Wikimedia movement highlights

- <u>WikibaseNYC conference explores the frontier of linked open data</u> <u>infrastructure</u>. Wikimedians, art curators, and scientists gathered at the New Museum for a three-day workshop about Wikibase and linked data.
- Look at all we've accomplished: The fifth year of Art+Feminism. Five years of combating gender inequity by using Wikipedia as a tool for correcting the written record on cis and trans women.
- <u>Wikimedia Foundation collaborates with two initiatives: Mozilla's</u> <u>OSSN and TeachingOpenSource's POSSE</u>. The Developer Advocacy team at the Wikimedia Foundation has collaborated with two open source initiatives to strengthen the open source ecosystem.



Wikimedia movement highlights

- <u>GLAM activity kicks off in Indonesia with digitizing museum</u> <u>collections</u>. Wikimedia Indonesia, together with Indonesian Arts Coalition, arranged a visit to Dr. H.C. Oemboe Hina Kapita Museum in Waingapu, East Nusa Tenggara to begin digitizing their collection.
- <u>George Soros, founder of Open Society Foundations, invests in the</u> <u>future of free and open knowledge</u>. Makes \$2 million gift to the Wikimedia Endowment.
- <u>You can trial content translation (version two!) right now</u>. You can now get early access to version two of the content translation tool, which simplifies the process of translating Wikipedia articles.



Coming up soon

- <u>GLAM Wiki Conference, 3-5 November</u>. International Wiki Conference dedicated to the GLAM community, organized for and with the community will this year take place in Tel Aviv, Israel.
- <u>WikiIndaba Conference, 18-20 January</u>. WikiIndaba Conference is the regional conference for Africans both within and in the diaspora. The 2019 edition of the conference will be hosted in Abuja, FCT, Nigeria.
- <u>Wikimedia Summit 2019, 29-31 March</u>. The Wikimedia Summit (previously Wikimedia Conference) will focus on the Movement Strategy process and movement governance for the organized part of the movement in general.





Possible Methods

- Usability Tests
- Heuristic Review

Heuristic Analysis: gather a group of experts and methodically review the user interface against a set of established heuristics principles.



Some context

In 1995, Jakob Nielsen came up with 10 broad rules of thumb for user interface design. These became the industry standard for evaluation.






