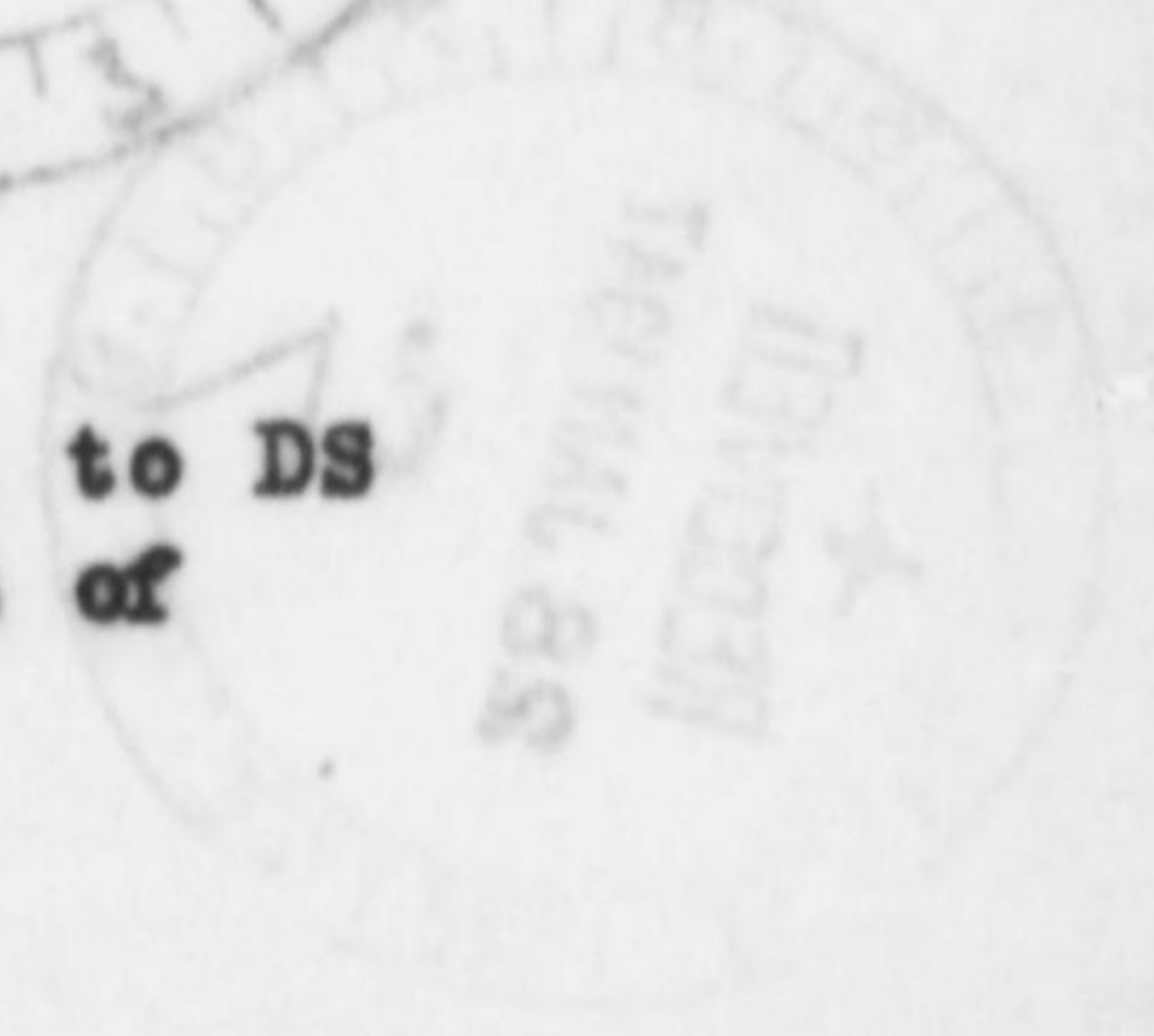
