SOCCER. VICTORIAN HOLD CUP. Winnipeg, Jan. 23.—Thousands of people were unable to gain admittance to the big auditorium rink this evening, so great was the interest taken in the second match for the Stanley cup hockey championship between the Wellingtons, of Toronto, and the Victorias, of this city.

After a breathing spell, the Toronto boys started in with a rush, and in two minutes twenty-five seconds put in their first goal, making the score a tie, 1 to 1. BIG SALMON DISTRICT. Work Being Actively Pushed Forward on Hillside—The Cost of Lifting. Traffic Manager J. Francis Lee, of the White Pass & Yukon route, has just received a letter from F. R. Carpenter, who is operating in the Big Salmon district, that contains much information regarding that section. Mr. Carpenter says: "There are about a hundred men working in the district and about fifty of them are miners, all working at prospecting the hillside benches. The gold all comes from the hills. The winter's work has proven that conclusively."

DOMINION OF CANADA SYNOPSIS OF REGULATIONS For Disposal of Minerals on Dominion Lands in Manitoba, the Northwest Territories, and the Yukon Territory.

COAL. Coal lands may be purchased at \$10.00 per acre for soft coal, and \$20.00 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at such rate as may from time to time be specified by Order in Council shall be collected on the gross output.

QUARTZ. Persons of eighteen years and over and joint stock companies holding Free Miner's Certificates may obtain entry for a mining location. A Free Miner's Certificate is granted for one or more years, not exceeding five years for an individual, and from \$50.00 to \$100.00 per annum for a company, according to capital.

PLACER MINING, MANITOBA AND THE N. W. T., EXCEPTING THE YUKON TERRITORY. Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5.00, renewable yearly. On the North Saskatchewan River claims are either bar or bench, the former being 100 feet long and extending between high and low water mark.

DREDGING IN THE RIVERS OF MANITOBA AND THE N. W. T., EXCEPTING THE YUKON TERRITORY. A Free Miner may obtain only two leases of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable in the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

PLACER MINING IN THE YUKON TERRITORY. Creek, Gulch, River and Hill Claims shall not exceed 250 feet in length, measured on the base line or other direction of the creek or gulch, the width being from 1,000 to 2,000 feet. All other Placer Claims shall be 250 feet square.

HYDRAULIC MINING, YUKON TERRITORY. Locations suitable for hydraulic mining having a frontage of from one to five miles, and a depth of one mile or more, may be leased for twenty years, provided the ground has been prospected by the applicant or his agent; it is found to be unsuitable for placer mining, and does not include within its boundaries any mining claims already granted.

PETROLEUM. All unappropriated Dominion Lands shall, after the first of July, 1901, be open to prospecting for petroleum. Any prospector discover oil in paying quantities, he may acquire 640 acres of available land, including any surrounding lands discovered at the rate of \$1.00 an acre, subject to royalty at such rate as may be specified by Order in Council.
