

United States Half Dollars.

- 259 1794; H. & R. No. 1; wide date; the lowest star pierces the lowest curl: reverse has 21 berries, 10 on left and 11 on right: good; rare.
- reverse, 19 berries, 9 on left and ten on right; poor; date just shows; exceedingly rare variety.
- on the left pierces the lowest curl; reverse, 18 berries. 9 on either side of wreath; good; very rare variety.