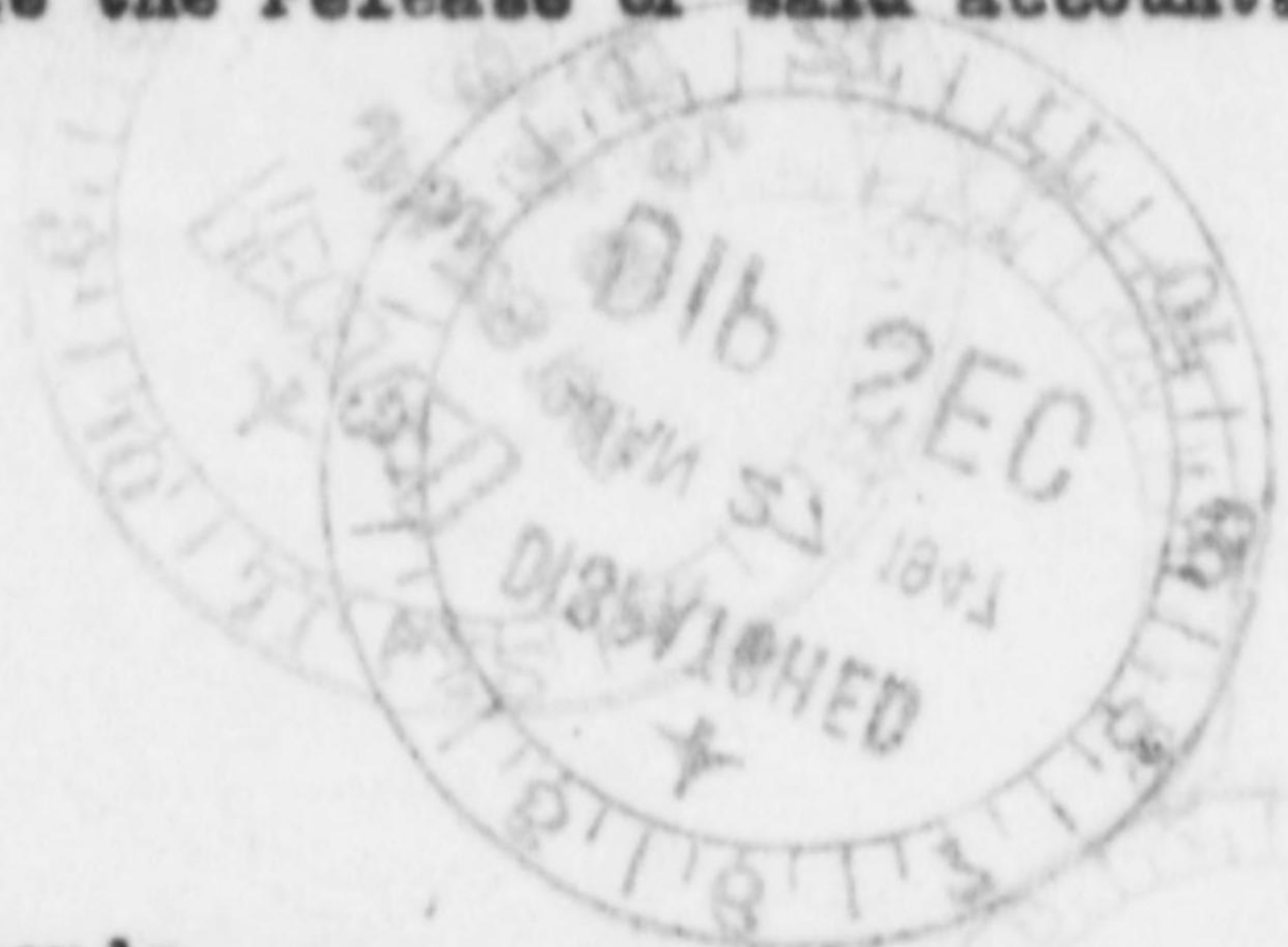

The Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers presents its compliments to the French Mission in Japan and has the honor to refer to the latter's memorandum of December 9, 1946, regarding Japanese Yen funds required by the Mission for its operation.

In connection with the Japanese currency to be supplied to the Mission by General Headquarters, it would be appreciated if the request for such funding could be resubmitted in accordance with the memorandum from General Headquarters, August 27, 1946, addressed to all Allied commissions and delegations in Japan, on the subject of Japanese Yen currency funding. If the Mission did not receive this memorandum, together with its inclosed forms, a copy will be supplied upon request. In this regard, the attention of the Mission is invited to Circular No. 13, December 12, 1946, issued by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, on the subject of procurement of controlled critical items, to which reference is made in the memorandum of August 27.

In funding operations, the sum to be furnished per capita per month is limited to W4000 unless information is furnished in detail indicating adequate reasons for exceeding that amount.

With reference to numbered paragraph 2 of the Mission's memorandum under reference, there appears to be a misunderstanding regarding the use of the blocked funds of the Saigon Branch of the Bank of Indo-China for the purpose of defraying the Mission's expenses. It is regretted that it is not at present feasible to unblock further amounts of these funds.

The "Bureau International des Poids et Mesures" has the honor to forward to the Japanese Government the "Annual Report to the Governments of the High Contracting Parties" Part one which contains the budget of the "Bureau International" and a list of the shares for the 1946 account. It is understood that those shares remain the same in gold-francs as from the General Conference of 1933.

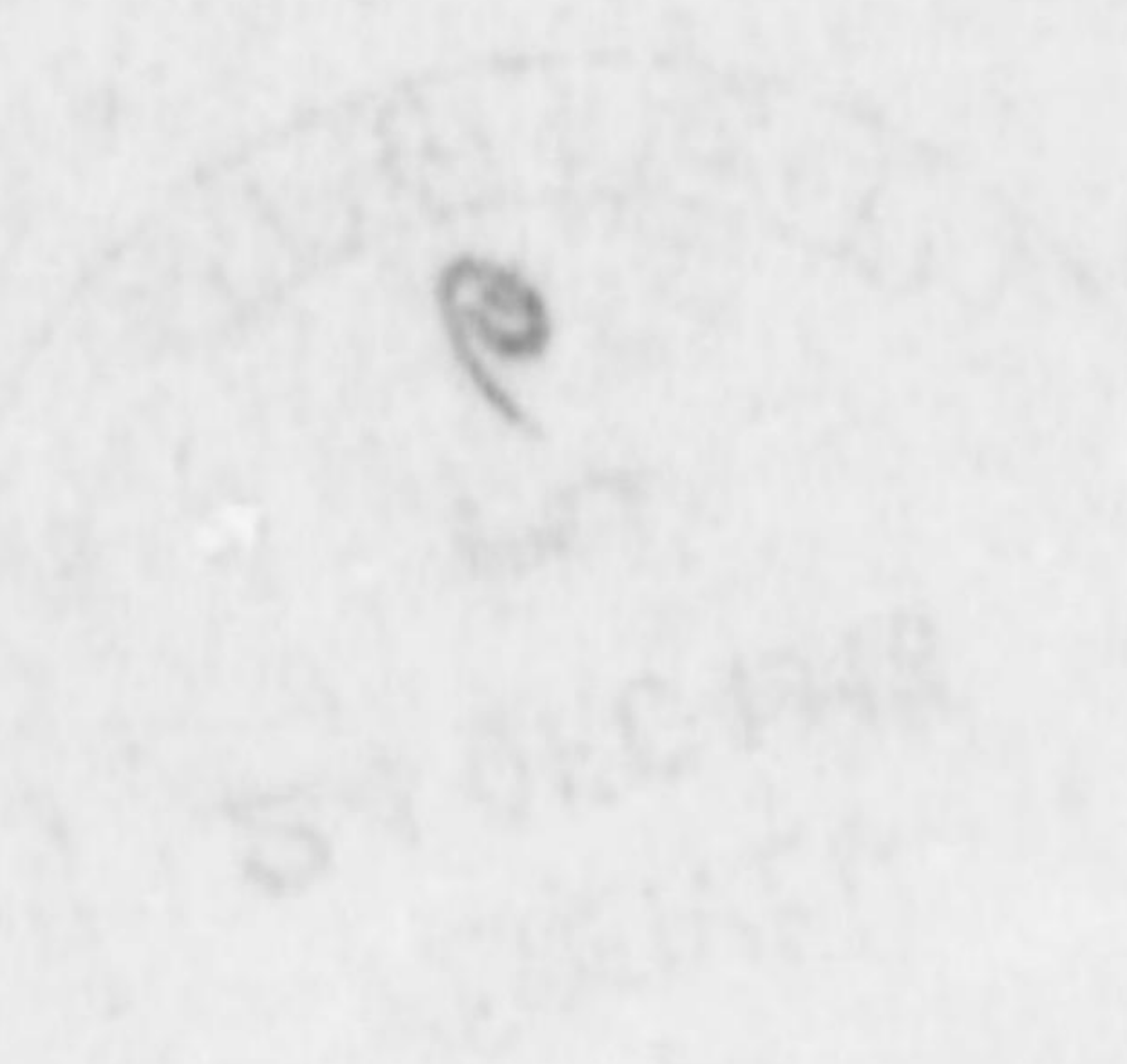

The Bureau informs the Japanese Government that the Comite International des Poids et Mesures at its sitting of November 15, 1945, voted unanimously the following motion concerning the payment of the shares:

"Under the actual circumstances, so particular for the International Bureau, the Committee thinks suitable to forward to the countries which subscribed to the "Convention du Metre" a urging claim to obtain from them the full payment of all overdue and actual shares they promised to pay for the maintenance of the Bureau.....

The Committee, which would like to be able to use the foreign exchange facilities granted by the French Minister of Finances, backs the request brought up by the Bureau International to all countries subscribers to the Convention to pay their shares in Swiss currency originally drawn up in french gold currency. The Committee wishes that all countries not able to settle their account in swiss currency would kindly in a compensatory manner triple the account of their share in french currency".



ADDITIONAL INFORMATIONS ABOUT THE PAYMENT OF SHARES
CONCERNING THE MAINTENANCE OF THE "BUREAU INTERNATIONAL
DES POIDS ET MESURES" FOR THE YEAR 1946.

The account of the share of each country is settled in french gold currency of 1913. One gold-franc contains 322,581 mg of gold with a standard of 900 milliemes i.e. 290,322 9 mg of fine gold.

According to a decrer of the Swiss Federal Council date september 27, 1936, the gold parity the Swiss franc is between 190 and 215 mg of fine gold. So this partiy may be equal to 206,2 mg of fine gold*. One french gold franc equals to 1,408 swiss franc.

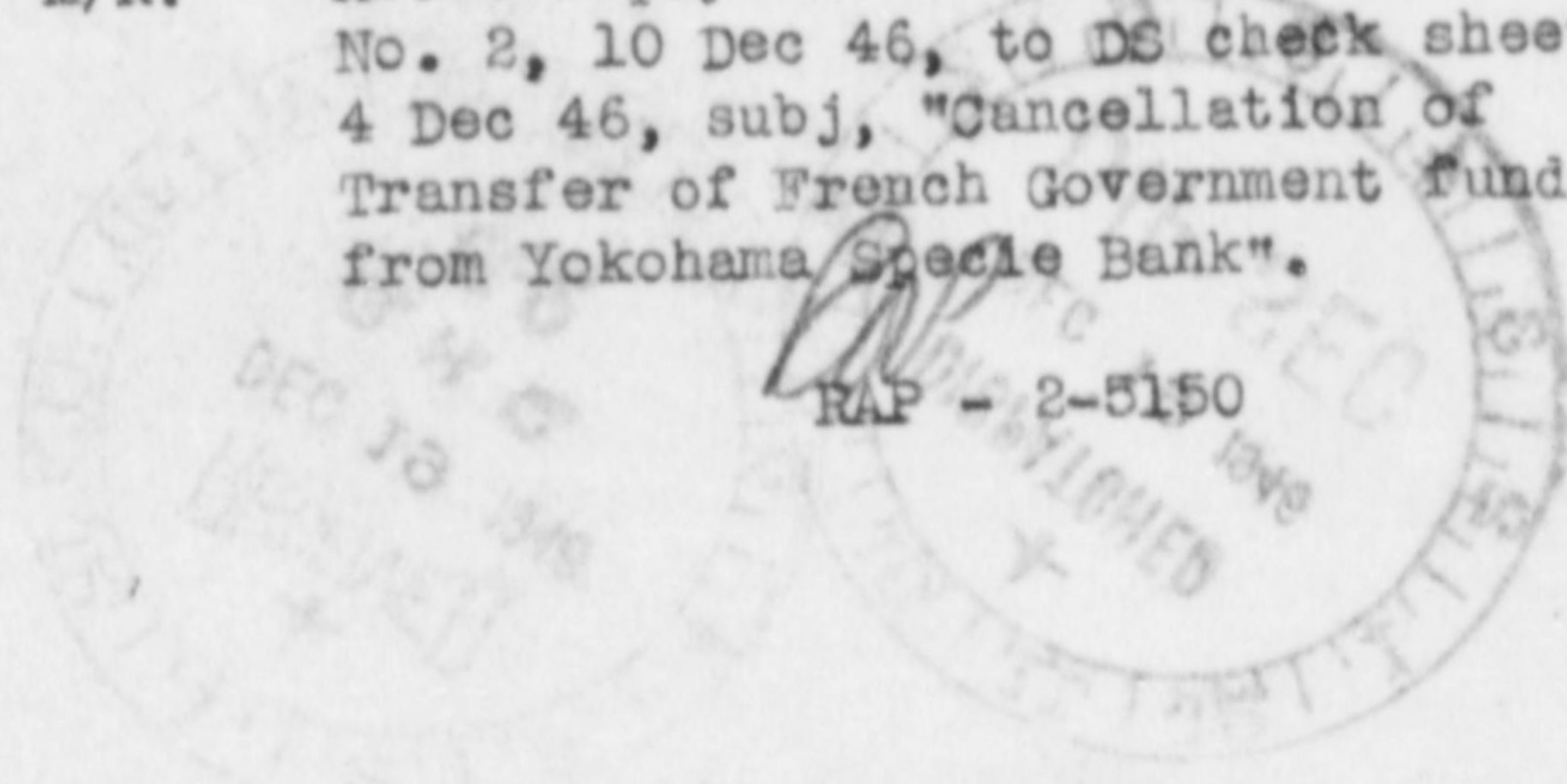

SUBJECT: Japanese Yen Funding

1. References are:

- a. Memorandum No. 7 from the French Mission, 31 December 1946.
- b. Memorandum for All Allied Commissions and Delegations in Japan from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 123(27 Aug 46)ESS/FI, 27 August 1946, subject: Japanese Yen Currency Funding.

2. In a letter from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers dated 24 November 1946, to an Allied Mission in Japan, the Supreme Commander stated: " - - - you are advised that the average of \$ 4,000 per capita per month will determine the maximum amount to be funded, unless detailed information is furnished indicating adequate reasons for amount exceeding that allowance". This policy is applicable to all Allied Missions in Japan requesting yen currency funding.

3. Funding for the month of January 1947 will be limited to \$ 116,000 based on the accredited personnel strength of 29 as indicated by the records of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Letter order on the Bank of Japan for \$ 116,000 is inclosed.

4. Subsequent yen funding requests in excess of the maximum amount prescribed in paragraph 2 above will be subject to further consideration pending receipt of detailed information submitted in monthly Report of Expenditures.

The Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, presents its compliments to the French Mission in Japan and has the honor to refer to the latter's note of September 23, 1946 enclosing a letter from Mr. S. de Champeaux, Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Banque Franco-Japonaise to the Civil Property Custodian, concerning the release of funds to cover the bank's expenses for the months of August, September and October, 1946.

The Japanese Government has been directed to authorize the Bank of Japan to release to Mr. A. Picard, ¥ 96,780 from the available funds of the Banque Franco-Japonaise and ¥ 125,800 from the available funds of the Banque de l'Indochine, to be disbursed for the purposes and to the persons indicated by Mr. de Champeaux, in his communications to the Civil Property Custodian.
